DAILY SCHEDULE – School will start at 7:40 AM and will end at 2:30 PM. Morning LCTI students will attend homeroom at Parkland High School prior to receiving a bus transfer to LCTI.

LATEX REMINDER – Several students at PHS have severe airborne Latex allergies. To protect these students, PHS is a "Latex Free" Environment. Please do not send items containing Latex (especially balloons) to the school.

LATE ACTIVITY BUS REMINDER – The school district provides one late activity bus run each school day. The activity bus will depart from the back of the D-wing at 4:20 PM on the days students are in school. Only students engaged in school sponsored and supervised activities are eligible to use the activity bus. Students staying at PHS for activities beyond 4:20 PM must arrange for transportation home.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parents:

I hope you are enjoying a wonderful summer with family and friends as this pandemic has certainly tested the resolve of everyone. The 2020-2021 school year will soon be upon us, bringing forth challenges none of us have experienced in the public school system. As a parent who is sending his three sons to school, I know my first concern is the safety of my children and I'm sure you share those same concerns.

With that in mind, let me share a bit about what school will look like. Safety is paramount and practically everywhere students look they will see safety guidelines in effect or reminders of them. For example, students will see students and staff wearing face coverings, sanitizing stations visible in all areas of the building, hallways lined with tape noting social distancing protocols, hallway signs directing students into one-way traffic patterns, and staff members visibly enforcing these safety precautions. Prior to the start of school, a video will be shared with students so they can acclimate to these new safety driven expectations. Maybe most importantly, the student population on a given day will be approximately 1,000 students – or about 1/3 of our normal population – creating a less dense situation where students can pass through the hallways and eat lunch with plenty of personal space. These are just some of the safety measures we are instituting this year, but if you are looking for greater details the secondary building plan is included in the <u>School</u> <u>District Health and Safety Plan</u>. We understand that little to no learning will occur in an environment where students do not feel safe so we are committed to safety protocols so students can resume the Parkland education we all believe in!

Most importantly, parents, we need your cooperation and commitment to daily completion of the **Student Wellness Form** in partnership with school efforts to maintain a safe learning environment for students and staff. If you check "yes" to any of the questions on the Student Wellness Form, please keep your child home and you will be contacted by a school nurse to discuss your concerns. Opening schools in this environment is a shared commitment by parents and school. By working together we hope to remain in session as long as possible this year. (Note: a link to the Student Wellness Form will be sent in a separate communication.)

As with every start to school, Parkland has some new faculty members for the upcoming school year. Joining our teaching staff will be: Ronald Bealer (Technology & Engineering), Nia Fratrik (Spanish), Jill Hammer (Spanish), Kaitlin Heintzelman (Biology), Kelly Hess (French and Social Studies), Stephanie Knowlton (Special Education), Jacqueline Miller (Physics), Lee Rizzotto (Guidance Counselor), and Angela Turczyn (Mathematics). I am sure these professionals will blend in well with Parkland High School's outstanding team of educators.

Parkland is proud of our very diverse student body and the climate it expects all students to maintain so all students are safe and secure in their learning. Our students overwhelmingly demonstrate exemplary behavior but in today's political climate it is a good time to discuss school appropriate conversation topics with your child, including how to best respond to situations where inappropriate dialogue may be shared. Please talk with your child so he/she understands that speech which is divisive or destructive regarding race, color, religion, ethnicity, sexuality, gender, age or handicap/disability will result in swift and severe disciplinary consequences. I'd like to thank you in advance for your cooperation on this topic as we all agree that students who feel safe and secure are most likely to be academically successful.

I would just like to remind everyone that we are presenting a virtual 9th Grade Parent Orientation on Monday, August 31. You will receive directions to the 9th Grade Parent Orientation presentation on August 31. On Tuesday, September 8, PHS will present its virtual Open House so look for a communication arriving September 8 with directions to the presentation.

The goal of this monthly newsletter is to keep parents and students informed of high school events and other critical information. The information in this newsletter is integral to your child's success so please read its contents regularly and review it with your student. The amount of information might be overwhelming at times, but should you have any questions please contact the high school so our staff can assist you.

