



How should I take this scripture to heart? What is the Lord calling me to do now that will be challenging, and only accomplished by the power of His grace?



COVID-19 UPDATE Dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass has been extended to all faithful through Sunday, November 22, 2020.

In light of the continued spread of the Coronavirus in southeast Michigan and the impossibility for parishes to safely accommodate all Catholics for Mass on Sundays, Archbishop Vigneron has extended **the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on** Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation for all the faithful in the Archdiocese of Detroit, as well as for all travelers during their time within the territory of the Archdiocese of Detroit, until Monday, November 23, 2020.

While the dispensation from the grave obligation to attend Sunday Mass is in effect, all baptized Catholics are reminded of the grave necessity they have to keep holy the Lord's Day.

Archbishop Vigneron wrote a pastoral note entitled "The Day of the Lord" little more than one year ago calling to mind this important spiritual obligation. As the day of the Resurrection of our Lord, Christians from the earliest days set Sunday apart as a day unlike others. When it is not possible to participate in person in the Sacrifice of the Mass, it is vitally important for every member of the Catholic Church to nourish his or her soul during these days. This means cultivating a prayer life in their homes, reading Sacred Scripture – especially the prescribed readings for the Sunday Mass – and making Christ the center of one's home and being his disciple the central identity of one's life. It also means continuing to understand Sunday as a day set apart for the Lord. This means activities on Sunday should be different from the pursuits of the rest of the week. Prayer and time for God, time for family, and works of charity should be central to a Catholic's Sunday.

Bird's Eye View with Fr. Pellican



To the left of my office desk hangs a small painting of the Blessed Mother tenderly holding the child Jesus. It was painted by an old Italian priest, Fr. Germano. It's not a particularly striking work, but to me has great significance.

Among other things, Fr. Germano was legally blind. I used to serve daily Mass for him at a small shrine in Grass Lake, the Pious union of St. Joseph. The prayers were printed out for him in large print, about a sentence per page. Father would peer at them through his thick glasses, also holding a big magnifying lens over them. Someone would still have to stand next to him and whisper the prayers he didn't know by heart. But he still said Mass each day, and was still so obviously in love with his priesthood.

The chapel we had Mass in, looks from the outside like a barn, because that's what it originally was. Fr. Germano, a Guanellan Father, came to the U.S. convinced that God wanted him to build a chapel. Most people thought he was crazy when he bought an old barn in the middle of a muddy field, but today, there stands not only a chapel, but a beautiful Lourdes grotto, outdoor stations, and a massive crucifix and altar for outdoor Mass.

Fr. Germano was not only an inspiration for me to consider the priesthood, he was above all a shining example of abandonment to God's loving providence. When confronted with difficulties great or small he never wavered. The words always on his lips were: "God will provide." And God did provide. God provided him with the help and resources to transform an old barn into a beautiful chapel. He provided him with the desire to say Mass and continue to paint, although he was blind, and most of all God provided him with a deep and lasting joy to match his deep and lasting trust. In the midst of great uncertainty he trusted that God would provide - like the Blessed Mother, who trusted that God would provide in the face of an unexpected pregnancy. I share Father's story today because his unshakeable trust in Divine Providence is something, I believe, worth imitating.

PHASE 1: A PLAN FOR Safely RETURNING TO MASS

Dear parishioners - It is with joy in our hearts that we share Divine Child resumed public Masses on Tuesday, May 19, 2020. In alignment with the liturgical directives issued by Archbishop Allen Vigneron, we are committed to providing a safe and clean environment for the faithful to worship our Lord. The health of our parishioners is of utmost importance to us and new procedures and protocols have been put in place to ensure this. Please review the information below regarding how Mass will work and the role we all play in keeping each other safe. Thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we work through our new "normal" together. Note: Dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass is granted to all faithful through Sunday, Sept. 6, 2020. Let us keep each other in our prayers. - Fr. Bob McCabe

SECTION 1: WHO SHOULD ATTEND MASS

According to the Archbishop's directives, parish churches are <u>not</u> to exceed **25% of their total capacity** at one time that's **375 parishioners** at Divine Child. This means we must count the number of attendees at each Mass, and we must turn attendees away when we reach capacity. We believe all people who desire to worship our Lord should have the ability to do so. *See Section 2 for how we are working to ensure all can worship.*

SECTION 2: SCHEDULE OF MASSES

SIGN UP FOR TEXT ALERTS!

To receive real-time text messages regarding when the church reaches its maximum capacity and cancellations of outdoor Masses due to weather, simply text the keyword DivineChild to 84576. **INDOOR MASSES** We are returning to our normal weekday and weekend Mass schedule. All parishioners must enter the church through the front doors (Silvery Lane). Only 375 people will be admitted at once, and an attendant will be keeping count at the door. Attendees beyond that will be asked to proceed to the corresponding outdoor Mass at 10:15 AM or 12:45 PM, or to watch the weekend's streamed Mass.

OUTDOOR MASSES Weather permitting, we will be <u>adding</u> two outdoor Sunday Masses at 10:15 AM & 12:45 PM on the football field. Attendees may enter the football field through the gateway building, through the North-West gate from the elementary school lot, or through the South-East gate. Attendees will be seated on the field facing the home bleachers. Those who attend the outdoor Masses are encouraged to bring lawn chairs or a blanket. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a hand-held umbrella for shade. Don't forget your sunscreent Face-coverings are not required at outdoor Masses as long as social distancing is maintained. * Note: Outdoor Mass cancellations due to weather will be communicated to parishioners by 7AM via text, social media and email.

