Meadowbrook@Home for Lower School Students

As we plan for the Meadowbrook@Home program, student academic and social wellbeing continue to be our guideposts. While being at home is fundamentally different than being on campus with peers and teachers, we feel confident that what we can provide for students supports their ongoing learning and development. Here is what students and families participating in Meadowbrook@Home can expect:

Lower school students who participate in Meadowbrook@Home will be placed in combined grade level cohorts (JK/SK,1/2/3, 4/5) with one or more teachers, depending on enrollment. The cohorts may also change depending on enrollment as well.

Students will follow a similar schedule to the lower school students on campus, taking into account screen and movement breaks and connection time.

Community

 Meadowbrook@Home students will have opportunities to build community and connection with other students. We will achieve this through daily community times with their online cohort (morning meeting) and remoting-in to the school classroom community for other opportunities (celebrating a birthday, sharing of something special, etc.)

Academics

- Classroom teachers will facilitate students' learning, and instruction will be differentiated to meet students' needs.
- Student classes will include language arts, math, social studies, and a "special residency."
- Students can expect to have zoom classes in their cohort, individual asynchronous work, and remoting-in for on-campus classes for instruction.
- We anticipate that our younger students will require support from someone in their home with their at-home asynchronous work.

Home-school partnership

 Communication between school and home in support of our youngest learners will continue to be vital, and in support of this need, Meadowbrook@Home teachers will plan to check in weekly with families 1:1.
