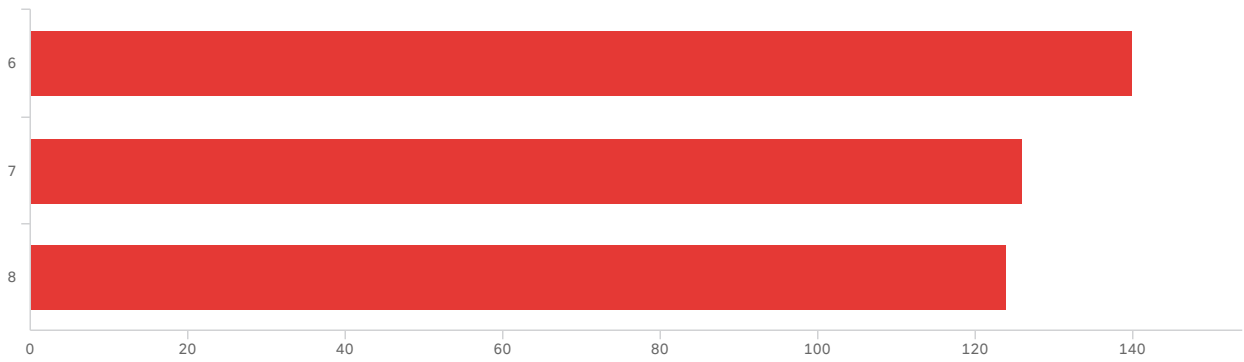

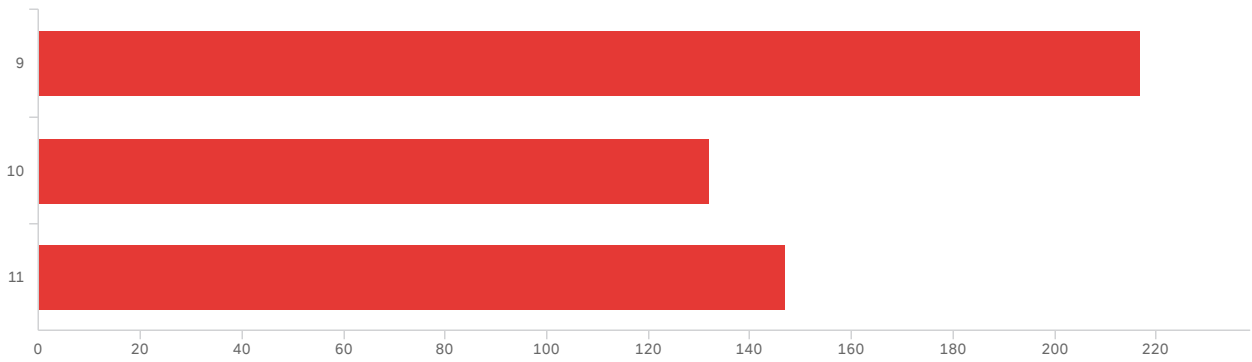

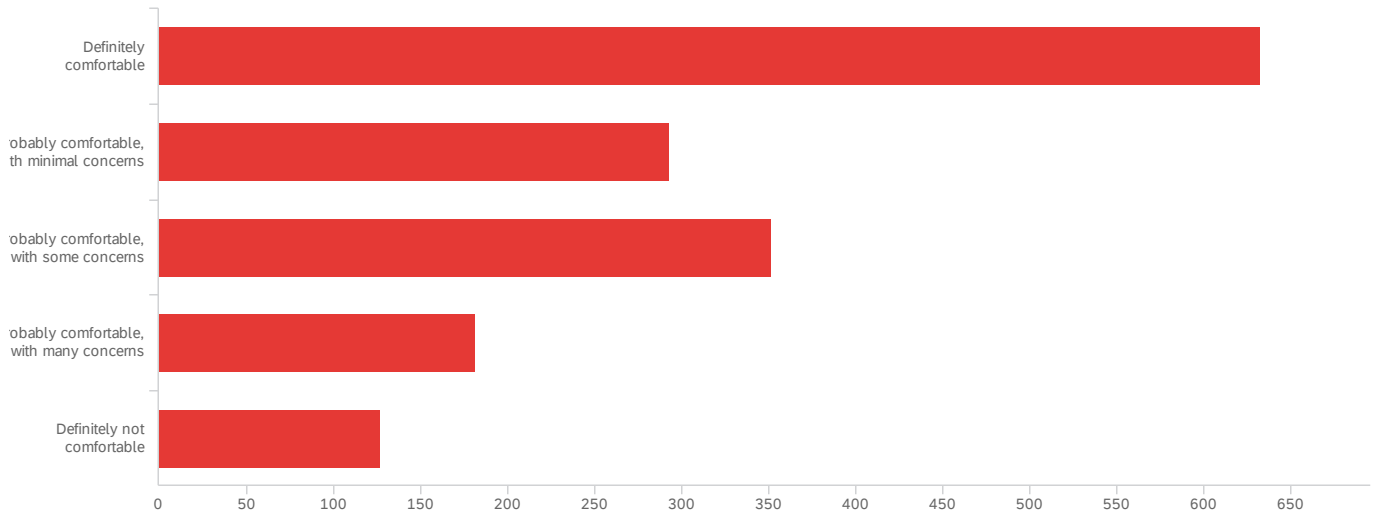

Q6 - For the return to school in August, if the District is permitted to provide in-person instruction, how comfortable would you be with having your child return to the school campus?

