



How To Access Your Schedule

- 1. Student schedules can be viewed by first logging into the LSCHS Student Portal. If students encounter difficulty logging into the portal, they should email support@lschs.org for assistance.
- 2. After logged in, students should click on the "Student Quicklinks" menu located on the left-hand side of the screen. Next, click on Student Schedule.



3. The student schedule should then become visible.



Students will receive detailed explanations and instructions for how to read and follow their schedule during orientation days the 1st week of classes.

Open LMS