KEY ITEMS FOR RETURNING TO SCHOOL

- ⇒ Students should complete the Student Wellness Form EVERY DAY before entering the school building. A link to this form will be sent in a separate communication.
- \Rightarrow Students should bring a backpack with them each day they attend school. No lockers will be in use.
- ⇒ Students should have their Chromebook fully charged every day they come to school. No charging stations will be available.
- ⇒ Students should always have their School ID with them when they come to school. The PHS Cafeteria is now cashless, and the student's school ID will be used for payments.
- ⇒ Parents should deposit money in their student's <u>MySchoolBucks.com</u> account, or deliver a check (made payable to PSD Cafeteria) to the Food Services office at 2219 N. Cedar Crest Boulevard, Allentown, PA 18104. Please allow time for delivery if using the U.S. Postal Service.

COLLEGE-BOUND SENIORS

Seniors must complete a transcript release form prior to submitting college applications to the Counseling Office. Students and parents (if the student is under 18 years of

age) must sign this form giving PHS permission to release official academic records to colleges/universities. Students indicate on the form whether SAT and ACT scores are to be removed from

the high school transcript prior to processing college applications. If a college is requesting a counselor recommendation, the student must complete a recommendation profile form highlighting individual achievements during the past four years.

Seniors need to remember to contact teachers early in the school year if they wish to request a teacher recommendation. A copy of the recommendation profile can be helpful to teachers when preparing student recommendations.

Seniors need to remember that ten school days are required to process college applications. Please pay close attention to application deadline dates. Submit your materials as early as possible to the Counseling Office. Seniors need to inform their counselor if they are processing an application online. Applications processed through online delivery systems (Common App or Coalition App) require official transcripts and secondary school information. In order to ensure timely processing of your online applications, communication with your counselor is vitally important.

AP CLASSES

Students will now need to register for Advanced Placement exams using an online portal system through College Board's website. Teachers will be distributing the link and access code to all AP students starting in mid-September.

Students will need to know their College Board username and password. If they do not have an account, one will need to be created. Once logged in, students will use the access code to join their AP class(es). On the portal they will have access to many beneficial resources to assist them in the course. Additionally, they will have to indicate if they are taking the AP

exam. All AP students will need to indicate their exam status sometime in early November. Students taking the exam must pay a fee, but they cannot use the portal to pay. No test will be ordered for a student indicating "yes" to the exam without the fee having been paid. Information regarding fee waivers is available to those students and families experiencing financial hardship. A processing fee will be charged for each exam ordered from the College Board but cancelled by the student. The 2020-2021 Advanced Placement Bulletins will be available in the Counseling Office in January. COLLEGE ADMISSIONS TESTING

Registration procedures for the 2020-2021 SAT Reasoning Test and SAT Subject Tests are

posted online at the College Board website, <u>www.sat.org/register</u>. The College Board requires a student photo as part of the registration process and late registration options have changed. The above changes are all part of enhanced security regulations put in place by the College Board. Due to COVID-19, all SAT test dates are subject to change.

COUNSELING CORNER

ASVAB TESTING

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) will be offered at PHS in late September.

The date will be announced when it is secured, but is subject to change due to COVID-19. The ASVAB is an excellent opportunity for juniors and seniors to complete a career aptitude test that examines different academic, mechanical and technical areas. Students interested in a military career must take this three-hour exam. The exam is free of charge and administered by military testing personnel at the high school; however, there is no obligation to meet with military recruiters if a student completes the test. Registration for the ASVAB test will take place in the Counseling Office during the first few weeks of school.

STUDENT SCHEDULES

Student schedules are currently being completed by the counseling staff and will be made available the first day of school. If a student is considering a schedule change,

request forms will be available on the <u>PHS website</u>. Schedule change policies and procedures can be referenced in the PHS Registration Information and Course Descriptions Book.

DID YOU MOVE? If a student has moved over the summer to a new residence within the Parkland School District, proof of residency (2 forms) must be

presented to the Counseling Office as soon as possible. Please call if you have any questions regarding this procedure.

INFORMATION FROM THE HEALTH ROOM

The start of this school year will be different than any other we have experienced, but the goal of our nurses and Health Room staff remains to maintain the health, safety and wellness of every student to ensure success in the classroom.



MEDICATIONS

All medication, prescription and nonprescription, must be brought to the school by a parent and/or guardian along with the accompanying forms from the physician at the start of each school year or as your child requires medication to be administered during school hours.

