Security Enhancements for the 2018-19 School Year



The safety of our students is our highest priority. St. Anthony-New Brighton School District has enhanced security at Wilshire Park Elementary School, St. Anthony Middle School, and St. Anthony Village High School for the 2018-19 school year. Beginning in September 2018, parents and visitors to our buildings experienced two changes--new secured entrances and a visitor management system.

Secured Entrance

All parents and visitors to Wilshire Park Elementary enter the building through Door 1, the main entrance, which directs you into the school office.

All parents and visitors to St. Anthony Middle School and St. Anthony Village High School use Door 1 as the main entrance. Kelly Woods is pictured inside the main entrance.

Visitor Management System

We began using a visitor management system at the elementary school and middle/high school to increase safety for students and staff. The visitor management system will help us know who is in our buildings at all times. This system

will screen all visitors-parents, contractors, and volunteers-who enter



our schools and provide us with a safer environment for our students and staff.

Here's how it works:

- 1. Upon entering the elementary or secondary building, all visitors present a government-issued identification such as a Driver's License or State ID, which can either be scanned or manually entered into the system. If a parent or guardian does not have a government-issued identification, the school staff member can use any form of identification and manually enter the person's name into the visitor management system.
- 2. The visitor management system checks the visitor's name and date of birth for comparison with a national database of registered sex offenders.

The system checks to ensure that registered sex offenders are not entering our school buildings without our knowledge.

The registered sex offender database is the only official database checked by the visitor management system. No other data from the identification is gathered or recorded and the information is not shared with any outside agency.

3. Once entry is approved, a badge will be printed identifying the visitor, the date, and the purpose of his/her visit.

The safety of our students is our highest priority and we appreciate your support in enhancing the school safety protocols in our district.




Best Communities for Music Education

Our Board members are: Barry Kinsey, Chair Laura Oksnevad, Vice Chair Dr. Cassandra Palmer, Treasurer Leah Slye, Clerk Andrea Scamehorn and Mike Volna, Directors Geier, a freshman from St. Anthony, is serving her first year on the MYC representing Minnesota Congressional District 5. Minnesota Alliance With Youth shared, "Emily is a hard working and enthusiastic student... She is new to Minnesota Youth Council this year, and couldn't be more thrilled." Kalenze, a sophomore from New Brighton, is serving her second year on the MYC representing Minnesota Congressional District 4.

In 2013, the Minnesota Legislature formally recognized the work of the MYC, passing into law the Minnesota Youth Council Committee Bill, which establishes the MYC as an official legislative committee, creating a system for youth to provide advice and recommendations to the legislature and the governor.

Minnesota Youth Council members focus their impact through two working committees. The Education Committee, which strives to ensure equal access to learning opportunities and increase the options available for students in order to create better educational experiences. The Policy Committee, which provides youth with a seat at the legislative table through the MYC Committee, an official committee of the Minnesota state government. Members meet with elected officials, advocate for legislation and policy platforms that support equity and young people and hold legislative committee meetings to hear legislation directly from elected officials. Kalenze serves on the policy committee.

Early Childhood Family Education

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is a program for all Minnesota families with children between the ages of birth to five years (before kindergarten entrance).

Family provides a child's first and most significant learning environment and parents are a child's first and most important

teachers. The goal of ECFE is to enhance the ability of all parents to provide the best possible environment for their child's growth and learning. ECFE classes are a fun, informal way to meet and learn with other parents.



ECFE Tuition Sliding Fee Scale

Register each child separately; class fee is indicated on the sliding fee scale. Parents pay the class fee for the first child and receive a 25% discount for each additional child (ages 9 months to pre-kindergarten).

Call the Community Services office at 612-706-1166 to receive the discount when you register. All parents, legal guardians, and grandparents are welcome to attend at no extra charge.

Separating Classes

MONDAY AND TUESDAY MORNINGS For parents & children birth to age 5

The Monday and Tuesday morning classes are for all families and especially helpful for those with more than one child. Siblings play with new friends while feeling the security of being with a brother or sister during the separation time.

Separating classes follow this format:

Parent and Child Learning Time (45 minutes)—After arriving at 9:30 a.m., parents and children join in a gathering circle to welcome friends and hear about the learning goals and parent-child activities scheduled for class that day. Parents and children then explore the learning activities in the children's classroom which are facilitated by Anne-Marie, our Early Childhood Family Education teacher.

Parent Education Time (75 minutes of separation)—While parents transition into the parent education classroom, children enjoy play time in the gym, story time, learning activities, and a healthy snack in the children's classroom. Parents gain support and wisdom from group discussions about family relationships, child development, and parenthood facilitated by our Parent and Family Educator.

