SEAGULL IS NO. 1

It's surprising that a book containing no sex, no violence, and no vulgar language, can still climb to the top of the best seller list, and for the last 21 weeks, the No. 1 spot has been held by a story entitled "Jonathan Livingston Seagull." Graced by 50 pages of seagull photos, it tells the story of a seagull named Jonathan, who, by perfecting the science of flying, tries to lift his flock of gulls out of ignorance. Written in an aviator's terms, (Richard Bach, the author is a professional pilot), "Jonathan Livingston Seagull" is actually fun to read. Even though at times the descriptions of Jonathan's flight patterns appear to be more suitable in the pages of the Project Physics Textbook, the story on the whole is truly a gem, obviously the "pick of the litter" from recently released fiction.
