### Letter from Brooklandwood

"Hello, boys, how are you?" asked the rider of two young chaps playing on a large Baltimore County estate in 1929. He flipped them each a ten-cent piece and rode off. One of the boys was five-year-old John Laslett, son of a native Englishman of the same name. The rider was Captain Isaac Emerson, owner of Brooklandwood, the 550-acre estate he had purchased in 1916 from Alexander W. Brown. Young

John's father was one of two chauffeurs for Emerson, the wealthy inventor of the pain remedy Bromo-Seltzer and owner of the stately Emerson Hotel in Baltimore City and the Maryland Glass Co. Laslett's mother was a maid and laundress for Mrs. Emerson at Brooklandwood

### **Remembrance of Things Past**

- Susan Asenath Harwood, "among the ardent church workers and benefactors" in the early 20th century, in 1911 leaves provisions in her will that make her the largest benefactor of the St. Paul's School and St. Paul's Parish. Francis F. Beirne, "St. Paul's Parish: A Chronicle of the Mother Church (1967), 146.
- Trustee Minutes, January 31, 1933: "The sixty-three pupils of the School range in ages from eight to eighteen and in grades from the fourth to the fourth year high school. The school is able to prepare students for admission to any college...the boys have recently started a school paper called the "Monitor," and the spirit of the school is excellent."
- A St. Paul's basketball schedule from the 1939-40 season, from the scrapbook of Howard Smedley '41, reveals that the team lost only one game, with 24 or 25 wins. At the season's start, Sun sports editor Paul Menton's "Viewpoint" column described the Crusaders thus: "Rangy, well-balanced, good shots inside and out, confident, St. Paul's has everything needed to make a championship team in its own class."

- **1949:** The St. Paul's Centennial Campaign kicks off, with a goal to raise \$300,000—a major priority being to enlarge the Lower School and add first and second grades.
- Trustee Minutes, May 2, 1955: "Regarding the enrollment of girls, progress is slow but it usually takes time to establish a new venture. The problem of keeping girls is because from the 4th grade they must be transferred to another school for the 5th. However, Mr. Middleton said that he is working on a better understanding with the other schools."
