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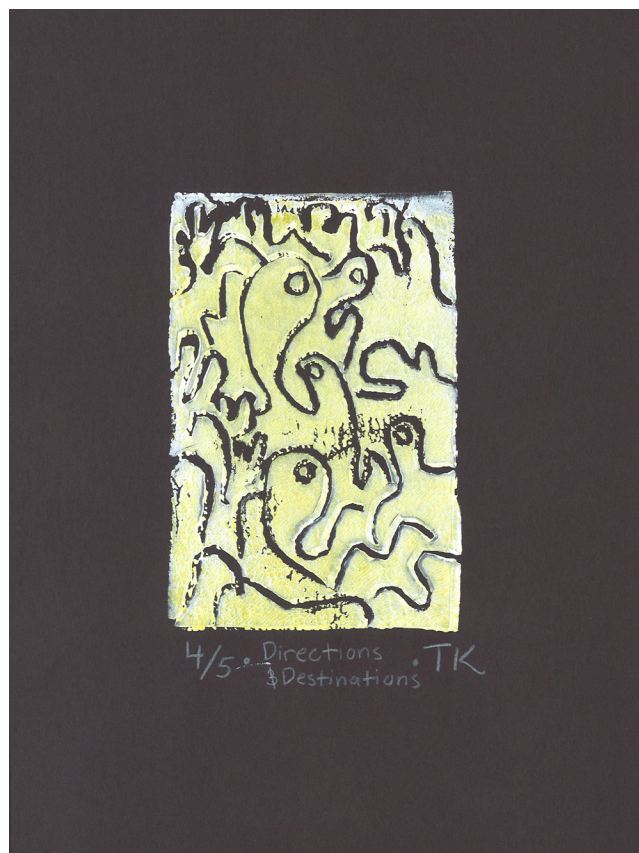

SUPPORTING STUDENT SUCCESS

JOSEPHINUM ACADEMY OF THE SACRED HEART HAS A LONG-STANDING TRADITION OF EXTENDING THE BOUNDARIES OF EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY TO THE YOUNG WOMEN OF CHICAGO.

Most recently, this is evident in Josephinum's decision to offer a wall-to-wall International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) to all of our students. As a result, we have built a rigorous and thought-provoking curriculum designed to meet the needs of diverse learners.

While Josephinum's decision to offer a wall-to-wall IBDP is exciting, it is clear that the success of such a program relies on the school's ability to effectively support each student as she engages in her challenging coursework. With this in mind, Josephinum has recently entered into a partnership with the Andrew M. Greeley Center for Catholic Education at Loyola University Chicago. Together, we will build a comprehensive Response to Intervention (RTI)

program and develop a systematic and multi-tiered approach to the early identification and strategic support of struggling students, while maintaining high expectations for student success.

The foundation of a strong RTI program is built upon high quality classroom instruction, and the effective monitoring of student learning inside the classroom. Strategic small group and individualized support structures will be developed and implemented for students who require extra attention.

An effective RTI program is designed to provide the best education possible for all students. We are excited about this endeavor and the opportunity to seamlessly support our students as they strive to reach their full potential.

What is one of Patti Tuomey's first goals as she steps into her new role as President of Josephinum Academy of the Sacred Heart? Shouting the school's name from the rooftops!

"This school is a hidden gem," Patti said. "I want more people to know about Josephinum so that they can join and experience this wonderful community. I know that the people I have met here, the people who make this school possible, make me want to come back to work every day. This is a community that is making a difference, and that everyone should want to be a part of."

After spending two months meeting with members of the community and exploring the ins and outs of Josephinum, Patti is ready to build on a foundation rooted in collaboration with the Sisters of Christian Charity and the Network of Sacred Heart Schools, and lead the school into the next chapter of its history.

Patti brings more than 20 years of management experience at nonprofit and philanthropic organizations to her new role at Josephinum. Most recently, Patti served as President and Chief Executive Officer for the Pulmonary Fibrosis Foundation. She previously held positions at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, the Peggy Notebaert Nature Museum, and the Field Museum. Additionally, she has taught marketing and management courses at Northwestern University and the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.

"After 127 years in Wicker Park, Josephinum is an anchor in this community and this neighborhood," Patti said. "I intend to extend Josephinum's reach beyond its physical bounds and help to facilitate meaningful partnerships that will benefit all of the members of this wonderful community."

Along with building community partnerships, Patti expressed a desire to grow Josephinum into a school that can serve as a model for similar educational institutions.

"This is an important time to step up and step in for women, and especially for our students," she said. "Access to a quality, transformative education is more important now than ever, and I'm excited to lead a community that is providing that to young women across Chicago."

"We want our students to be critical thinkers," Patti continued. "We want them to be compassionate. And, we want to provide them with an environment that allows them to grow together and form a real bond of sisterhood. All of this, married with our rigorous wall-to-wall International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme, sets us apart. I believe that we are creating a model for educational institutions who aspire to provide this kind of program to their students. We have something special happening here, and I cannot wait to share it with even more people."

JOSEPHINUM HELPED ME FIND MY VOICE

If you would have told me four years ago that I would be passionate about speaking in front of large crowds, I would never have believed you. Coming into high school, I struggled to step out of my comfort zone and found it difficult to even start a conversation with someone new. The leadership opportunities I was presented with throughout my years at Josephinum helped me find my voice.

Through singing in Josephinum's a cappella ensemble, Unaccompanied Minors, I was able to recognize that every member of a community plays a vital role in creating the perfect harmony. Eager to find my purpose, I challenged my introverted nature by competing in Illinois Council of Teachers of Mathematics (ICTM) Math Competitions, Lincoln-Douglas debates, and Model United Nations Conferences.

Something inside me clicked every time I stepped up to the podium as a UN Ambassador. I was speaking for the people of my "country" and working to solve real world problems. At my first conference, I played the role of a Chicago alderman, and one day I hope to relive that moment as a reality. After traveling to South Africa with the Peace Exchange to study nonviolence, and interning at Chicago City Hall last summer, I realized how passionate I am about creating peace.

I will be attending DePauw University in Greencastle, Indiana this fall as a Bonner Scholar.* All it took was one campus visit, for DePauw to become my dream school. I found a familiar comfort in the passion of the professors and friendliness of the students at DePauw. While participating in a Comparative Politics and Government class discussion during my college visit, I realized that Josephinum has helped me develop the ambition, confidence, and curiosity I need to be a lifelong learner.

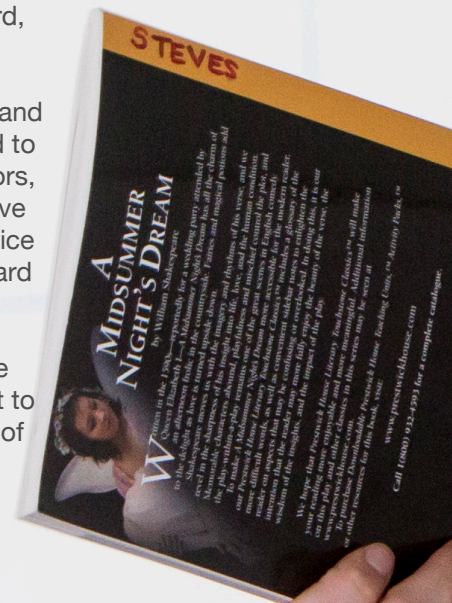
