
Thirteen Students Secure Awards at 4A Minnesota State High School League Visual Arts Competition

International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) **Authorization Visit**

In April, St. Anthony Middle School hosted a visiting team of teachers from the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO). The purpose of the visit was to monitor progress of the school's implementation of the standards and practices of IBO's Middle Years' Program--a required step in the application process for St. Anthony Middle School to be authorized as an official IBO World School. The extensive visit included a tour of the school, observations in classrooms, meetings with teachers, and conversations with students. The visiting team interviewed teacher specialists—music, art, industrial technology, physical education, special education— Principal Shirley Gregoire, School Board Member Jane Eckert, and Superintendent Dr. Rod Thompson. The final report was sent to IBO's international committee who will make a final determination and announce their decision in July.







Tom Keith - 15 years

Tom Keith is retiring after serving as principal of St. Anthony Village High School for fifteen years. Keith's service to students and commitment to education spans 35 years as a teacher and administrator in four of Minnesota's public school districts. As principal of St. Anthony Village High School, Keith's tenure was the longest of any principal at the high school and close to one-third of the school's existence. Under his leadership, Keith worked to polish the reputation of St. Anthony Village High School which benefitted our district's standing not only in the metro area but in the state and national education community as well. As a result of Keith's efforts, St. Anthony Village High School has been ranked in the Top 5% of all high schools in the U.S. by *Newsweek Magazine* and *US News & World Report* rated our high school as one of "America's Best High Schools" in 2007 and 2008. Keith's passion for our school district, advocacy of teachers and knowledge of the students at St. Anthony Village High School will be missed.

Roger Johnson - 21 years

Roger Johnson's service to students in the St. Anthony-New Brighton School District has two phases. Johnson originally started at St. Anthony Village High School in 1978, taught Social Studies and coached for a number of years. In 1983, Johnson moved to Lac qui Parle Valley and Appleton High Schools to serve as counselor. In 1994, Johnson was offered a position and, for the past fifteen years, he has served as guidance counselor at St. Anthony Village High School. Tom Keith, principal, applauded Johnson's service, "He is a strong, effective advocate for students. He tirelessly works with students and their families, promoting higher levels of student achievement. An exceptional strength for Roger is his understanding of how to maximize opportunities for students with limited resources. He is integral to the mission of the school and consistently exceeds my expectations. I am forever grateful for all he does for the students and community of St. Anthony-New Brighton School District."





Bob Ochu - 35 years

Bob Ochu started with the district in 1974 as a night custodian at St. Anthony Village High School and remained at the high school/middle school building for his entire career. Ochu moved to the day shift in 1986 where he was responsible for transporting food service items to and from Wilshire Park, keeping the cafeteria clean, and assisting as groundskeeper. Bob Ochu will be remembered for his sense of humor, dedication to his work, and friendship with Greg Thomas. Thomas remarked that whenever there was too much snow for one person to handle, even at 2 a.m., Ochu was there to help. SANBE Supports High School Engineers



You'd be right to call the actions of St. Anthony Village High School's RoboHuskie team "lunacy." That was the name of the challenge that took the team and their robot creation to two regional competitions this winter and spring.


This year's FIRST Robotics Competition challenged teams of high schoolers to design, program, and build a robot that would score points by getting "moon rocks" into the baskets of opposing teams' robots. This task had to be performed on a surface that simulated the low-gravity environment of the moon, and each team had exactly six weeks to engineer their machine.

For their first competition, which was held in Milwaukee during March, St. Anthony's team fielded a robot designed to scoop rocks onto a conveyor belt and then shoot them into opposing teams' baskets. Their results made them

reconsider their design, and before their next regional competition in April, the team had built a "dumper"—a robot that placed the moon rocks in opposing team's baskets. This turned out to be a more accurate method of scoring points, giving the team better results: they placed second in a field of over fifty teams.

Twenty-six students participated in RoboHuskie, which required more than engineering skills. Some students helped publicize the team's work and coordinated the business aspects of the project. "The coolest part," according to one team member, "is the actual competition. That and working with your friends on a cool project."
