As your school board members, we wanted to update you about exciting changes in our school district.



Board Hires Bob Laney as Superintendent

The School Board completed its search for a superintendent and, at the meeting on March 5, approved a three-year contract with Robert (Bob) Laney. Laney, who was serving as Assistant Superintendent for St. Louis Park Schools, will begin on July 1, 2012. "We appreciate the input we received from students, staff, parents, and community members throughout the search and interview process," said Board Chair Barry Kinsey. On February 2, the Board concluded three days of interviews with finalists and voted unanimously to enter into contract negotiations with Bob Laney. Board

member Dave Evans commented, "I like the fact that he's an experienced administrator." Laney has spent twenty-three years of his career in St. Louis Park; he served as Assistant Superintendent for five years, Principal of St. Louis Park High School for eleven years, and Assistant Principal for seven years. Board member Andie Scamehorn identified one of Laney's strengths as his "use of process, data, and collaboration in his decision making."

District Awarded Hennepin Youth Sports Grant

Residents may have noticed projects underway at Wilshire Park Elementary and the stadium field at Central Park. Hennepin County's Board of Commissioners approved the 2012 Hennepin Youth Sports grants and St. Anthony-New Brighton School District was awarded a \$249,000 facilities grant and an additional \$8700 grant for gymnastics equipment. Commissioner McLaughlin explained, "this is the use of some of the sales tax money that paid for the Twins ballpark and for the expansion of youth opportunities." The 2012 grant program included twelve awards for facility improvements which totaled almost \$2.2 million. McLaughlin said, "I think it's another great success and it's going to make the lives of our young people that much better."

The facility improvements for St. Anthony-New Brighton School District include:

- Maximizing the use of available recreational space within the City of St. Anthony by constructing a soccer-specific facility at Wilshire Park Elementary School to meet the increasing demand of the high-growth sport without harming existing spaces. Recreational space is being renovated this summer at Wilshire Park. The existing t-ball field will be reconfigured, a new youth soccer field will be constructed, and a perimeter fence will be installed.
- At the middle school/high school stadium field, an energy efficient lighting system and a perimeter fence were installed in the spring. This lighting system will extend the hours the football/soccer stadium field can be used, provide a more neighborhood-friendly experience, and reduce operational costs.

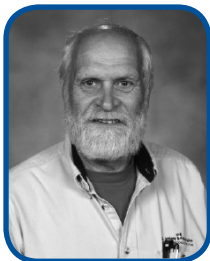

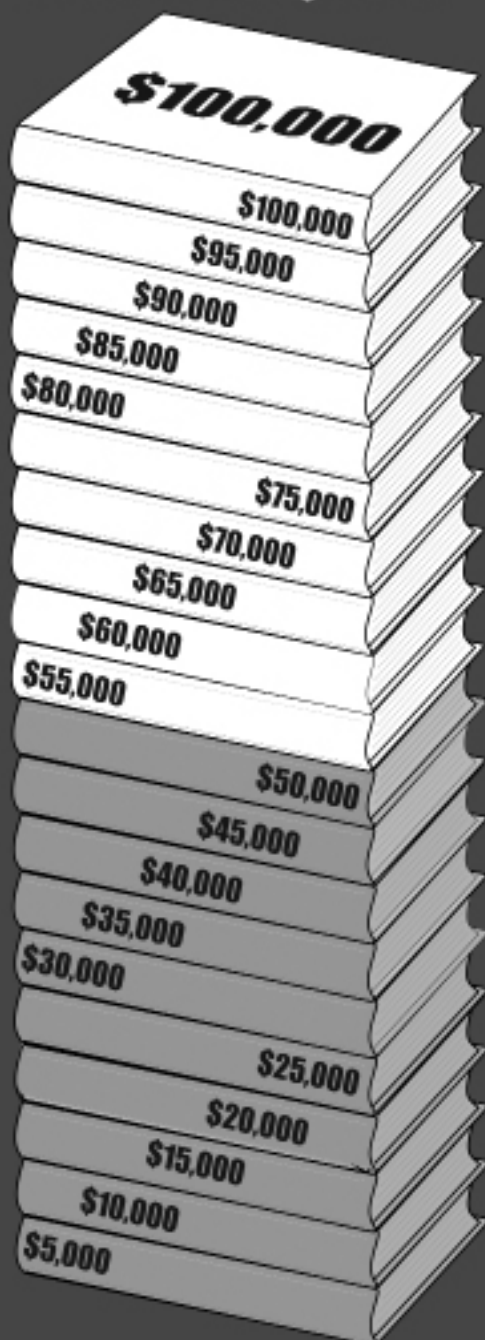

Record Number of Students Take Advanced Placement Exams

St. Anthony Village High School had a record number of students taking Advanced Placement (AP) exams in May. This year, 228 students took 396 AP tests, including 23 studio arts students who submitted portfolios. Compared to 2011 when 217 students registered for 373 tests, in 2012 student participation increased 5% and exams increased 6%. AP courses help students acquire the skills needed to be successful in college and most four-year colleges in the United States give students credit based on AP Exam scores.

