Instructional Environments

Servite is more than a school - it's a community where young men are formed into faith-filled, intellectual, confident leaders through knowledge, faith, and wisdom. The following plans have been created with a focus on the whole student to enable continued formation of our young men. Servite is prepared to start school with plans for four operational levels (Green, Yellow, Orange, and Red) for the 2020 - 2021 school year with the goal of continuing its commitment to the overall educational and student experience with safety and health at the center of each planning phase.

Instructional Level Red

Full Remote/Online Learning

The Servite Instructional Level Red program offers a rigorous, structured, well-rounded curriculum that engages and challenges students through a variety of learning opportunities. Students will participate in courses led by faculty in live-teaching settings, collaborate virtually in groups/teams, have access to 1:1 assistance during office hours, and complete regular assessments to measure learning and progress.

In a Red Instructional Plan, students will:

- Follow a structured block schedule of even/odd courses each day
- Virtually attend daily classes held by teachers in a “live” synchronous environment
- Use Google Classroom as the main Learning Management System to access links to Zoom/Google Meet sessions and coursework
- Receive assistance and support as needed from teachers during office hours before and after “live” school sessions
- Leverage assistance from Counselors and Instructional Support Services for social-emotional and academic advising
- Follow all deadlines and course assignment due dates
- Report any IT/computer issues immediately to IT at support@servitehs.org
- Attend courses wearing Servite uniform, be neat and groomed, and have all supplies necessary for coursework
- Actively and fully participate in all course activities
- Follow the Servite Virtual Etiquette Policy and conduct themselves as gentlemen at all times
- Demonstrate academic honesty and integrity in every assignment, project, and assessment

Parents can assist their sons in the following ways:

- Ensure your sons are awake each day with ample time to take care of personal grooming, eat a nutritious breakfast, and prepare materials needed for the day
- Ensure your sons have a table/desk, a comfortable chair, reliable internet access, and all school supplies necessary to participate in all online coursework
- Contact Servite’s IT Department with any computer issues as soon as possible to receive assistance remotely and/or schedule appointments at support@servitehs.org
- Communicate with the attendance office in a timely manner when your son is unable to attend classes

Instructional Level Orange

50% On-Campus Hybrid Learning Plan

In the Instructional Level Orange program, students will be assigned to a cohort group that determines which day they attend school in person and which day they learn remotely from home. Courses will alternate daily between cohort groups for on-campus synchronous instruction and off-campus asynchronous remote learning. The Orange schedule allows students to maximize their student experience through participation in the many extra-curricular activities, clubs, and athletic programs that Servite offers by offering the highest engagement allowed by all state and local health restrictions and guidelines.

In an Orange Instructional Plan, students will:

- Attend all 7 periods with their cohort when scheduled to be on-campus
- Complete all posted asynchronous coursework when scheduled to learn remotely from home
- Follow all submission deadlines
- Complete all required coursework on off-days following a structured schedule and deadline calendar
- Follow all Servite uniform and dress code requirements including only solid colored masks when on campus
- Demonstrate academic honesty and integrity in every assignment, project, and assessment

Parents can assist their sons in the following ways:

- Ensure sons are in attendance when scheduled to be on campus
- Expect sons to follow a structured schedule on remote "At Home" learning days
- Communicate with the attendance office in a timely manner when your son is unable to attend classes
- Regularly check Aeries to monitor your son's academic progress
- Ensure sons have a table/desk, a comfortable chair, reliable internet access, and all school supplies necessary to participate in all coursework
- Contact Servite's IT Department with any computer issues as soon as possible to receive assistance remotely and/or schedule appointments at support@servitehs.org

The "At-Home" Cohort will work in an asynchronous format allowing teachers to post lessons that students complete at home. The "At Home" schedule dedicates time from 10:00 am to 2:10 pm for students to complete required assignments and learning objectives. Teachers have transformed their traditional teaching practices to engage students in a variety of learning methodologies conducive to and effective in an online environment.

Instructional Level Orange

50% On-Campus Hybrid Learning Plan

On-Campus Days

When students are scheduled for on-campus learning they will follow a 7-period schedule that has been adjusted to ensure an engaging and effective learning environment while practicing all social distancing and safety protocols.

Students are assigned to a cohort that determines whether they are learning on campus or from home on any given day. For those students who are on campus, their day will unfold as it normally would, but there will be fewer students on campus and in classrooms, out at lunch, or walking in the hallways.

In an Orange Instructional Level, students will be able to learn from a classroom with a teacher and other peers in a synchronous format and be able to experience all the typical student life activities Servite offers in a safe and interactive way.

Instructional Level Yellow

Students on Campus with Reasonable Mitigation

In the Instructional Level Yellow program, Servite will follow the regular bell schedule with specific modifications to allow for appropriate safety measures for everyone on campus. All students attend classes in person, and extra-curricular activities are held on campus with specific mitigation measures in place. Slightly longer passing periods and two lunch periods allows students to safely socially distance between classes and at lunch.

