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Key Points

- Health and Safety Guidelines and Standards Health & Safety Plan is based upon <u>current</u> guidance from the CDC, ACHD, PA Departments of Health and Education, and the Governor's office.
 In addition, stakeholder input was a key component.
- Highest Standards of Cleaning and Disinfection Exceeding recommendations.
- **Contingent Educational Options** Including full-time in-person and full-time online. A hybrid option is included in the plan that may be necessary based upon changing conditions.
- **PDE Provided Template** Aligns to the Governor's red, yellow, and green phases. *As of now there are no metrics that delineate the phases.



Option 1 - Students attend in school classes two days per week and learn virtually three days per week.


Option 2- Students attend in school classes for one week and learn virtually for one week.






Monitoring Student & Staff Health



Students and employees should stay home when sick.





Daily Self-Screening

A positive screen that would warrant further investigation would be a temperature greater than 100.4 degrees or a "yes" response these questions.

- 1. Do you have a temperature of 100.4 or greater?
- 2. Do you have a new onset cough, new loss of taste or smell, or shortness of breath?
- 3. Have you traveled out of the United States within the last 14 days?
- 4. Have you traveled out of Pennsylvania within the last 14 days? **
- 5. Have you had known exposure to a COVID-19-positive individual?

**#4 - The Pennsylvania Department of Health issued revised guidance on July 10, 2020 related to travel to areas where there are high amounts of COVID-19 cases. Travelers, or individuals planning to travel, to the <u>following states</u> are recommended to quarantine for 14 days upon their return.



Isolation Protocol

- Should an individual student, employee, or visitor display COVID-19 symptoms, he/she should not enter the school building, and/or be placed into an isolation room, and/or be immediately removed from the school building and masked if not already. The parent or guardian, if a student, will be notified immediately. Testing for COVID-19 will be recommended to the staff member or student.
- The Chairperson of Health Services for the District, or designee, will contact the Allegheny County Health Department, make a joint determination about isolation or quarantine needs, and comply with their recommendations.
- Employees or students who demonstrate COVID-19 symptoms will be required to have a release from their healthcare provider prior to being permitted to return, which will be reviewed by the District Chairperson for Health Services and the Allegheny County Health Department.



CDC Guidance on Reducing Stigma

"No single person or group of people are more likely than others to spread COVID-19. Public health emergencies, such as this pandemic, are stressful times for people and communities. Fear and anxiety about a disease can lead to social stigma, which is negative attitudes and beliefs toward people, places, or things."

"Stigma can lead to *labeling*, *stereotyping*, *discrimination*, and *other negative behaviors* toward others." **These** behaviors will not be tolerated.