University of Minnesota Acknowledges St. Anthony's Rigorous Curriculum

St. Anthony Village High School Principal Wayne Terry received a congratulatory letter from Dr. Wayne Sigler, Director of Admissions at the University of Minnesota, for the school's participation in the Advanced Placement (AP) program. "Our data shows that your high school ranks among the top in the state for the number of students who take AP coursework and then enroll at the University of Minnesota. The 14 students from St Anthony Village High School who enrolled at the U of M this year submitted 51 AP exam scores and earned a total of 239 credits at the U of M." St. Anthony Middle School Students Believe in Service to Others



For the second year in a row, St. Anthony Middle School students and the Humanities team were recognized as Water Warriors for their efforts in raising money and awareness for their H2O For Life project. H2O for Life connects schools in the United States with schools in developing countries to construct a WASH (WATER, Sanitation, and Hygiene) project. This year, St. Anthony Middle School had a goal to raise \$5500 for the construction of a WASH facility for their partner school Mayamaya Primary School in Tanzania.

Patty Hall, President and Co-Founder of H2O for Life, was inspired by the unique fundraising ideas of the students at St. Anthony Middle School and, after hearing of their efforts, H2O for Life recognized them as Water Warriors. For example, encouraged by humanities teacher Kirsten Donohue, a group of seventh grade girls sold seventy-one strips of material for \$1.00 each and, with help from Paula Christopherson, designed and

sewed them into a quilt. In addition, theme baskets were organized by the humanities classes at the middle school. Each class decided on a theme and collected items to place in the basket. The quilt and theme baskets were sold at an auction during performances of the middle school play. In May, students gathered donations from the community for the annual Water Walk Day. As a result of the students' efforts, over \$5000 was raised and 100% of the proceeds supported the construction of a WASH facility for Mayamaya Primary School. Members of Builders Club, a service group for students at St. Anthony Middle School, found ways to actively serve and give back to their community. They volunteered at VillageFest, St. Anthony's Early Childhood Halloween Carnival, Feed My Starving Children, and throughout the year at Wilshire Park Elementary during their concerts. The middle school students also served as bell ringers for the Salvation Army, sewed fleece blankets for the animal rescue groups, hosted a food drive, and sponsored a toy drive for Christmas with Dignity. In the Spring, students planted seeds and, when the seeds started to sprout, donated the plants to residents at Chandler Place. Builders Club is sponsored by St. Anthony Kiwanis.

Sharing Artwork in the Classroom

Wilshire Park participates in the Art Adventure Program which introduces students to works of art from a variety of cultures. Sponsored by the Minneapolis Institute of Art (MIA), Art Adventure trains parent volunteers who visit classrooms with posters of art relating to a common theme, such as animals, celebrations, or relationships. The parent volunteers work with students in kindergarten through grade 4 and lead discussions about selected art reproductions. Students are very receptive to learning the history of each piece presented as well as the biographical information about the artist. As a follow-up to the presentations, each classroom in grades K-4 takes a field trip to the Minneapolis Institute of Art for an Art Adventure tour.

Volunteers Serve Over 6400 Hours

During the 2011-2012 school year, 200 volunteers logged over 6,400 hours and performed various functions at Wilshire Park Elementary. The volunteer hours are equivalent to six individuals working six hours every day of the school year.

Incoming Kindergarteners Focus on School Readiness

Wilshire Park is helping parents learn what they can do to help their child get ready for kindergarten. If you haven't heard about the SANBE Foundation, here's a quick summary. Our mission is to enhance the quality of educational programs in Independent School District 282. How? By giving financial support to teachers who wish to bring innovative educational opportunities to their classrooms.

How It Works

Each school year, from September through May, the SANBE board meets and funds grants in the amount of \$750 (and four in the amount of \$2500) so teachers can do things such as:

- Use iPads as a coaching tool in Physical Education classes. Videos of students practicing athletic skills can be reviewed by the teacher, shown to the student, and serve as a record of progress.
- Display small items to a large class by using a document camera. Elementary and middle-school teachers have added these useful devices to their classrooms in just the past year.
- Bring reading programs to the community such as STAR (St. Anthony Reads) and this past year's Dad's Reading Night at the St. Anthony Community Center.

How We Raise Money

SANBE hosts an Italian dinner every homecoming. This year's dinner will be held on Friday, October 5 and coincides with the 50th anniversary of the high school's first graduating class. The annual Italian dinner is St. Anthony's own great get-together, as it brings community members together with teachers and administrators. 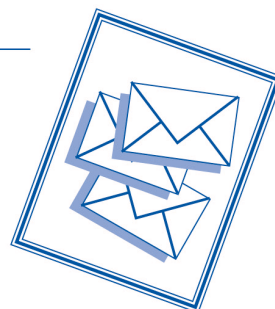
