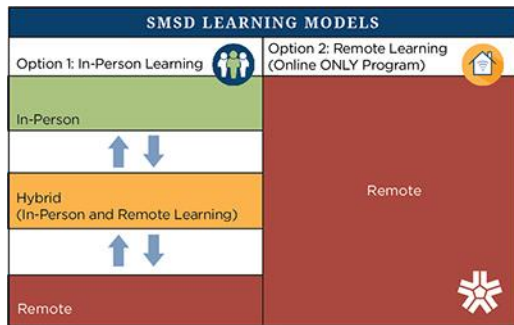




## BOARD MEETING RECAP



**Reopening Plan Update** Members of the Board of Education formally affirmed the [2020-2021 Shawnee Mission School District reopening plan](#). Board President Heather Ousley read a [resolution outlining the affirmation of the plan](#).

This week, families will be asked to submit their selection for the learning model for their child(ren) for the first semester. Superintendent Dr. Mike Fulton reiterated that with either option, there will be assessments, grades, attendance, and regular contact with Shawnee Mission School District teachers.

There will be two learning models to choose from: **In-Person Learning** (based on COVID-19 conditions and gating criteria as defined by county health officials, and our ability to ensure the safety of students and staff) and **Remote Learning** where students will be assigned to a remote learning Shawnee Mission School District teacher and will remain in that remote class for the semester.

Families are encouraged to be on the lookout for information about making this selection in their email inbox. Shawnee Mission staff will also be following up with families and will work to get in touch with families new to the district and families of Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten students to solidify their selections.

**Calendar Change:** Board members also approved a [revised 2020-2021 school calendar](#).

This calendar includes multiple adjustments including, but not limited to, changes to the first days of school for students being moved to after Labor Day. Staff and families are encouraged to [review the updated calendar closely](#) as it includes multiple changes throughout the year in order to accommodate not only the late start, but several parameters that must be followed in order to revise the school district calendar.

Revisions to the district calendar were made following parameters determined by state statute (which requires 1,116 hours of instruction time), and consultation with NEA Shawnee Mission.

**Approval of Professional Negotiated Agreement:** Board of Education members approved a Professional Negotiated Agreement (PNA) for July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2020 between the Shawnee Mission School District and NEA Shawnee Mission, contingent upon ratification of the PNA by NEA SM. ## Special Education Celebrations

Shawnee Mission also recognizes students who have completed their time receiving Post-High Transition Services, along with the most recent group of Project SEARCH students. The Post-High program provides

individually-designed services to students after high school through the age of 21. The program focuses on preparing students to live as independent adults in the community as well as increasing their vocational skill levels. Project SEARCH is a business-led work transition program where students work in partnership with AdventHealth to build their employability and independent-living skills.
