Dear Community Members,

We are proud to announce that St. Anthony Village High School was recognized by US News and World Report as one of the Best High Schools in the nation on the 2016 report. Ranked 3rd in Minnesota and 227th in the nation, this is the fourth time St. Anthony Village High School has been recognized by US News and World Report since 2012. St. Anthony Village High

We Educate, Prepare, and Inspire a Community of lifelong learners in our small, caring environment.



School was one of seven high schools in Minnesota to be recognized as a gold medal school. Gold medal schools were identified based on how well they prepare students for college. Students at St. Anthony Village High School can enroll in thirteen different Advanced Placement (AP) classes and can demonstrate their proficiency in the college-level class through an AP exam. If students score a 3, 4, or 5 on their final AP exam, they can earn college credit. At St. Anthony Village High School in 2016, 317 students in grades 10, 11, and 12–or 62% of the students in those grades–completed 560 AP exams.

Examining Demographics and Enrollment Trends

Families are moving into our community and choosing our schools for their

children and our increasing resident enrollment at Wilshire Park and St. Anthony Middle School reflects this trend. Every year since 2012, Wilshire Park Elementary School has enrolled, on average, 51 additional resident students while St. Anthony Middle School gained, on average, 23 additional resident students. In June 2016, 91% of students attending Wilshire Park Elementary School are district residents and the chart belows details our increasing resident student enrollment.

We hired Hazel Reinhardt to conduct a ten-year housing and demographic study of our school district. The goal of the report is to analyze the projections of our resident student enrollment, understand its impact, and create a long-term plan for our facilities. Reinhardt will present the final report to the School Board in August.

St. Anthony Village High School Awarded \$50,000 Athletic Trainer Initiative Grant

St. Anthony Village High School was awarded a \$50,000 Athletic Trainer Initiative grant from the NFL Foundation, the National Athletic Trainers' Association, Gatorade and the Professional Football Athletic Trainers Society. St. Anthony Village High School was **one of only 15 high schools in the United States** to receive the Athletic Trainer Initiative grant whose purpose is to expand access to athletic trainers in underserved high schools and improve safety of youth athletes. Athletic trainers play a vital role in the health and safety of student-athletes; however, almost two-thirds of high schools in the United States lack a full-time athletic trainer and nearly thirty-percent do not have access to any athletic training services.



Congressional Art Competition

Congratulations to **Damiah Oliver**, a junior at St. Anthony Village High School, who competed in the 2016 Congressional Art Competition for Minnesota's 5th Congressional District. Damiah's submitted artwork "Human Nature" won the National Park Service recognition award.






Certificate of Excellence in Financial Reporting





Donation to Wilshire Park's STEM Program



SANBE Celebrates 25 Years

Grants for Teachers

This year marks 25 years of The St. Anthony New Brighton Education Foundation (SANBE)'s commitment to enhancing the quality of educational programs in Independent School District 282. The Foundation was created by a group of citizens who were concerned as the school district was struggling with finances and enrollment in the late 1980's. One concern was the lack of extra money for

creative activities and classroom/building needs. SANBE members focused on short term fundraising to get money back into the schools and classrooms as quickly as possible. The SANBE Foundation was incorporated as a 501c3 organization in 1991.

SANBE soon took on additional activities. St. Anthony Middle School PTA was running an Italian dinner as a middle school fundraiser. When the middle school could no longer run the dinner, SANBE stepped in to take it over. The Italian dinner continues today as a community event. It is widely attended by St. Anthony alumni and community members and has become a Fall tradition as part of the Huskie Homecoming weekend. SANBE also awards a scholarship to a graduating senior each spring.

Today, the SANBE Foundation continues giving to our schools by providing grants to teachers district wide for projects that are innovative and reach a large number of learners. During the 2015-16 school year, SANBE gave out \$20,000 in grants. The organization is led by volunteers and relies on community support to meet our mission. St. Anthony Village High School Ranked 3rd in Minnesota



St. Anthony Village High School was recognized by U.S. News & World Report as one of the best high schools in the nation. In its annual report of Best High Schools, St. Anthony Village High School was ranked 3rd in Minnesota and 227th in the nation. The 2016 report recognized 172 Minnesota high schools--seven gold medal, 49 silver medal, and 116 bronze medal schools. St. Anthony Village High School was one of seven gold medal schools in Minnesota. Schools were awarded gold, silver, or bronze medals based on their performance on state assessment and how well they prepare students for college.

St. Anthony Village High School was also identified by Newsweek Magazine in September 2015 as one of the Top 500 High Schools in the U.S. One of only ten high schools from Minnesota on the list, St. Anthony Village High School was ranked 8th in Minnesota and 403rd in the nation.