In a Yellow Instructional Plan, students will:

- Attend daily classes
- Follow all Servite uniform and dress code requirements including only solid colored masks when on campus
- Practice all required safety mitigation measures
- Demonstrate academic honesty and integrity in every assignment, project, and assessment

Parents can assist their sons in the following ways:

- Ensure your son attends class daily
- Communicate with attendance office
- Keep your son home if he shows any symptoms of illness
- Ensure sons have a dedicated workspace, reliable internet access, and all necessary materials to complete coursework

Health & Safety

The health and safety of our students, faculty, and staff are extremely important to us. In developing our back to school plans, we have relied on guidelines from the California Department of Public Health and the CDC as well as the knowledge and experience of healthcare professionals to ensure the Servite campus is a healthy, safe, and secure environment. While guidance related to the prevention and treatment of COVID-19 continues to evolve, we are confident in our ability to deliver an excellent, adaptable education. The following protocols have been implemented to ensure the health and safety of our faculty, staff, and students including making modifications to daily schedules, limiting gatherings and events, and establishing a family-school partnership for a healthy community.

Keeping Servite a Healthy and Safe School

When all students, faculty, staff, and visitors arrive on campus they will:

- Wear masks at all times
- Have temperatures taken
- Be potentially screened for COVID-19 symptoms

Monitor Symptoms

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range reported symptoms – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Servite and Family Partnership

Servite will train and educate our faculty and staff on:

- Recognition of COVID-19 symptoms
- What to do if a student exhibits symptoms
- Disinfecting work areas
- The importance of social distancing
- Promoting healthy hygiene practices
- Frequent hand-washing

Servite will also:

- Provide a full-time registered nurse as Director of Health Services
- Provide a Student Health Center to isolate anyone who becomes sick during the school day
- Conduct daily temperature checks and basic health screening when students, faculty, staff, and visitors arrive on campus
- Limit visitors to campus to the degree possible
- Visitors who must come to campus will follow the health screening and safety protocols
- Clean and sanitize the campus regularly
- Regularly monitor health data and guidelines

Parents/Guardians shall agree to the following:

- Conduct daily visual health checks of your son and take his temperature before he comes to campus.
- Please keep your student home if he exhibits any of the following symptoms:
 - Exhibits a fever of 100.4 or greater
 - States he has been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or a known exposure
 - Experiences any COVID 19 symptoms that are not related to allergies, asthma or another underlying medical condition

Any student on campus who presents with a fever and/or COVID-19 symptoms will be isolated from others in our newly established Student Health Center and monitored until he is picked up. All related students or faculty/staff members living in the same house will also be sent home. All families will follow the guidelines in the 2020-2021 Parent/Student Handbook and sign the commitment signature form during the information verification process. Students or faculty/staff with a confirmed case of COVID-19 may return to school after they have obtained a note from their physician allowing their return, evidence of a negative COVID-19 test, or have self-isolated for at least 10 days from the onset of symptoms and after being fever-free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications.

Updates and revisions to these plans and protocols will be based on the most current health guidelines as they become available.

Health & Safety



Servite facilities and maintenance staff have received additional training on cleaning and disinfecting protocols since the start of the COVID-19 crisis, and training will be ongoing. Additionally, a comprehensive audit was conducted of our campus by an outside company to identify any necessary updates related to COVID-19. The audit results were extremely positive, as Servite already had several recommended protocols in place, such as touchless faucets and plentiful touchless hand sanitizing dispensers.



Additional Safety Measures and Precautions

- Conversion of one classroom to a Student Health Center
- Purchase of 6 movable hand sanitizing stations
- Purchase of sanitizing spray dispensers that can quickly and efficiently sanitize large areas such as lunch tables, theater seats, or library
- Purchase and installation of additional touchless hand sanitizer dispensers for all classrooms
- More frequent cleaning of campus and monitoring of hygiene supplies during the school day
- Evaluation of individual classrooms and reconfiguration to increase social distancing, including removal of table seating and replacement with individual desks
- Development of policies and daily checklists for classrooms, common areas, etc. to ensure consistent and regular cleaning processes
- Purchase of multiple forms of directional signage to ensure one-way traffic to mitigate crowding

Formation

Formation is the heart of Servite's approach to education by recognizing that we are all here to help our students be the unique men God created them to be. The Formation Directors will continue to form students by grade level through monthly meetings in theology classes and individual student outreach in order to maintain high trust relationships. Faculty and staff will continue their formation efforts both in and out of the classroom, challenging their students to develop virtue and goodness as they learn and grow physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually. As always, formation, in collaboration with parents and guardians, will develop a school environment that is devoted to the Blessed Mother who ultimately leads us to Christ. Counseling Information

Servite Counselors continue to provide personal, social, academic, and college guidance through the 2020 – 2021 school year. A personal counselor is available to students as needed by referral. Virtual group sessions with counselors and individual parent/student appointments are available. Servite and its sister school, Rosary Academy, will be working together to plan workshops and college visits in a virtual setting. Our counselors are accessible daily to provide the students and parents the support they need to successfully navigate the high school process.
