Hello Parkland Elementary Parents/Guardians,

The purpose of this communication is to share that, after much deliberation, Parkland must make a change to our plan to provide elementary students with a 5-day face-to-face learning program when school opens on August 31st. Instead, we will implement a Hybrid Plan that will mirror our Secondary School Hybrid Plan and consist of face-to-face learning for half of our students, two days each week, and eLearning the other three days (note schedule below). We will maintain our 100% Parkland Online Learning Plan. Both the Hybrid Plan and Parkland Online Program will be taught by Parkland teachers.

\* During weeks that we experience a holiday, the face-to-face calendar will be adjusted to maximize in-person instruction – see <u>Hybrid Calendar</u>.

## What does this mean for your student?

If you committed to the 5-day face-to-face model, we will automatically shift your child to the Hybrid Plan and keep the transportation method that you have requested intact. If you committed to Parkland Online with a Parkland teacher, your child will remain online for 100% online instruction.

We also understand this adjustment may result in some families wanting to change the instructional model or mode of transportation that was previously chosen. If you desire to change your selection, you MUST email your school principal by 5 PM on Sunday, August 16, 2020 (see list of each school principal email address below). Please send one email per child to the correct building he/she will attend for the 2020-2021 school year and include details about whether you are changing your learning model request, your transportation request, or both.

## **Reasons for the Change**

On August 10th, we received new guidance from the Pennsylvania Department of Education and Pennsylvania Department of Health, which indicates Lehigh County as having a moderate level of community transmission of the virus. The chart below recommends a Blended (Hybrid) or Fully Remote Learning Model for all Lehigh County Schools based upon this designation.

If fewer than 10 new cases are reported in a county in the most recent 7-day reporting period, the county will automatically qualify as exhibiting a low level of community transmission. Lehigh County numbers below appear in <b>RED</b> below. For current information, <u>click here</u> .

Additionally, after analyzing our data and our current available staff, it became clear that a Hybrid Instructional Model would strengthen our ability to implement the health and safety procedures identified in the Parkland School District Health and Safety Plan regarding class size and social distancing requirements.