Non-Separating Classes

TUESDAY EVENINGS AND THURSDAY MORNINGS For parents and children, birth to 5 years old

On Tuesday evenings, parents and children begin class with dinner, which is served by our staff. Parents and children then enjoy play time in the gym and transition into the children's classroom to explore the learning activities which are facilitated by Anne-Marie, our Early Childhood Family Education teacher.

On Thursday mornings, parents and children join in a gathering circle to welcome friends and hear about the learning goals and parent-child activities scheduled for class that day. Parents and children explore the learning activities in the children's classroom, which are facilitated by Anne-Marie, our Early Childhood Family Education teacher.





Terrific Twos and Early Threes WEDNESDAY MORNINGS For parents & children 2 to 3 years old

This fun and structured learning environment will help your child prepare for preschool! Your child will practice separating from mom and dad, engage in learning activities in the classroom and gym, and develop social skills through interacting with peers.

Parent and Child Learning Time (45 minutes)—After arriving at 9:30 a.m., parents and children join in a gathering circle to welcome friends and hear about the STEM learning goals and parent-child activities scheduled for class that day. Parents and children explore the learning activities in the children's classroom, which are facilitated by Anne-Marie, our Early Childhood Family Education teacher.

Parent Education Time (75 minutes of separation)— While parents transition into the parent education classroom, children enjoy play time in the gym, story time, learning activities, and a healthy snack in the children's classroom. Parents gain support and new perspectives from group discussions about parenting two- and three-year-olds facilitated by our Parent and Family Educator.

What is Help Me Grow?


Help Me Grow provides resources for families of children birth to age 5 to understand developmental milestones and learn if there are concerns. This helps families take the lead in seeking additional support or referring their child for a comprehensive, confidential screening or evaluation at no cost.

Why is Developmental Screening Important?

While every child is unique, children develop in certain, predictable ways, called developmental milestones. Your child's health care provider and early childhood experts will use screening information to keep tabs on how your child is progressing and determine if he/she is reaching the milestones.



On September 7, 2017, the St. Anthony-New Brighton School District community supported a bond referendum to expand Wilshire Park Elementary School. On Saturday, October 13, 2018, after ten months of construction, St. Anthony-New Brighton School District invited our community to come inside to see and learn about the renovations to the school. Held in conjunction with the Wilshire Park Parents Association Fall Fest event, over 250 community members participated in twelve tours over three hours. Visitors walked in the building through the secured entrance and learned about enhanced security at the school. Hosted by Superintendent Dr. Corneille and Principal Kari Page, visitors toured the building, learning about the secured entrance, kindergarten, first and second grade classrooms added to the east side of the school, the renovated media center, and community gym, third grade classrooms, art room, and Village Kids room added to the west side of the school. Rademacher received the National Summit for Courageous Conversation Learning and Teaching Award and was recognized on October 23, 2018, during the Summit in Philadelphia. Mr. Rademacher accepted the award remotely from his classroom alongside his students at St. Anthony Middle School.

"To those of us who have followed Tom's work for awhile, it's a joy to see the impact he is having on our kids and our school," says Amy Kujawski, Principal at SAMS. "Tom's commitment in his language arts classroom to keeping all kids feeling safe as

they read and write about and discuss critical aspects of our world not often explored in schools is uncommon. There is such depth to his approach to teaching."

According to website for the National Summit for Courageous Conversation, the Learning and Teaching Award is presented annually to a classroom teacher who demonstrates radically innovative, culturally relevant instruction that engages all students, and especially, promotes the highest achievement of underserved student of color populations. Known as "Rad" or "Mr. Rad", it is clear our students are the reason he shows up each day working hard to not only teach language arts with excellence but also key concepts of cultural competence. As evidence of Mr. Rademacher's advocacy and efforts, a former student wrote, "His classroom was such a comfortable and safe place. Whether I walked in thinking I was going to have a courageous conversation or write an essay, I always felt comfortable, because Mr. Rad made it that way. If we were having a conversation about racism and equity as a class, he never pushed anyone to talk more and never pushed anyone to talk less. He let students decide where they were going to stand when it came to sharing their opinions and thoughts, but he always made sure that everyone walked out of the room that day learning something that they didn't know when they walked in." Tom Rademacher was Minnesota's 2014 Teacher of the Year.



Here are a few of the grants that we funded during the 2017-18 school year:

Margie Jones, Anne-Marie Fischer and Erika Hudson - Preschool and ECFE Create an outdoor classroom and learning environment. The goal of this outdoor classroom is to engage children, families and the community. This outdoor classroom, modeled on a nature center, enables children and their families to explore, experience and discover the wonders of nature. 