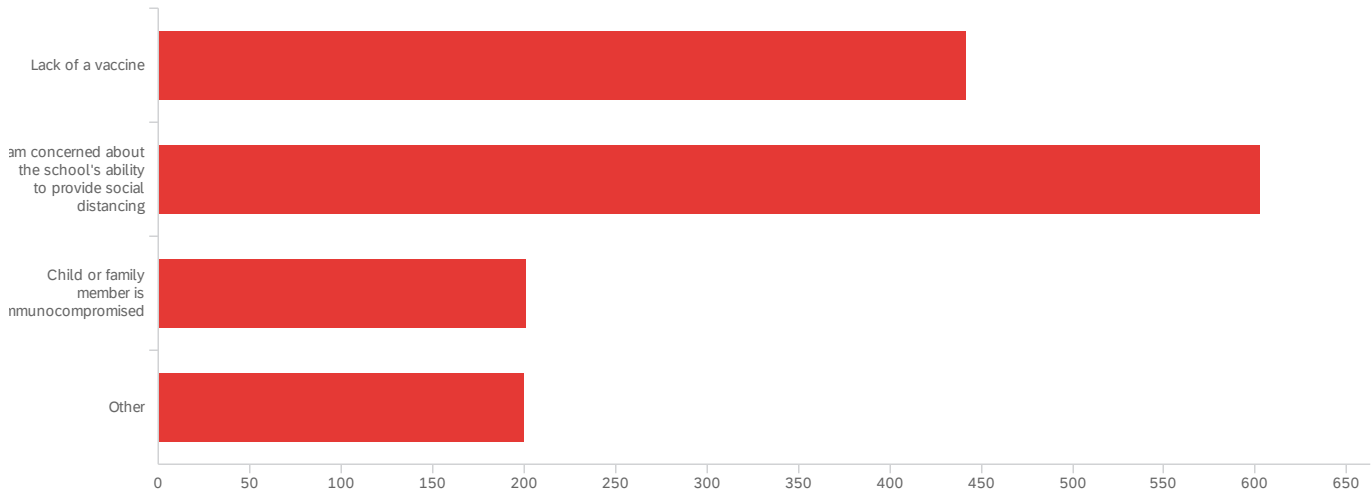

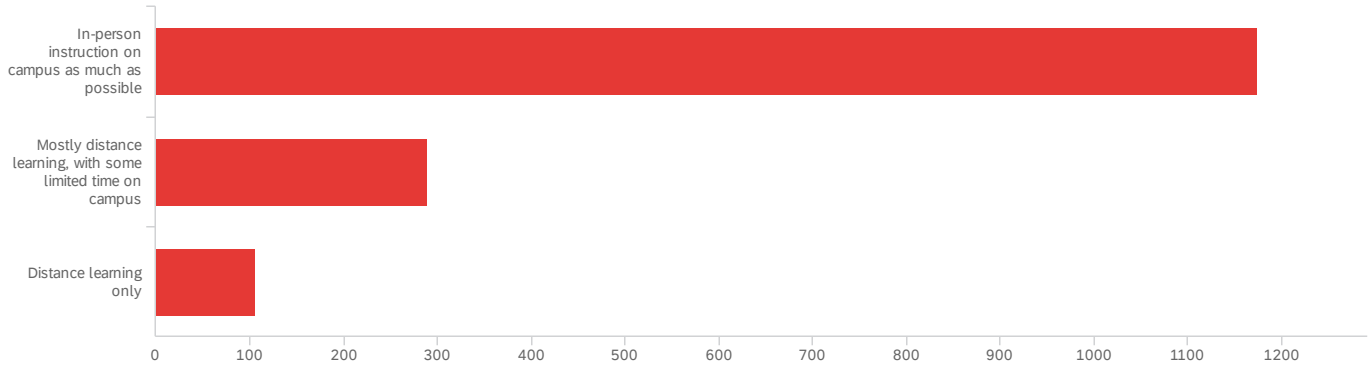

Q13 - For the return to school in August, if schools are permitted to provide in-person instruction, what are your preferences for your child?