LIVE STREAMED MASS For those unable to attend Mass in-person, the weekend live stream will continue, but is **moving to** Saturday's 4:30 PM Mass. Watch the Mass in real-time or any time retroactively by visiting <u>Facebook.com/DivineChildParish/live</u>.

SECTION 3: HOW MASS WILL WORK

FINDING A SEAT To ensure proper social distancing and sanitizing of pews, parishioners will be asked to adhere to a seating chart for each Mass. Pews will be marked with alternating color coded letters. Please sit in these colored/lettered pews for the following Mass times. Attendants will also be present to assist parishioners.

WEEKDAY MASSES:

6:30 AM - Orange/A pews only 8:30 AM - Yellow/B pews only

SATURDAY MASSES:

8:30 AM - Orange/A pews only 4:30 PM - Yellow/B pews only

SUNDAY MASSES:

8 AM - Orange/A pews only 10 AM - Yellow/B pews only 12:30 PM - Green/C pews

OUTDOOR MASSES:

Please sit on or near the ten yard lines in order to provide adequate social distancing. Orange cones will be placed along each ten yard line to mark the amount of space to the front and back of attendees. <u>Those who attend the outdoor</u> <u>Mass are encouraged to bring lawn</u> <u>chairs or a blanket</u>. No seating will be provided. You may also consider bringing a hand-held umbrella for shade. **OFFERTORY** There will not be a collection during Mass. Upon the conclusion of Mass, please place your offertory in the collection baskets located in front of the altar, in the gathering space or at any exit of the football field. Alternatively, donations can be made online through <u>FaithDirect.net</u>, or mailed to/dropped off at the rectory (1055 N. Silvery Lane, Dearborn, MI 48128).

COMMUNION A limited number of Eucharistic ministers will be on hand for each Mass to distribute communion to multiple pew banks/yard lines. Thank you in advance for your patience as we expect communion to take longer than usual. Communion procedures will be explained just before the reception of the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to receive the Eucharist, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Attendees should maintain 6 feet of distance from other attendees while proceeding to the front of church/field.
- All attendees should remove masks and gloves as they approach the minister. No gloves may be worn when receiving the Eucharist in hand.
- Attendees should bow and reply "Amen" at a distance of 6 feet from the Eucharistic minister and then approach to receive the Eucharist.

For your safety, if a Eucharistic minister accidentally touches the hand or mouth of a parishioner, he or she will sanitize his or her hands instantly with rubbing alcohol at a sanitizing station located near each Eucharistic minister's station.

* If you are uncomfortable receiving the Eucharist at this time, please know that there is no obligation to receive the Eucharist whenever you come to Mass.

Tuesday August 25 is our Parish Day of Prayer for Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life

Divine Child Parish designates the fourth Tuesday of every month as a day of prayer for vocations before the Blessed Sacrament.

Every 4th Tuesday we pray for religious vocations. A plenary indulgence can be obtained through praying in front of the Blessed Sacrament.

To obtain an indulgence, a person must attend confession and communion within 8 days (either side) of the indulgenced act or prayer and pray for the Holy Father's intentions (traditionally one Our Father and one Hail Mary). In addition, to obtain a plenary indulgence, one must be completely detached from one's sins, even venial sins. If one does not have complete detachment, then the indulgence is only partial.

<u>RECIPE OF THE WEEK</u>: Easy Lasagna

- 30 ounces ricotta cheese
- 2 cups Italian blend cheese 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- COOKBOOK

- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- One 26-ounce jar spaghetti sauce
- 1 cup water
- 1 pkg oven ready (no boil) lasagna noodles
- $\frac{1}{2}$ pound ground beef cooked and drained
- ¹/₂ pound mild Italian sausage crumbled, cooked and drained

Preheat oven to 350 F. In a medium bowl, combine ricotta with half of the Italian blend cheese and half of the Parmesan Cheese. Add the eggs and Italian seasonings; stir to combine. In another bowl or the pan that you browned them in, combine the meat with the spaghetti sauce and water mix well. In a 9×13 pan, spread 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of sauce on the bottom of the pan. Place 4 sheets of lasagna noodles over the top. Put half of the cheese mixture over the lasagna. Top with $\frac{1}{3}$ of the meat sauce. Repeat with one more layer. Top with four sheets of lasagna noodles, then the sauce. Sprinkle with remaining cheeses. Wrap tightly with aluminum foil. Bake 55 to 60 minutes or until the lasagna is tender.

Let stand 10 minutes before cutting and serving.

St. Augustine of Hippo (Feast Day August 28)

(Feast Day August 28) NOVEMBER 13, 354 – AUGUST 28, 430

Augustine was born in Africa and spent many years of his life in wicked living and in false beliefs. Though he was one of the most intelligent men who ever lived and though he had been brought up a Christian, his sins of impurity and his pride darkened his mind so much that he could not see or understand God. Through the prayers of his mother, St. Monica, and the marvelous preaching of St. Ambrose, Augustine finally became convinced that Christianity was the one true religion. He became a Christian at 33, a priest at 36, and a bishop at 41. His writings influenced the development of the Western Church and Western philosophy and, indirectly, all of Western Christianity. He is viewed as one of the most important Church Fathers of the Latin Church for his writings in the Patristic Period. Among his most important works are The City of God, De doctrina Christiana, and Confessions.
