LETTER FROM DIRECTOR

Mankato Area Public Schools Community and Students,

We are happy to have the opportunity to serve and be in community with you this summer. The Summer 2020 REMIX was launched with a first edition in May, containing on-line courses and take home kits. In our second edition, we are pleased to add in-person experiences, courses and camps. The past few months have taught us many things about personal safety, isolation and the power of teamwork. Resources are available for those who may need financial assistance and your health and safety are important to us. We have added modifications to all offerings, based on Minnesota Department of Health guidelines to include; outlining the understanding of risk, adapting practices to allow physical distancing of at least 6 feet, adhering to staff (or volunteer) to participant ratios, requiring participants to conduct a symptom screening prior to attending each day and re-confirming at check in, providing opportunities for handwashing at key points of activity.

Children will be grouped in classrooms by grade/age, with a maximum of 9 children per classroom. Each group will run independently of the other groups for the majority of the day. Use of common spaces such as the cafeteria, gyms and playgrounds will be scheduled for each group, in accordance with Minnesota Departments' of Education and Health guidelines. At the end of the day, each space and all equipment will be sanitized. Staff will be offered masks and gloves to wear.



Parents must screen their child each day at home. A brief health survey will also be administered daily upon arrival. If the child (or a sibling) does not meet the criteria outlined by the Minnesota Department of Health, they will not be able to receive care. Upon entering the building, students will be expected to wash their hands before going to their classroom. If students develop any symptoms during the day, they will be isolated from their group and will need to be picked up within 30 minutes.

BABYSITTER TRAINING

(BLENDED COURSE - ONLINE & ON-SITE)

1 Session – Ages 11–15

Get set for summer. The purpose of the American Red Cross Babysitter's Training course is to provide youth ages 11–15 with the information and skills necessary to provide safe and responsible care for children in the absence of parents or adult guardians. This training will help participants develop skills in leadership and professionalism, basic care, safety and safe play and first aid. Class fee includes textbooks (babysitter handbook & emergency response book). This class is now a blended course with half online and half on-site instruction. The day will begin at Lincoln Community Center with on-site instruction of the Child Development portion of the course. Students will receive their textbooks and have in person instruction from 9:00 a.m - 12:00 (noon). At 12:00 (noon) students will be dismissed to return home to finish the first aid and emergency response portion of the course online, which will be video tutorials posted on GOOGLE CLASSROOM. An invite to the online portion of the course will be sent to your MAPS school email account (if you have one) or a personal email if you attend school outside of MAPS. This email invitation to join the online portion of the class will be sent the day before the class. Once on-site and online instruction is complete and all coursework is completed, students will be eligible to receive their American Red Cross Babysitter Training card and begin your quest for employment. For best results, set aside the full day (9:00 am to 3:30 pm) and commit to finishing all coursework required on the date of the class. Bring a light lunch or snack to the on-site portion of the class.

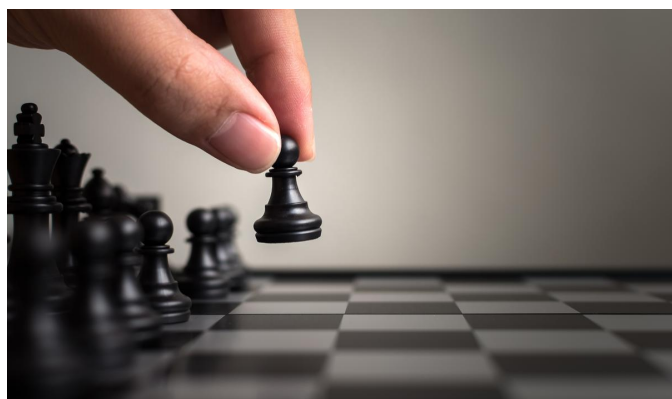

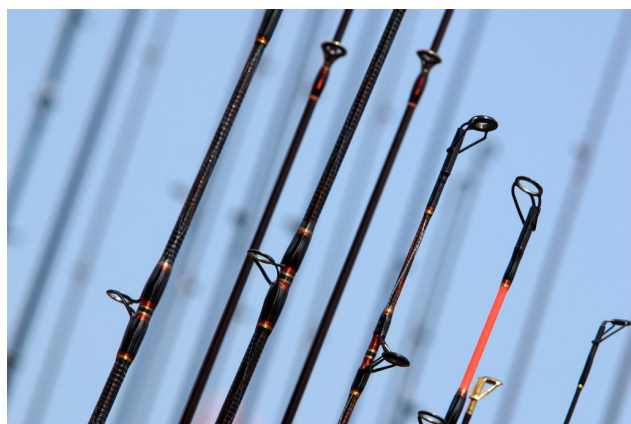

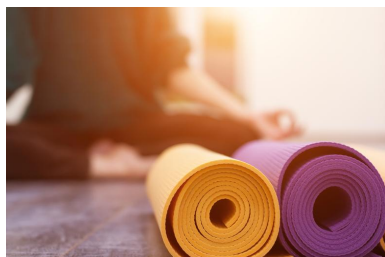
