Dear Parents/Carers,

Mr Gowney-Hedges will be reviewing the transition to 'Teams' with students in the next fortnight and continuing to iron out any teething problems experienced.



It's the start of the countdown to final exams for a good number of year groups but notably our Year 11 and Year 13 students are really focusing on the job at hand. Year 11 received their mock exam results and grades this week and now have a good understanding of what they need to do to get their desired outcomes in the summer. Staff at the school have been incredibly proud of the approach taken towards mocks by this year group; they have taken great strides in their progress since the end of year 10. There is still more to do as courses come to a close and revision gets underway; everyone at Kineton will support them through the next few months in 'achieving their personal best'.

A measure of the aspirational culture now embedded in our Sixth Form is the rise in applications to higher education and apprenticeships of our Year 13 cohort. Over 72% of our Year 13 have applied for university and many of these are to Russell Group universities including Oxford and Cambridge. The Sixth Form team will work closely with all of them to ensure they are able to enter the further education, apprenticeships or employment of their choice this year. We continue this work well after the results have been published.

We have a book focus next week as our annual book fair takes place. Year 7 students have worked extremely hard to design posters advertising the event; some of the entries can be seen below. Well done Year 7!

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

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

Department for Education statistics show that students with 100% attendance are 2.2 times more likely to achieve 5+ GCSEs at 9-5 including English and Maths than pupils with lower than 90% attendance. Every day and every lesson matters!

'We know parents try wherever possible to not have medical appointments during the school day in order to avoid missed lesson time and a reduction in school attendance. However we appreciate this is not always avoidable, therefore please try to book appointments using student social times, such as between 10.30-12.30am mark which will use break and lunchtime and therefore minimises lost lesson times. This can ensure that students are in school for the other 4 lessons and only missing part of one lesson, rather than loosing morning or afternoon lessons. Thank you for your on-going support with this.'

Student Absence Procedure

If your child is unwell and cannot attend school please call the 24 hour Absence Line on 01926 645 611 before 8.50am, stating their name and form, your name and the reason. This must be done for each day they will be absent.

If your child is unable to attend school for any reason other than illness, planned or emergency (part day, full day or multiple days), please always complete a leave of absence form and send it by email to enquiries@kinetonhighschool.org.uk This form should - we all need to play our part. be used for all appointments (medical, dental, music exams or external sporting activities), holiday requests, religious observance dates and all other reasons or circumstances where your child will be absent from school.

Failure to make an application for leave in advance can also result in a Fixed Penalty Notice being issued to the arrangements. parent(s).

Unauthorised Absence

There are times when children are absent for reasons, which are not permitted by law. Examples of unauthorised absence are parental illness, term time . holidays or a family day out. Where there is no explanation for an absence or where the explanation or reason for the absence is considered unsatisfactory absence will be recorded as 'unauthorised'. Unauthorised Absences have to be reported to the Local Authority. The Attendance Compliance Enforcement Team may contact you where unauthorised absence continues to be a problem. Unauthorised absence could result in a Fixed Penalty Fine or other legal action. We are always concerned about the amount of school time pupils miss as a result of term time leave. There is no entitlement to time off during term time. Leave of absence is only granted in The full Attendance policy can be found under exceptional circumstances at the discretion of the Headteacher in accordance with the school policy as agreed by the governing body.

We greatly appreciate parental support to reduce the total amount of days lost due to holidays. We are committed to working in partnership with you to enable your child to reach their academic targets and to support their social development. For this to happen we need to keep individual attendance as high as possible

It is our policy:

- Only in an exceptional circumstance will term time leave be allowed. Parents/Carers wishing to apply for leave of absence need to fill in an application form well in advance and before booking tickets or making travel
- If term time leave is taken without prior permission from the school, the absence will be unauthorised and you may be liable for a fixed-penalty fine or other legal action.
- Please remember that absence for whatever reason disadvantages a child by creating gaps in his/her learning. A good understanding of the work and good progress can only take place when the child is in the classroom regularly and on time.

If you think you have exceptional circumstances please talk to us without delay and before arrangements are entered into or money committed. If exceptional circumstances are accepted the Headteacher will determine how much absence will be authorised. Each application for a leave of absence will be considered on a case by case basis and on its own merits.

Leave of Absence During Term Time 2019-20



The Supreme Court recently reached a decision in the Where applications for leave of absence are made in case of Platt v Isle of Wight Council which has clarified the law on unauthorised leave, including holidays, during term time.
