MIDDLE SCHOOL IS DIFFERENT

As young people enter adolescence, their brains and bodies begin changing even more than they did following their birth. They seek independence and begin to rail against authority—particularly that which so carefully nurtured them for the first decade of their lives.

Evolution and Pressure

With this evolution comes experimentation, curiosity, new maturity, and a great deal of social pressure: Pressure to conform while exhibiting independence and originality; pressure to lead and pressure to follow; pressure to compete.

As this natural evolution unfolds, young people are their most vulnerable, expressive, and private. They are also most in need of support, even as they push against it. A good school will provide the sense of belonging they desire at this delicate stage.

We Love Middle Schoolers

At TASIS Portugal, we understand middle schoolers, and we love them. No longer content to accept as fact everything they are told, they challenge us and themselves. They are explorers, seekers of knowledge, and makers of sense (who also need reminding when they are not making sense).

This may be the most important time for them to have strong role models outside their families. Yes, they love and admire their parents, but becoming an individual means attempting to be different and unique, often from those they love most.

Explore with Us

We invite you and your child to explore the TASIS Portugal curriculum and meet our stellar faculty. We prepare students to lead, to hold and uphold high values, to care for themselves and each other, and to dedicate themselves to lifelong learning.

RENOWNED CURRICULUM PROVEN SUCCESS

The middle school program is designed to foster the academic, aesthetic, physical, and social growth of students within a structured and caring framework. We teach students to question. We encourage divergent opinions. We inspire them to pursue the independent research of thought-provoking issues, culminating in individual rational judgments.

While still utilizing an articulated curriculum, the middle school offers additional experimentation and choice.

Cambridge Lower Secondary Curriculum

We use the Cambridge Schools International curriculum for our middle school because it is world recognized, culturally sensitive, internationally minded, and provides flexibility while remaining challenging. Cambridge Lower Secondary develops young learners who are confident, responsible, reflective, innovative, and engaged.

It provides a natural progression from primary education and preparation for rigorous upper school curricula. The Cambridge Schools curriculum is the perfect transition from the Core Knowledge curriculum used in our elementary school. Both are highly articulated, with discrete learning goals and a focus on mastery of a wide variety of subjects, including an understanding of global history, literature, language, and ideas. TASIS Portugal is a truly international school.

Singapore Math

TASIS Portugal uses the Singapore Math method, an approach which has produced the best international achievement scores over the past three decades. This curriculum was thoughtfully developed to ensure students are well prepared for rigorous upper school curricula.

The intentional progression of concepts in Singapore Math helps students become strong problem solvers who truly understand numbers and math, rather than relying on rote memorization. This unique way of teaching requires ongoing teacher training and is vastly different from methods utilized in most schools. PHYSICAL EDUCATION

FINE ARTS

We are also planning a visiting artist program from Portugal and beyond.


When I think about working with the young people who will forge their characters in the crucible of middle school and emerge leaders of merit, I am reminded of her words in 1997:

Leadership – that is what education is all about, that is the mission of education. That is why TASIS and other good schools exist. I don't mean "leadership" in a political sense. I mean the kind of leader who in one way or another subtly or visibly affects the lives of all around them and in small or larger ways makes a better person of those whose lives they touch. A role model, if you will, yet so much more, because of that certain something they give off – that sense of life as an exciting and wonderful thing! Let's try to turn all our students into that kind of person, that kind of leader.

The Grade 7 class for 2020 will be our oldest students for their six years at TASIS Portugal. This is both an incredible opportunity, and a unique responsibility. Our middle school students will require and develop leadership skills such as **courage**, **creativity**, **intellectual flexibility**, **moral conviction**, **and resilience**. We need them to help us create a great school that serves the needs of its students while pushing them to reach higher and expand their vision and their accomplishments.
