

This was made evident on June 22 when we celebrated the groundbreaking ceremony for our new two-story classroom building. Moses Brown, and our new Chaplain of Cardinal Newman High School Fr. John Plass for leading us in prayer and blessing. And thank you to all who contribute to A Call to Lead – The Capital Campaign for Cardinal Newman as their generosity allowed construction to begin fully funded.

We continue planning for our next campaign project, the Student Union, which will include a new library, new counseling offices, new indoor and outdoor eating facilities, and additional learning areas. A significant challenge gift of \$11,000,000 was committed towards the \$16,000,000 total, on condition that our school community raise the remaining \$5,000,000 by June 2021 – and we are very close! 

DISTANCE LEARNING

La Heroes Work Here". This sign has been appearing all over the country to honor the individuals who have been on the frontlines of the fight against the Coronavirus. Truly, those people are heroes and have our utmost gratitude. Recently, one of those signs was placed on the Cardinal Newman campus by a thoughtful community member. It serves as a reminder of the extraordinary effort that our faculty and staff put forth in order to continue educating and connecting with our students during the shelter in place.

CN teachers were initially trained on distance learning practices and technologies on Friday, March 13th in order to prepare for the "possible" need to partially close or close California schools. The weekend of March 14th and 15th witnessed the closing of approximately 80% of California schools. On Monday, March 16th, the Cardinal Newman faculty was brought together for a now "extremely necessary" training on Zoom and distance teaching instructions, ideas and procedures. As of Tuesday, March 17th, Cardinal Newman was teaching all classes online and students returned to learning in a new way.

Heroes? Yes. Every teacher worked diligently and tirelessly to adjust curriculum, instruction and assessment so that every student would continue learning and feel supported. The staff continued to support our families and school while adjusting to working from home.

All of the planning and training would not have led to a successful experience without the persistence and resiliency of the students. Students adjusted quickly, continued to work hard and remained engaged in their classes and schoolwork. This was apparent in the fifty percent reduction in absenteeism.

A survey administered in May found that our students and parents were extremely pleased with the way the distance learning experience progressed. Comments from parents included appreciation for the structure and consistency of the instructional time, the guick move to online instruction and the continued high level of instruction provided by teachers. Students reported that teachers remained available and showed genuine care and concern for students' wellbeing.

While we know students, parents, faculty and staff all missed being together and learning as a community, Cardinal Newman was able to continue to provide a quality educational experience for students. We appreciate how difficult this time has been for everyone and we look forward to a return to our Cardinal Newman campus and community.

r. Bonfigli has been a fixture at Cardinal Newman High School since entering the school in 1967 and graduating in 1971 as a multi-sport athlete. He started teaching at Cardinal Newman

in 1976, and has been a faculty member here for 31 years with a short tenure in between at Justin Siena. In that time Mr. Bonfigli has taught a number of courses, the latest of which has been Government, Economics and AP Economics. His lectures are legendary. On the basketball court Coach Bonfigli has also been legendary with 591 wins at Cardinal Newman and 16 North Bay League championships. He won 816 games, eighth most in California history. He was named the National Federation of State High School Associations Coach of the Year for boys basketball in California in 2019.

Mr. McNamara came to Cardinal Newman 16 years ago when he was hired to teach photography. Prior to that time, Mr. McNamara, who was born in London, had

has encouraged his students to have their works published in local newspapers, the latest of which appeared in the North Bay Bohemian. He conceived of and produced the Schooltimes online magazine for the school which included original student photos, artwork, and writing. The 'shovel holders' at the ceremony represented our supportive Cardinal





he 2019-2020 Cardinal Newman High School Varsity Girls Basketball team had one of the most successful seasons in program history. The season started with a win in the program's firstever Championship in the extremely competitive 6th Annual Cardinal Newman Classic Tournament, which featured some of the top teams and players in Northern California. The Cardinals opened up tournament play with a win over a talented young Pinole Valley squad followed by hard-earned win over state-ranked Sacred Heart Cathedral. They went on to defeat state-ranked San Ramon Valley in the Championship game of the tournament. Junior Guard Aysia Dural and Senior Guard Emma Nordby were named to the All-Tournament Team. Senior Guard Anya Choice was named Tournament MVP, averaging over 25 points per game on the weekend.

The next week the Cardinals went on to win the Paris Twins Classic Tournament at Piedmont High School. Once again, Anya Choice was named Tournament MVP and Juniors Aysia Dural and Mariah Harris were named to the All-Tournament Team.

For the 7th year in a row the Cardinals dominated Sonoma County winning the North Bay League Oak Division Championship and the North Bay League Oak Tournament Championship. During league play they also participated in the St. Mary's Stockton MLK Showcase and the Heritage Rep Your School Showcase, two of the most prestigious showcases in the country. They had two big wins over Regis Jesuit (one of the top ranked teams in Colorado) and Antelope, who went on to win the Sac Joaquin Division 2 Section Championship.

The Cardinals received the #3 seed in the Inaugural NCS Open Division, which consists of the top six teams in the North Coast Section regardless of division. They began Open Division play with a home win over #6 seed Heritage (Brentwood, CA) and followed that up with an upset road win over #2 seed Salesian (Richmond, CA). Anya Choice dominated Salesian, scoring 43 points (8 3-pointers) and setting both a personal and a school scoring record. With that

win the Cardinals qualified for the NCS Open Division Championship at St. Mary's College of CA, where they fell to the #1 seed St. Joseph's of Notre Dame (Alameda, CA).