Emergency Medications (epinephrine auto injectors and asthma inhalers) may be carried by your student during the school day if the physician indicates this on the Medication Form. Carrying emergency medications at the high school level is encouraged because of the many activities the students are involved in.

All medications, prescription and nonprescription will continue to require a doctor's order and the completion of the Medication Administration Consent and Licensed Prescriber form to be administered during school hours. Forms are available for download on the <u>PHS website</u>.

Please see the medication policy on the website for complete information.

Please complete the Wellness Form for each of your student(s) every morning prior to coming to school. For information regarding the Coronavirus (COVID-19), please refer to the Parkland School District website.

All eleventh grade students, as mandated by the State, need to have a physical examination. This is best done by your family physician but may be done by the School Physician if you choose. A sport physical for a PIAA high school sport may be used to complete this requirement. The form for the school physical you receive in the mail is the preferable paperwork to be completed. However, copies of the physical forms used for the driver's permit are accepted for the student's school physical. Completed forms should be placed in an envelope

marked "Health Room" and turned in at the Main Office to be placed in the Health Room mailbox. Please notify the Health Room as to how you plan on completing this requirement.

The required immunization deadline for twelfth grade students for their 2nd dose of meningococcal vaccine (MCV) at age 16 or older has been extended to **October 31, 2020**. Students need to show proof of this immunization to the Health Room staff on or before October 31, 2020 or risk exclusion.

GUIDELINES FOR STAYING HEALTHY

The Health Room Staff would like to remind you of some guidelines to stay healthy and decrease the spread of illness during this school year. If your student, in the morning prior to school is experiencing the following symptoms, please do not send him/her to school even if your student has a test or sporting event:

- fever of 100 degrees or more
- vomiting

JUNIORS

- diarrhea
- severe head cold, persistent cough or severe sore throat

It is advised that a student should be fever free for 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medications, before returning to school.

DRIVER'S EDUCATION

WELCOME SOPHOMORE STUDENTS

Obtaining your learner's permit and driver's license is an exciting time, but one that requires safe and sound practices.

CLASSROOM THEORY COURSE

Parkland School District provides a comprehensive classroom theory course which will help your student become a good, safe and defensive driver. It traditionally consists of four classroom periods of instruction each 6-day cycle for one semester (either fall or spring). This year the delivery of the curriculum will be revised to include the same

theory principals using a hybrid model, including classroom instruction, Zoom meetings, and Screencast-O-Matic lessons managed through Schoology.

BEHIND-THE-WHEEL TRAINING PROGRAM

An optional 6-hour Behind-the-Wheel (BTW) training program is available through the Carbon Lehigh Intermediate Unit 21 (CLIU-21). Students who successfully complete this program will be eligible to take their driver's license test at Parkland High School, eliminating the need to make an appointment at the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV).

ANSWERS TO FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- Students are eligible to obtain their Pennsylvania learner's permit ON or any day after their 16th birthday.
- Learner's permits are ONLY issued through the DMV.
 Pennsylvania driving manuals are available online in PDF format along with the permit application on the



DMV website. The DMV is open Tuesday through Saturday from 8:30 AM to 4:15 PM. A new office is now open at 1710 Hoover Avenue, Allentown, PA 18109 in addition to the existing Airport Road facility.

• The classroom theory portion is NOT required to obtain your learner's permit but IS REQUIRED for the BTW course.

An alternative to the classroom theory course is an online course offered through the CLIU-21. Students and parents **must** save the original certificate of completion and submit a copy of it to the Counseling Office upon completion. (Please note that the in-school classroom theory course includes guest speakers/presenters, driving simulators and

demonstrations not included in the online course).

- All students are required to complete a minimum of 65 hours of supervised driving during the 6-month practice period once they obtain their learner's permit. The 65 hours is to include 50 hours of daytime driving, 10 hours of nighttime driving and 5 hours of driving in inclement weather. The 6 hours of BTW instruction can be included in this total.

Fall SAT Prep

Parkland High School will be offering a virtual Fall SAT Prep class to prepare students for the SAT Exam on **Saturday**, **November 7**, **2020**.

This virtual course will help students prepare for the verbal section of the SAT by providing practice, test taking strategies, and test simulation in the areas of critical reading, evidence based writing and contextual vocabulary.
