Meet Corina Perez: Posse Scholar, ESPN & NFL Rise Above Award Winner

Corina Perez's senior year is off to a great start! In September she was one of two Chicago students to receive ESPN's RISE ABOVE Student Athlete Award, presented by ESPN and the NFL. Corina was nominated by Josephinum Athletic Director Teresa Schirrippa, who thought she was a perfect candidate: Corina participates in four sports at the Jo, she was named part of the All-Catholic league in volleyball and softball, she has been named MVP of three of her sports teams, she ranks second in her class, and she still finds time to participate in community service as well as acting in last year's school play.

Corina appeared on TV for FOX Chicago to talk about her award and how her high school gave her the confidence to succeed in sports. She was there to help promote the NFL's initiative to create Flag Football teams for high school girls. Josephinum

was one of the first Chicago high schools to introduce the program, led by professional athletes from the Women's NFL, and it has been a huge success with our students.

In addition to this honor, Corina is the second Josephinum student to receive the prestigious Posse Scholarship in the last 2 years. After an intensive application and several rounds of interviews, she will be attending Carleton College in Minnesota on a full scholarship thanks to the Posse Foundation (www.possefoundation.org).

Corina is also the first recipient of the Helen Bruns Ryan Scholarship, which was started last year in honor of the longtime leader and supporter of our school. The scholarship is given to a student who most embodies the Sacred Heart Goal Five: A student who commits herself to personal growth in an atmosphere of wise freedom.