For the third time in four years the Cardinals were selected to compete in the Open State Tournament. The Open Division consists of the top teams in the state of California (up to 16 teams), regardless of division or school size. Cardinal Newman Girls Basketball is the only program in the history of Sonoma County to be selected to participate in the Open Division.

The Cardinals were selected as the #5 seed in Northern California and were on the road to battle St. Mary's Stockton. The Cardinals defeated the National Powerhouse by two as Anya Choice connected with Christina Bacci on a fast break lay-up with a few seconds remaining. With that win the Cardinals were on the road once again, this time to battle another National Powerhouse in Archbishop Mitty. The Cardinals fell to Mitty, ending their season as the #2 Ranked Team in the North Coast Section (All Divisions) and the #11 Ranked Team in the State California (All Divisions).

The Cardinals graduate four tremendous seniors: Christina Bacci, Liz Chambers, Anya Choice and Emma Nordby. Christina accepted a scholarship to play college basketball at Cal State Eastbay, Liz accepted a scholarship to play college basketball at Point Loma Nazarene University, Anya accepted a scholarship to play college basketball at UC Santa Barbara and Emma will be studying Engineering at Texas A&M University. These four young women have made tremendous contributions to our program and have been a huge part of some of the most successful teams in program history. We would like to thank Christina, Liz, Anya, Emma and their families for their commitment to the Cardinal Newman community and the girls basketball program. We wish them the best of luck in college and beyond!

The Cardinal Newman Wrestling Team finished the 2019-2020 season at the end of February. The Cardinals finished 3rd in the Men's North Bay League Tournament, which combined both the Redwood and Oak Divisions. The Lady Cardinals finished 5th in the Women's North Bay League Tournament.

Starting the season with a limited roster, the Cardinals struggled with injuries throughout the season. The team finished with a disappointing 0-5 record in dual meets, however that did not stop them from excelling individually.

Starting with the Lady Cardinals, freshman Isabella Sanchez had a promising season finishing third in the NBL tournament. Sophomore standout Ruby Joseph finished first at the NBL tournament. Ruby qualified for the North Coast Section Tournament where she faced

n December 2-3, 2019, the Cardinal Newman Dance Program presented, "Imaginarium", a contemporary dance show inspired by dreams.



CAPSTONE RESEARCHERS: SUCCESS WHILE SHELTERING!

ow in its third year, the AP Capstone Program offers Cardinal Newman students the opportunity to engage in college-level research on individually-chosen topics. Maryanne Berry brought the program to Newman with the aim of enhancing the interdisciplinary nature of the school's curriculum. The English Department had already developed a deep relationship with the Religion Department through the Community-Based Service Learning (CBSL) program. Ms. Berry said, "My first goal was to develop a type of "Advanced Placement CBSL" option through which students could participate in action research,

to gather and analyze data for an extended inquiry. My second goal was to expand the same successful collaboration that existed between English and Religion with other departments."

Last year, Ms. Berry invited Mr. Eduardo Wolbert to teach the first of the two courses, "AP Seminar" while she continued with the second. The two teachers agree that the most profound learning occurs when

using their sites both to develop projects as well as

agree that the most profound learning occurs when students' scholarly work grows from their own passions and interests. The way Mr. Wolbert views the program, "Capstone can be a vehicle for students who love science, technology or the arts to develop foundational skills in the Seminar year and then conduct a yearlong exploration in the Research class that culminates in a twenty page, scholarly paper."

This year, Christine Nguyen who began researching issues related to the humane treatment of animals during her junior year chose to craft her CBSL project at the Sonoma County Animal Shelter. According to Christine, "Deep research refined my critical thinking

skills and helped me realize that it's okay to have more questions than answers."

The process of writing the paper became an integral part of her learning. "I came into the class thinking that my final draft would end up looking very similar to my first draft....I ended up cutting out large sections of my paper and constantly rereading sentences and rearranging paragraphs until I thought the paper made more sense. Writing this paper led me to talking to

experts in the field and learning everything

there was to know and more. I was able to come up with new perspectives and being able to write about them was extremely rewarding."

Vincent Peng pursued his personal interest in climate change by investigating how people assess risk. He conducted a survey of members of Cardinal Newman's community whose lives have been affected by wildfires and discovered "evidence that climate change risk perception is affected by both personal experiences with extreme weather and differences in political ideology." He enjoyed the self-directed inquiry that contributed both to the development of his writing skills and his understanding of statistics. "The Capstone research paper has been so valuable to my educational and intellectual growth. It allowed me to discover the research process that scientists and academics use to answer today's most important questions. The process challenged my writing and reasoning skills which have prepared me to thrive in college."

Two students extended their investigations to far corners of the globe. Alexander Limper who explored youths' perceptions of safety while interacting on the internet and Junfei "Jordan" Xiong who studied

methods of teaching English in China, both gathered international data. According to Jordan, "The most challenging component was the research design. It was my first time designing a method of interviewing people. In Capstone, I learned how to be a real researcher. I want to study Biochemistry in the future, which requires experience on how to write a research paper."

Ms. Berry was deeply impressed by the students' abilities to complete their papers while distance learning. "They continued to support one another through group discussion and peer review. While the development of skills was a shared process, everyone in the class gained from the growing expertise of each individual. The student writing the paper on carbon emissions, also learned from classmates on topics ranging from film theory to historical injustices, music therapy, and commuter railways. Because the course is student-driven, it's new every time we teach it!"


