Northbrook High School is a comprehensive public high school located in Northwest Houston. We serve a very diverse population with student enrolled from a variety of different countries. We are the flagship school for the Sky Partnership with KIPP Houston Public Schools and YES Prep Public Schools, two high-performing charter management organizations, to expand middle and high school choices and opportunities for SBISD students. We have ongoing partnerships with College Community Career, Emerge and Posse organizations that foster a college-going culture with low income, first generation high school students and families.

Weighted grade points are awarded for only one course per year, grades 9-12, in each of the four core curricular areas (English, math, science, social studies). GPA is determined by dividing the total grade points by the number of courses attempted. Courses not included in the calculation of GPA include those taken as correspondence/online, credit by examination and those taken in summer school and middle school. An expanded grading scale includes Special Education.

Spring Branch ISD reports class rank outside the top 10% only for those students who make a formal request to have it included on their transcript.
