HOW IS DISTANCE LEARNING DIFFERENT FROM THE TULSA VIRTUAL ACADEMY?



100% Virtual

Families can choose to register in our 100% virtual academy. No matter the mode the district chooses to use, families choosing the virtual academy will remain in virtual learning. Students who register for our virtual academy remain connected to their home school.

Adjust with Tulsa Public Schools

Families can choose to stay with their school, and we will adjust our mode of learning together based on safety. Families who choose this option might end up in distance learning, staggered attendance, or in-person instruction.


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TULSA VIRTUAL ACADEMY



Tulsa Virtual Academy is a full-time virtual school offering that will be available for students in the 2020-2021 school year.

STUDENTS WILL:



Receive a device and a hot spot if needed to engage in their learning online;



Have a flexible schedule, offline assignments, and support from certified teachers;



Stay connected with their current school and have the opportunity to return;



Access to the same courses and programming that they would at their current school; and



Participate in virtual activities including music, fine arts, and physical education.

Going deeper on distance learning

What is distance learning?

Students who engage in distance learning with with their current schools will:

- Learn with the teachers and students at their current school
- Adjust between distance, hybrid, and in-person learning with the rest of the district
- Follow their current school's curriculum, programming, and electives/specials
- Retain eligibility for district-sponsored OSSAA activities
- Access social emotional health supports and guidance counseling services
- Receive appropriate services per their IEP or 504 plans
- Have flexibility to complete assignments by creating daily schedules that work for them

Some students who engage in distance learning will:

- Participate in small-group in-person learning
- Be provided transportation to and from school or extracurricular activities

All Tulsa students ages 18 and under will have access to two meals per day.

SAMPLE DAY IN THE LIFE OF AN ELEMENTARY STUDENT IN DISTANCE LEARNING



Day starts at 8:30

Log into Canvas to review learning plan for the day



9:00

Zoom morning meeting with teachers and peers to build social emotional skills



9:30

Complete personalized learning activity on Waterford or Exact Path



10:00

Complete art or music activity (offline) from Canvas



10:30

Snack and brain break/play time



11:00

Core reading instruction with teacher and peers on zoom



12:00

Pick up lunch at one of Tulsa Public Schools' 100+ meal sites and enjoy a brain break



1:00

Watch video on Canvas to complete physical fitness activity offline/play time



1:30

Core math instruction with teacher and peers on zoom



2:30

Complete science or Engage in a social studies lesson on Canvas or personalized learning activity



3:00

Done for the day

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF AN ELEMENTARY STUDENT ENGAGED IN DISTANCE LEARNING*

During distance learning, students will participate in a full day of school engaging with rigorous state-standards aligned curricula on our digital learning platform, Canvas. Daily attendance will be marked by a student engagement in learning and presence in the virtual classroom. Teachers will grade assignments and provide feedback to students and families using email, video conferences, and phone calls.

During distance learning, students will participate in a full day of school engaging with rigorous state-standards aligned curricula on our digital learning platform, Canvas. Classes rotate with live lessons for half of the student's courses each day. Daily attendance will be marked by a student's engagement in learning and presence in the virtual classroom. Teachers will grade assignments and provide feedback to students and families using Canvas, email, video conferences, and phone calls.

Going deeper on the Tulsa Virtual Academy

What is Tulsa Virtual Academy?

Students who register for Tulsa Virtual Academy will:

- Retain enrollment in their current schools
- Learn with Tulsa Virtual Academy teachers and students
- Remain in virtual learning regardless of the district's mode of learning
- Follow the district's state- and national- standards aligned curriculum
- Access social emotional health supports and guidance counseling services
- Receive appropriate services per their IEP or 504 plans
- Participate in virtual electives and specials
- Have the flexibility to create weekly schedules based on their needs

Some students who register for Tulsa Virtual Academy will:

- Continue dual language programming if enrolled in a dual language school
- Participate in AP programs if eligible

All Tulsa student ages 18 and under will have access to two meals per day.

Tulsa Virtual Academy student connection with their brick and mortar school

Students will:

- Retain their seat in their home (or assigned transfer) school if they wish to return
- Have access to their brick and mortar school library
- Be able to take any course available at their brick-and-mortar school in the Virtual Academy
- Be encouraged to maintain friendships with their peers in both schools

Students will not:

- Continue to learn from their homeschool teachers
- Have the guarantee of instructional groupings with their homeschool peers
- Be able to participate in OSSAA sports or activities in their home school
