Sophomore Sanay Ma spoke at the event, talking about her past experiences as a refugee in Southeast Asia before finding her place at Josephinum: "I was born in a Thailand refugee camp and I lived there about 11 years. It was very difficult to live in a place where I couldn't be independent or secure. With God's help, I am here today in the U.S., attending a good school and living in a place where I can find so many roads that I can walk on. I have been here in the U.S for four years now, and I go to Josephinum."