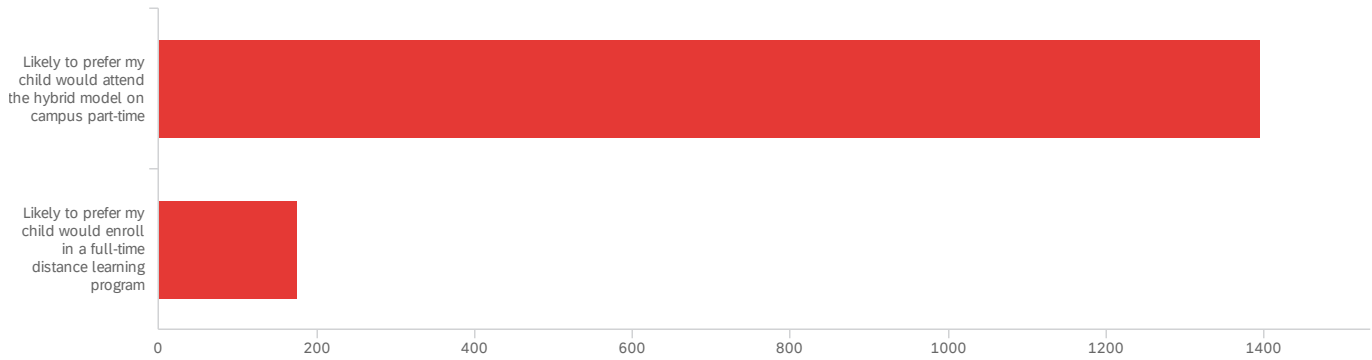

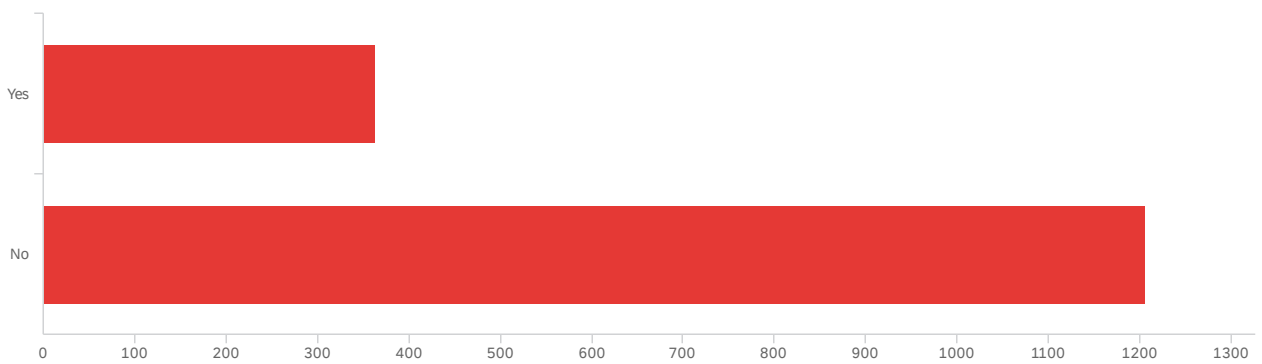

