Preschool Clothing

A complete change of clothing is requested to be at the Preschool at all times (and easy to take off for toileting purposes). Comfortable play shoes with closed toes are most appropriate; tennis shoes are best. Open sandals expose the child to unnecessary injury and are prone to slips, splinters and stubbed toes.

Preschool Dropoff/ Pickup

Drop-off

Begins at 8:00 a.m. Children play with their friends and teachers allowing a gentle transition into class time which starts at 9:00 a.m. Please follow the instructions given by your child's classroom teacher. Some classes will start inside the classroom and others may begin their morning connections on the outside play yard. We will monitor and adjust during inclement weather.


Pickup

Class programming ends at 3:15 p.m. however, there are additional opportunities to continue engaged learning until 5:15 p.m..

Our licensed facility requires that we provide a quiet resting space and time for all children who are attending programs until 5:15 p.m..

Parents must park and pick up their students by signing them out with the teacher. Please remember to bring identification when picking up preschool students.

Elementary Dropoff/ Pickup


Drop-off

Begins at **7:30 a.m.** until classes commence at **8:15 a.m.** If late, please park and walk your student into the Front Office to sign them in at the front desk.

Pickup

Begins at different times for different grade levels (K-1st at 2:45 p.m., 2nd-3rd at 3:00 p.m., 4th-6th at 3:15 p.m.). After School Care is available for K-6 students until 5:30 p.m. Late parents are charged \$45 for every fraction of 15 minutes beyond designated pick-up time. In September, please remember to place the placard provided by your child's teacher on the dashboard of your car. If you need to update a last minute change in who is picking up your child on the day of, email pickup@SJSLA.org before noon on that day.

()rdering Hot Lunch

The hot lunch program runs five days a week (with the exception of In-N-Out Burger days, field trips and other special occasions). Parents may purchase hot lunch for their children on a daily basis or intermittently. Additionally we also depend on parents volunteers to distribute lunch!

Parents order and pay for lunches directly through our hot lunch provider, Freshlunches. More information and sample menus are available on their website: freshlunches.com

Parents will receive a registration link in the summer to get started with lunch meal planning. You will be able to select meals up to a month in advance. Tastetested by kids and approved by parents, Freshlunches helps put a healthy smile on parents' and kids' faces alike.

Students not participating in the hot lunch program need to bring lunch from home. Parents are asked not to bring fast food, soda, glass containers, or any food that must be microwaved by St. James' staff. We will not refrigerate or heat items from home. We encourage the use of recyclable plastic containers for food and drinks.

If a students forgets lunch, the school will provide a lunch and the family will be invoiced by the Business Office.

Health

We have partnered with Magnus Health to collect, store, and manage all your child's health information in one location, per California state law. Ultimately, this online solution helps us save time by streamlining communication with parents and keeps us prepared in the event of an emergency. With Magnus Health, we can provide more efficient and consistent health care services to your child.

Excellence Through Joy

Entering its third year, Beyond School is St. James' tuition-inclusive enrichment program, provided both in the morning before classes and in the afternoons and early evenings. Open to all students, Beyond School! is optional. In the preschool, students may participate in drama classes, Spanish, cooking, story-telling and Yoga.

In K-6, all of the above are also offered as well as Latin and Spanish (in addition to our school day curriculum), coding, newspaper, podcasting, visual arts studio, orchestra, ISEE test prep (for middle school), creative writing, reading comprehension and other wonderful offerings.

An Episcopal Identity

Celebrating God's Presence in Everyone

At St. James', our Episcopal Identity starts and ends with inclusion, tolerance and welcome. As our mission statement explains, we strive to instill in our students respect for all of God's creation. That cornerstone of our value system is exemplified in a weekly chapel where we praise God through music and hear teachings framed to coach children in grace, curiosity, compassion, kindness and respect for all human beings. Many Faiths—our new family affinity group for families who work with the school to ensure that our Episcopal identity is always inclusive, welcoming and encouraging of all faiths is a wonderful way for new families to engage with St. James'.

The Civil Society Institute

We are in the business of building engaged and compassionate global citizens.

Celebrating its third year, the Civil Society Institute is our umbrella program for our efforts to inculcate in our students an enthusiasm for the greater marketplace of ideas and a confidence and desire to apply the body politic to making the world a better place. The Institute provides support for our student programs, such as leadership (our student council), our student newspaper/ podcasting, the Husky Howl, and our new green team, where students partner with teachers and staff to "green" St. James'.

Importantly, our school's service learning program is part of the institute and a key way in which our students give back to make the world a better place. Also, through the institute, we have the Civil Society Series, a rich and wonderful compilation of speakers who dialogue with students about what it means to be a global citizen and how we can make our complicated world a better place. The school is proud to partner with our Parents Association in the Institute, interested new families can sign up to join the PA's speakers bureau committee which identifies excellent speakers and facilitators to work with the St. James' community on issues of ethics, service, compassion and political activism.

Service Learning

Our children will inherit a complicated but beautiful world.

Our school's service learning program—one of the only programs of its kind in a Los Angeles' elementary school—is grounded in helping our students to understand poverty in an age appropriate and meaningful way. The program is primarily designed for students to regularly support the parish food programs, which each year serve over 5,000 meals through the soup kitchen and operate a weekly food bank that provides groceries to several hundred residents of Koreatown. All grade levels, from our Dolphins up through sixth grade engage in service-learning related to the parish food ministries, primarily through drives and making cards and meal kits for the unhoused and hungry. Additionally, 3rd-6th graders have a monthly class in the parish food pantry to help sort inventory and organize the pantry; 5th-6th graders also provide support in meal prep and distribution for the weekly soup kitchen.

Matriculation

A Multi-Year Learning Approach

We are so glad that your family is part of our community. Our teaching philosophy blends use of structure as a tool to help students' find their voice while regularly inspiring a sense of wonder and joy in the classroom—and always affirming that students must be seen, heard and valued at all times. We are one of the few schools to dedicate a full-time position to working with families on designing an appropriate strategy for interpreting standardized test scores and assessments and also building a multi-year approach to matriculation. Beginning in 3rd grade, all families are encouraged to meet with either the Assistant Head of School or our Associate Director of Admission for Middle School Matriculation to build a learning plan informed by the test scores. Importantly, this approach is fully in concert with the rich and incredible teaching that takes place at each grade level, curated by teachers who are truly called to this work to educate your child.
