Guidelines for Creating Clubs at Paxon Hollow


- 1) Come up with an idea for your club and make sure it is clear and understandable.
- 2) Find a teacher(s) to be your faculty advisor(s). This means they will be the supervisor for the club and be present at all club meetings.
- 3) Fill out an information packet about your club. These can be found in Mrs. Campo-John's room 102 or ask a member of Student Council for a copy. You must then fill out the name of your club, why it would be beneficial to the student body, and the name of your faculty advisor(s).
- 4) After you turn in your packet to Mrs. Campo-John or a student council member, student council will hold a vote to determine whether they think the club will be enjoyed by the student body. If approved by Student Council, it is forwarded to building administration for approval. Some clubs or activities may also require school board approval.
- 5) If your club is approved, Student Council will work with you and your advisor(s) to plan the club and get sign-ups and activity times set up.