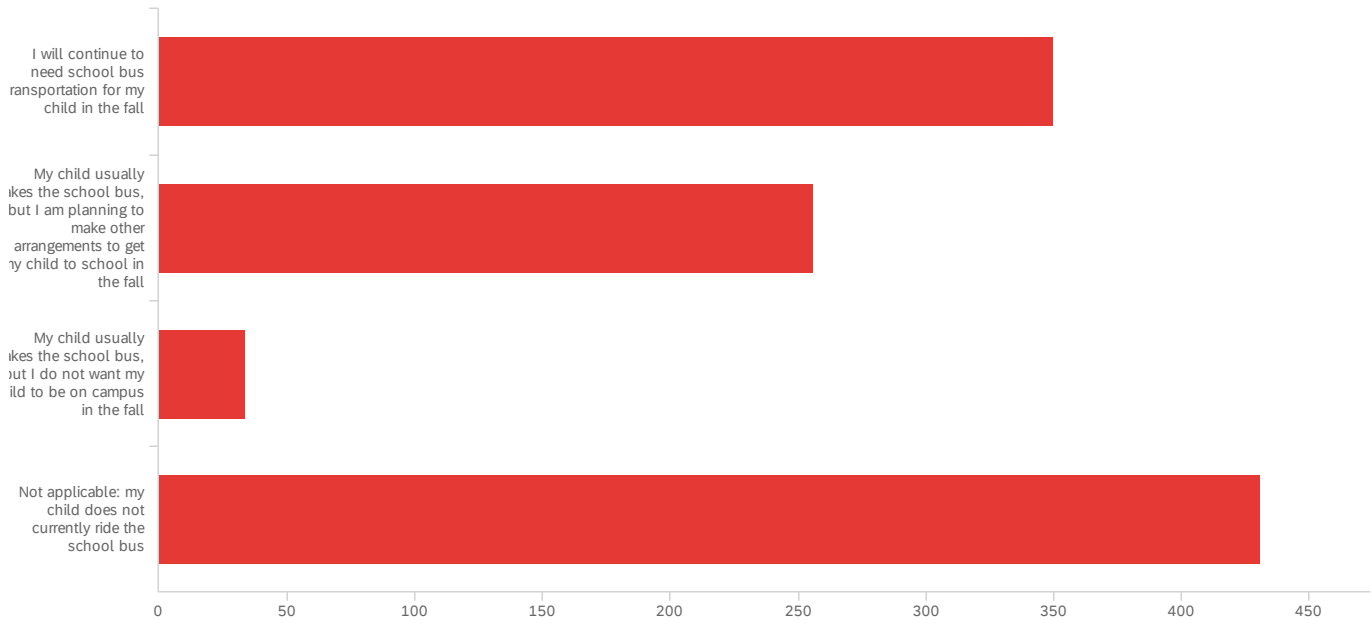

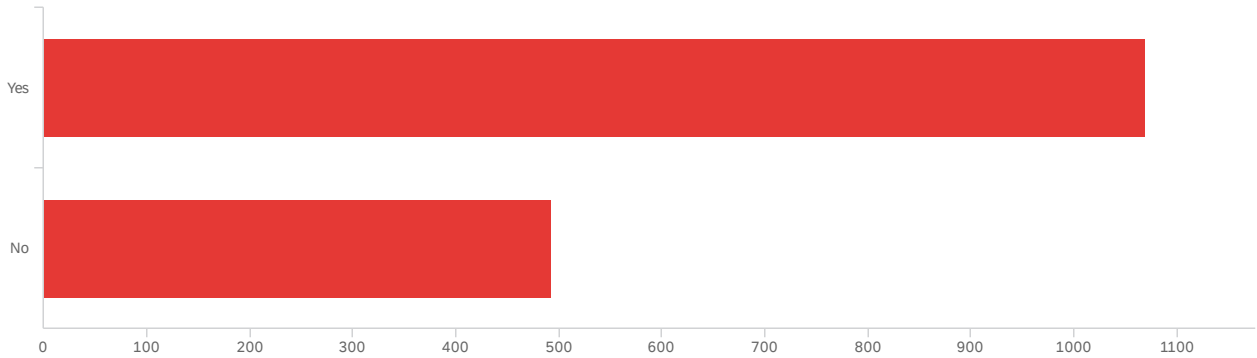

