SCHEDULE

For the fall semester, classes will meet beginning Aug. 19 and run through Dec. 22, five days per week.

- 7:45 a.m. to 3:05 p.m. Lower School
- Eight-day rotating schedule
- Lunch served daily






HEALTH SCREENING

- Parents will be asked to take their child's temperature every morning before school
- Students with a temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher should stay home.
- Students with a fever, runny nose, cough or gastrointestinal symptoms should stay home.
- Students who develop a fever or feel ill will be placed in a designated safe waiting area until they can be picked up by a parent or guardian.
- Symptomatic students sent home from school should be kept home until they have tested negative or have completely recovered according to CDC guidelines.
- We will report all confirmed cases of Covid 19 to the Oakland County Health Department.

MEDICALLY-VULNERABLE STUDENTS

- Parents should notify the school if their son or daughter has any underlying health conditions that would put them at greater risk from COVID-19.
- ▶ The school and parents will discuss whether modifications are necessary and can be accommodated.





HYGIENE

- Hand sanitizing stations will be available at building entrances and other highly trafficked areas.
- ▶ COVID-19 signage will be installed on campus to instruct students on proper guidelines for protecting others from sneezing and coughing; proper hand-washing technique; and social distancing guidelines, including the use of facial coverings.





PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT


- Facial coverings will be required for all faculty, staff, and students.
- Facial coverings can be homemade, store-bought, or disposable.
- Facial coverings must cover both nose and mouth.
- Fun or stylistic facial coverings may be worn but must be appropriate for a Catholic School (i.e. No offensive remarks inappropriate references or political commentary)
- Facial coverings are required on buses, in hallways and in common areas (Except during lunch).
- Facial coverings are required in classrooms for grades 6-12.
- Facial coverings not required for Pre K-5th while in their classroom.
- Facial coverings not required for toddlers.

VISITORS

- No outside visitors, including parents (except for necessary or extenuating purposes and by appointment only).
- Visitors will be screened for symptoms, must wear a facial covering, and sanitize hands prior to entry.
- Records of all visitors will be kept.

CAFETERIA

- Middle School and Upper School students will continue to eat in the cafeteria for lunch.
- Lower School students will continue to eat in classrooms.
- Outdoor seating will be utilized to expand capacity and ensure proper social distancing is met.



RECESS

- Students will continue to have recess outdoors when feasible.
- Playground equipment will be sanitized after each use.



GATHERINGS

- Large-scale assemblies will be suspended.
- Field trips will be suspended.

MASS

- Follow Archdiocese of Detroit guidelines.
- No outside visitors including parents.



BUS TRANSPORTATION

- Hand sanitizer will be available for students upon entering and exiting buses.
- Buses will be properly cleaned and sanitized between uses.

ATHLETICS

- Follow Michigan High School Athletic Association and Catholic Youth League guidelines.
- Spectators will be allowed at competitions but must wear a facial covering and maintain 6-feet social distancing.*
- Indoor spectator events will be suspended.*
- Outdoor spectator events (up to 100) will continue.*

ADMISSIONS

- School is open for enrollment and accepting new students.
- Shadow Days are temporarily suspended.
- High school placement test will not be required for admission.
- Virtual tours will be available for prospective families.
- Online sessions with admissions staff will be offered.
