

2020 Alto Football Ticket System

UIL Guidelines & AISD Compliance

- 1. All individuals must be screened before entering the stadium.
 - All season ticket holders will need to provide the district with a working email address. The morning of a home game, you will be sent an email to check your health status. You must reply to the email no later than 3:00 for admission to the game.
 - Participant family tickets / presale tickets will have a health screening form on the back. The health information must be completed before entry into the stadium.
- 2. Masks must be worn at all times by all spectators age 10 and older as long as GA-29 is in effect.
 - This requirement may be modified if the public health situation improves.
- 3. Hand sanitizing stations must be available throughout the stadium.
 - Hand cleaning stations will be located at all entrances, in bathrooms, and outside of concession area.
- 4. Walkways must be clear at all times so two paths of foot traffic are free from congestion.
 - No spectators will be allowed to stop on walkways. Signs will be posted as reminders.
 - Fans will not be allowed to stand on the outside of the fence rows. Security will be enforced to ensure compliance.
- 5. Individuals not essential to the team or group should not be given access to contest areas, before, during, or after contests.
 - In compliance with health and safety precautions, there will be no victory lines, no tunnel crews, no gathering on the field after the game, no Coach of the Week, no extra photographers, no Junior Jackets, no Mini Cheer, no Mini Twirlers.

6. Stadium capacity may not exceed 50%. In addition, seating for spectators must be 6 feet between groups and rows must be alternating.



- Each varsity football player, varsity cheerleader, mascot, band member, and auxiliary member will be reserved 2 tickets per game for their family. Payment for those tickets must be received by 3:00 Wednesday prior to the home game. Failure to purchase those tickets, will result in them being offered to fans on a waiting list. Participant family seats will be assigned in a random drawing system in Sections A, B, F, G, and Hillside.
- Reserved ticket holders in Section D will be distributed in two methods.
 - During the construction of the stadium in 1994, some families purchased lifetime seating to help pay for the stadium. Those families will receive their appropriate lifetime ticket allotment. Due to social distancing, those tickets may be located in various locations in Section D.
 - Other season ticket holders will have their names entered in a random drawing for Section D based on the number of tickets purchased in 2019.
 - Those names not drawn in Section D will be combined with the names in Sections C & E for those seats.
- Reserved ticket holders in Sections C & E will have their names entered in a random drawing based on the number of tickets purchased in 2019.

Please note *** Once this pandemic is over, all reserved seating will go back to previously held places in 2019. *** Fans who purchased reserved tickets in 2019, will have an opportunity to repurchase their seating for 2021. ***

- There is no guarantee that family members will be able to sit together in groups this year.
- Due to the restrictions and in attempt to allow as many fans into the stadium, we are seating in groups of two this year.
- Names for reserved seating will be drawn on Friday, July 31. Fans will be notified on Monday, August 3rd and will be given until Wednesday, August 5that 3:30 to remit payment for the ticket(s). Failure to pay by the deadline will result in a new name being drawn.
- Reserved seating will be valid for both Thursday and Friday evenings this season.
- Participant family seating will only be valid for the evening that the student is performing.

7. Alto ISD passed a local resolution stating that only students attending face-to-face instruction will be able to participate in extracurricular activities.

• Students attending on-line instruction will not be allowed to attend games or participate in extra-curricular events.

8. Parking Guidelines

- Reserved ticket holders will be able to park in the first four rows of elementary parking lot.
- Families with participant tickets will be able to park in the four rows closest to the elementary school.
- Those with tickets must be able to show their ticket to be permitted to enter the parking area.
- 9. UIL has granted schools the opportunity to livestream games this year due to limited stadium capacity.
 - To help bring Alto Football Friday Nights to all our fans, Alto ISD has partnered with a videographer to provide the next best thing to being in the stadium. Our local radio favorites will be adding commentary to the action to make our live feed a wonderful experience!
 - Fans will be able to livestream all home and away games this season (as long as there is internet service at the schools we visit).
 - Fans will be able to access the game through the district Facebook page.

*** Away game tickets will be offered through presale for parents of participants. Any additional away tickets will then be offered to the general public by presale only. Please email Lacey Sullivan @ <u>lsullivan@alto.esc7.net</u> or call the administration building at 936-858-7101 to put your name on a waiting list for general admission tickets.

*** General admission tickets will not be sold at home games this season. After the deadline for participant families to purchase tickets has passed, fans on the waiting list will be contacted to purchase.