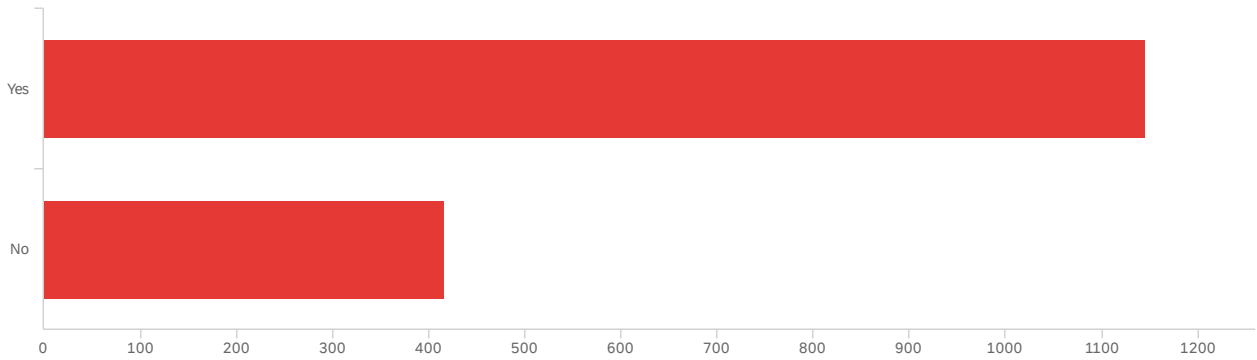

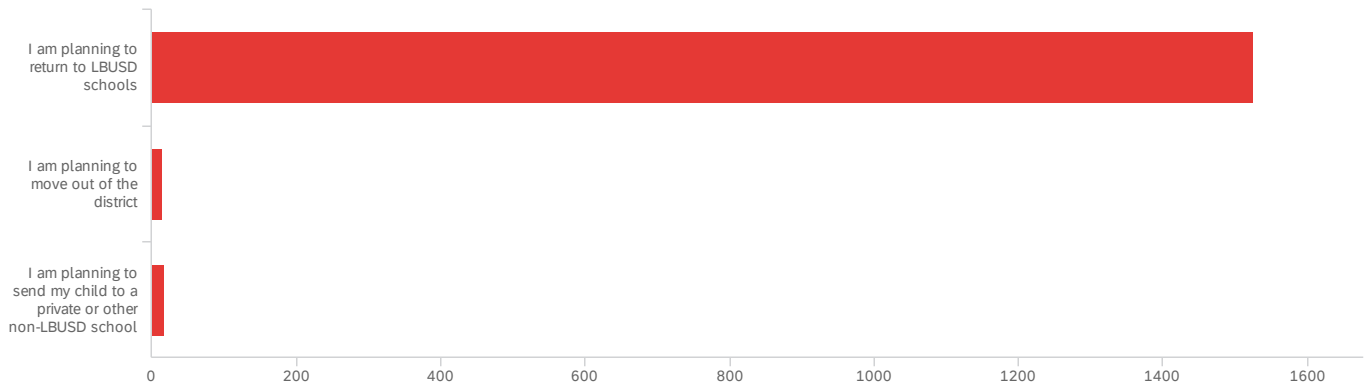

