- *Complete a D.O.T. Physical and drug screen. We use McClatchy medical center at 7235 Hacks Cross Rd. in Olive Branch, MS. You can schedule a physical and drug screen at 662-893-7878. **Your drug screen must be LESS than 30 days old before class starts. Please ask for clarification if needed...
- *Must obtain your Class A CDL Learners Permit BEFORE acceptance into the program.

You can pick up a copy of the CDL manual at most state DMV offices.

Most states have a CDL manual that is downloadable online as well.

- **I prefer the CDL training material that can be accessed at www.truckingtruth.com Click on the banner for "CDL Training Material", that will take you to the "High Road Online CDL Training Program", which in my opinion is the best available...
- **After you have worked through the CDL manual you can take a series of practice tests at www.cristcdl.com before going over to your state DMV office to take the real test...

Your three part, Class A learners permit exam at the DMV will cover fifty- General Knowledge questions, twenty-five- Air Brake questions, and twenty- Combination Vehicle questions.

Once all steps above have been completed, they must be turned into Mr. Wilbanks at 8750 Deerfield Dr. in Olive Branch, MS., or Mrs. Walker at Desoto Center, at 5197 W.E. Ross Parkway in Southaven, MS.
