SLUH tabbed as front-runner

Last season, four of the five schools in the Metro Catholic Conference advanced to the Missouri High School Activities Association Cross Country Championships.

One of those schools, Chaminade, won a state title, competing in the 3A division. The other three, DeSmet (fourth), St. Louis University High (eighth) and CBC (11th), all turned in respectable performances competing in 4A in

Jefferson City.

Though graduation losses may deflate any state title dreams for the MCC squads this fall, the conference should again be strong.

ST. LOUIS UNIVERSITY HIGH looks to be the

early favorite.

Coach Jim Linhares lost three seniors from a year ago, including Tom O'Brien, who finished 25th at state, but will return four kids with varsity experience. Peter Schaefer, who finished a disappointing 127th at state, leads a group of seniors that includes Drew Noblot (41st at state), Kevin Crean (69th) and Kyle Gonnerman (73rd).