Q11 - Please indicate your plans for 2020-2021:

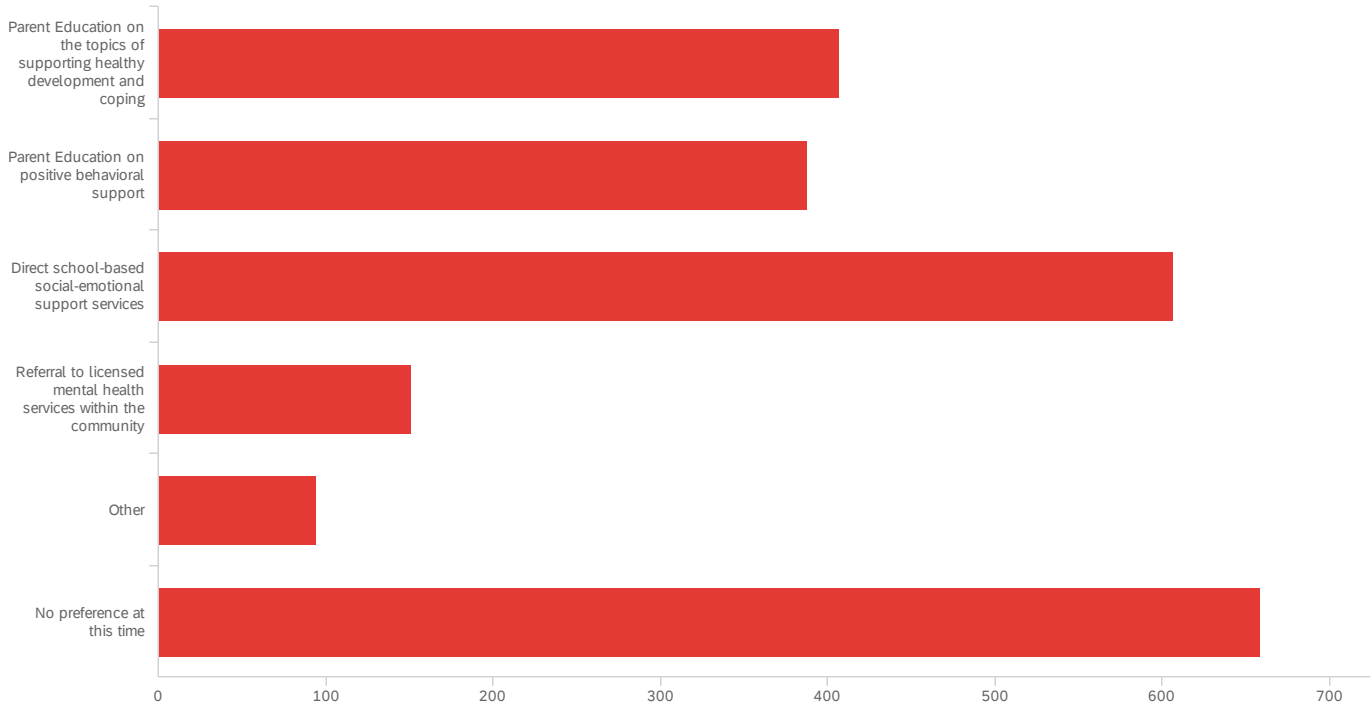
