
How To Access Your Schedule

- 1. Student schedules can be viewed by first logging into the LSCHS Student Portal. If students encounter difficulty logging into the portal, they should email support@lschs.org for assistance.
- 2. After logged in, students should click on the "Student Quicklinks" menu located on the left-hand side of the screen. Next, click on Student Schedule.



3. The student schedule should then become visible.



Students will notice that the school schedule looks very different than their schedules in years past. This is a result of the new master schedule the school will be operating on for the 20-21 school year. Please be aware that students will receive detailed explanations and instructions for how to read and follow their schedule during orientation days the 1st week of classes.

Important Information Regarding Your Schedule

The schedule you received is the best combination of core courses (those you must take) and the elective courses you have chosen.

If you received an elective course that you did not choose, it is either because that elective did not fit in your schedule (based on the other core courses you chose) or, you did not select enough credits during registration in the spring, thus another course(s) was added.

Due to the size and complexity of the school schedule, La Salle cannot entertain, nor honor requests for specific class periods, lunch times, or teachers.

When the school is operating in a hybrid format, the number of students in the "Blue" and "Gold" group have to be as evenly balanced as possible within each individual class period to ensure compliance with social distancing. Ultimately, this means that the entire master schedule has been constructed very precisely and students will not have an option to change the classes they selected (and that were scheduled for them) after schedules are released in August.
