### **St. Anthony-New Brighton School District Awarded \$345,000 in Youth Sports Grant Funding**

At its meeting on December 15, 2009, the Hennepin County Board of Commissioners awarded the first Hennepin Youth Sports Program capital grants. Of the 18 projects approved, St. Anthony was awarded \$345,000 for improvements to the fields in Central Park. "These projects will create new recreational possibilities for hundreds of kids in the area," said Hennepin County Commissioner Mark Stenglein, who represents the 2nd district. The project, which is scheduled to begin in March, includes installation of lighting on fields three and four and improved spectator seating on the varsity baseball and softball fields. "Several valuable partners came together to make this grant possible, the City of St. Anthony, St. Anthony Sports Boosters, St. Anthony Baseball Association, and Huskies Diamond Club," explained Troy Urdahl, Director of Activities and Athletics. St. Anthony-New Brighton School District thanks these groups for their support and Eric Brever for leading the grant writing process.

Central Park is a recreational area shared jointly by the City of St. Anthony and St. Anthony-New Brighton School District. Funding for the grants comes from the Twins ballpark sales tax; this revenue provides capital grants for youth and amateur sports facilities and expands library hours.

## District Invests in Five Year Capital Plan

A vital role of the St. Anthony-New Brighton School Board is to continuously review recommendations for curricular improvements and building maintenance projects and identify available funding to address those needs. At its meeting on December 1, 2009, the Board voted unanimously to reinvest the remaining voter-approved bond referendum proceeds into a five-year capital plan to address concerns identified through an extensive long-range planning process.

In 2007, the Citizens' Facilities Planning Committee evaluated the physical conditions of our school buildings and developed a comprehensive list of building maintenance and related curricular improvements that needed to be resolved. The committee presented its recommendations to the School Board in October of that year. The Board evaluated the recommendations and developed a plan. Four referendum questions were created with varying funding requests and voters were asked for their approval. On May 20, 2008, voters approved a bond referendum in the amount of \$11,515,000.

When construction companies submitted sealed bids in early 2009, the bids were lower than anticipated. The economic downturn in the construction market resulted in significant savings for the school district. After Phase I projects were completed, the school district had realized a total savings of \$1,305,000.

In October 2009, the Board began reviewing priorities that still needed to be addressed, available funding, and the economic value in the construction market. "We have seen great contractor interest in the district's projects which has resulted in a favorable and competitive bidding environment," explained Vaughn Dierks, architect with WOLD Architect and Engineers.

The five-year capital plan allows St. Anthony-New Brighton School District to tackle curricular improvements and necessary building maintenance projects by combining funding sources and capitalizing on the favorable construction market. "There were more deferred maintenance issues facing the district than could be accomplished with the \$11.5 million the voters approved. This plan allows us to address several of those additional needs," added Dierks.

"By doing the projects now, at a reduced cost, it eliminates the need to address them at a later date at a potentially higher cost," stated Barry Kinsey, St. Anthony-New Brighton School Board Chair. These investments—referred to as Phase III projects—will begin this summer in conjunction with Phase II projects, already scheduled for completion in August 2010. Phase III projects include: constructing a cafeteria, replacing seats in the auditorium, renovating pool locker rooms, and enhancing the upper gym to meet curricular instructional needs.

The Phase II projects scheduled to occur this summer will focus primarily on the north end of the middle/high school building. Phase II of construction includes larger projects such as adding an elevator, to become ADA compliant, and renovating food service facilities, in conjunction with the new cafeteria. "As an integral part of the District plan to improve overall site safety and accessibility, an elevator addition will enable access to multiple levels of the facility for students, staff, and visitors. Furthermore, the new food service facility will be designed and constructed to meet student needs and current State guidelines," explained Superintendent Dr. Rod Thompson. Additional projects to be completed this summer include: bathroom renovations, ventilation and indoor air quality improvements, door and hardware replacement, painting, flooring and tile replacement, and cabinetry replacements. Dr. Thompson stated, "Thanks to the generous support of our residents, our schools will be an even better place for students when the 2010-2011 school year begins."

## Partnering with University of Minnesota Medical School to Enhance Student Learning

St. Anthony Village High School was the first high school approached by the University of Minnesota's Medical School to establish an outreach program. Fortunately for the students in Anatomy and Physiology and Advanced Placement Biology, Dr. Hergenrader immediately recognized the partnership as a "pretty amazing opportunity for our kids." On October 23, Dr. Hergenrader accompanied students to the University of Minnesota's Medical School where they spent the day in the Department of Urology.

In the morning, students from SAVHS listened to University professors discuss their specialties, watched videos of surgeries, and used the Medical School's 3-D program to watch a presentation of a surgery. "The 3-D glasses made us feel like we were really there," explained Dr. Hergenrader. In the afternoon, students learned how to suture skin—using bananas as a substitute—made "skin" in the medical modeling area of the department, and performed virtual reality surgeries using instruments that are usually reserved for medical students. In this activity, students attempted to remove a gall bladder and place a scope in the trachea of a person through their nasal passage. "It was a very unique opportunity for our kids and the start of what we hope to be a long term relationship with the University," Dr. Hergenrader concluded.

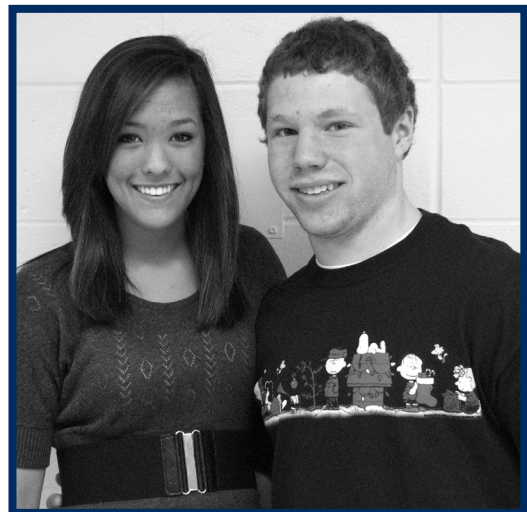

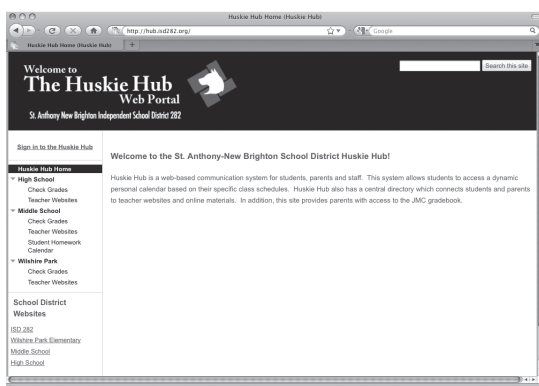
## Students Participate in World Affairs Challenge, Focus on Water
