BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING AUGUST 11, 2020

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- Governor Lamont and Commissioner of Education require districts to develop a reopening plan with three models and asserts schools will reopen all in person
 - All students in person
 - Hybrid Model—Assigning students into cohorts
 - Full Distance Learning
- MPS Reopening Plan submitted to CSDE on July 24
- Governor and Commissioner of Education held daily press briefing on July 27 that districts have flexibility to open all in person or hybrid model
- Significant number of addendums to the state document and update guidance from CSDE the end of July to present
- Reopening details continue to evolve with updated information and guidance

WHY IS MPS REOPENING IN THE HYBRID MODEL?

- CT reopened successfully with a phase-in process
- This model was selected to attend to the safety concerns of students, faculty and staff
- To promote emotional well-being of students
- To allow students, faculty and staff to become familiar and comfortable with new safety protocols and routines
- To introduce and train students on technology platforms utilized in school and in distance learning
- The hybrid model is a regional approach

HYBRID SCHEDULE: TWO GROUPS

Hybrid Model Places students into two Groups or Cohorts, Group A and Group B.

- This adjustment will ensure each group
 - has the opportunity to be in session for the full day and become familiar with safety protocols, classroom routines and new structures and/or equipment, i.e., desk shields, tents
- Schools will be cleaned and disinfected thoroughly every day in accordance with guidelines from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and CT Department of Public Health

MPS REOPENING CHALLENGES

- Creating adequate classroom space for Social Distancing of 6 feet between student to student desks and teacher to student desks, where feasible
 - Ease congestion in hallways

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- Ensure one-way traffic in and out of classrooms, where feasible
- Redesigning appropriate spaces for lunch with 6 feet of social distancing or with the use of personal desk shields
- Maximizing outdoor space when possible

PREPARATIONS FOR REOPENING

- Working with contractors to ensure heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems are operating properly
- Increased bandwidth
- Ordered Chromebooks to provide 1 to 1 devices (shipping date is dependent on supply chain)
- Initial distribution of Chromebooks on hand will be to families with no devices
- Removed non-essential classroom furniture
- Blending tables and desks in K-2 classrooms for individual seating and social distancing
- Renting tents for outdoor instructional activities and/or mask breaks

- Identify child care resources to assist families
- Identify families in need of Chromebooks
