SENIOR YEAR — TIMELINE FALL SEMESTER

- 1. Finalize list of (4-8) colleges to apply
- 2. Apply!
- 3. Request transcripts & letters of recommendations
- 4. Retake the SAT or ACT if necessary (review reqs bound many colleges are now test optional)
- 5. Register for virtual college rep visits (Naviance)
- 6. Visit colleges
- 7. Apply for scholarships
- 8. Complete FAFSA After Oct 1st
- 9. Attend Virtual Financial Aid Night



APPLICATION WHO SENDS WHAT???

STUDENT

- APPLICATION
- APPLICATION FEE
- Essay
- Test scores (IF required from the Testing Center)
- Portfolio and/or audition

SCHOOL COUNSELOR

- OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT WITH TEST SCORES
- APPLICATION FEE WAIVER
- Teacher/counselor letters of recommendation

APPLICATION TYPES

- Rolling Admission
- Early <u>Action</u> (non-binding)
- Priority Deadlines
- Early <u>Decision</u> (binding)
- Regular Decision

ROLLING DECISION

NO application deadline

Decisions are made all throughout the year

May have a priority deadline (Nov. or

Dec.) for major

Priority given to those who apply early

EARLY ACTION

Application deadline usually
November 1st or November 15th
Non-binding
Decisions released by mid-January
Students have till May 1st to commit

HIGHLY RECOMMEND APPLY EARLY ACTION

PRIORITY DEADLINES

Often linked to scholarship opportunities
Application fee may be waived Either a November 1st, December 1st, or January 1

Example: Penn State, November 30th

EARLY DECISION

Can only apply early DECISION to ONE college Application deadline is usually November 1st or Nov. 15th

You may apply to other colleges under Early Action

YOU MUST COMMIT TO COLLEGE ONCE ACCEPTED!!!
BINDING CONTRACT

Sometimes there is an advantage with admissions decisions & financial aid when applying early decision

REGULAR DECISION

Deadline – usually January 1st

Decisions released April 1st

Students have till May 1st to commit



It is the responsibility of the STUDENT to know:

- 1. What items are required by each college
- 2. Application deadlines

APPLICATION TIPS

BE CONSISTENT WITH YOUR NAME

Use reliable contact information

SAVE YOUR USERNAME PASSWORDS WEB ID

The importance of "Waiving your Right"

Example:

IMPORTANT PRIVACY NOTE: In accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the original School Report submitted on your behalf reflects your choice to waive or not waive your right of access to all recommendations and supporting documents. That response applies to all subsequent reports, including this one.

You chose the following:

Yes, I do waive my right to access, and I understand I will never see this form or an other recommendations submitted by me or on my behalf.

No, I do *not waive* my right to access, and I may someday choose to see this form or any other recommendations or supporting documents submitted by me or on my behalf to the institution at which I'm enrolling, if that institution saves them after I matriculate.



NOT A QUICK APPLICATION

MUST COMPLETE ESSAY (250-650 WORDS)

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION...SHORT ANSWERS & QUESTION

For non CommonApp colleges use the college's official website to apply.

APPLY

Colleges will utilize your email address to communicate with you regarding your application. Check your email and save your username/password log-in

RECOMMENDATION LETTERS

Teacher Recommendation Letters

- Ask early. Teacher should have 3 weeks to write letter.
- Log into Student and go to the College tab/Home
- Add new request
- Complete Teacher Rec Letter Survey (in About Me tab under surveys)
- Write a thank-you note to your teachers

NO MORE THAN 2 TEACHER LETTERS

Counselor Recommendation Letters

 Same as above, but complete the "counselor letter of recommendation" (only if application requires should you request a counselor letter)


Teacher Letter of Recommendation Request

Request letter of recommendation from teacher in drop down list

Complete questions and surveys

NO PAPER

Request is sent via email to teacher



SAT & ACT SCORES

Due to COVID, many colleges are test optional

Your scores are reported on your CV transcript

You can request to have all of your scores removed if you are applying test optional

Some colleges require the test scores come directly from the testing center (example: Penn State, U of Pittsburgh, and Ohio State). It is the student's responsibility to determine the college's policy.

Self-reporting test scores schools will require official scores if accepted



THE IMPORTANCE OF THE COLLEGE ESSAY

- YOU have control
- YOU have a voice
- YOU can share with the colleges something that is not already in the application
 - Shows how well YOU can write
 - After grades, curriculum, and test scores...the essay is the 4th most important part of an admissions decision

WHAT IS A PERSONAL STATEMENT?

- Your story
- Invitation for your reader to get to know you
- Indicates what is important to you

It is <u>not</u> a summary of the 18 years of your life or a summary of your academic record or a summary of all your extra-curricular activities.

THE DOs

- ➤ Be authentic and creative
- ➤ Be yourself
- ➤ Have teacher proofread
- ➤ Accept criticism
- >Write, edit, revise, repeat
- ➤ Prove it with specific details
- ➤ Be personal (describe something you've experienced)

THE DON'Ts

- ➤ Don't use SAT vocabulary words
- ➤ Don't write about something general or broad topics (climate change, gun violence, etc...)
- ➤ Don't have misspellings or grammatical mistakes
- ➤Don't be wordy
- ➤Don't rely on spellcheck

TOPICS TO AVOID

- Death of grandparent
- Scoring the touchdown for the State Championship

- Sensitive Topics (ex: religion, politics, etc.)
- Your mission trip (unless it's one specific moment)

COMMON APPLICATION ESSAY PROMPTS

Choose one question. No more than 650 words.

- 1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- 4. Describe a problem you've solved or a problem you'd like to solve. It can be an intellectual challenge, a research query, an ethical dilemma anything that is of personal importance, no matter the scale. Explain its significance to you and what steps you took or could be taken to identify a solution.
- 5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- 7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.

KEEP THIS IN MIND...

If you are bored by your essay – the admissions office will be bored too!

Write what you want, not what you think will impress the admissions office.

If your friend found your essay without your name on it and read it, they should be able to know who the writer was because it was clearly using your voice!

STEP 3: Transcript Request Form (Blue Sheet)

- Transcript Request Form can be picked up in the HS /Student Services Office or <u>printed</u>
- Print and complete a form for EACH college

YOU MUST ALLOW 2 WEEKS FOR TRANSCRIPT AND MATERIALS TO BE PROCESSED!

Example: Deadline is November 30, must have request by November 15th!

RECAP

STEP 1: APPLY TO YOUR COLLEGES

STEP 2: Log into Naviance Student and add your colleges and letter of recommendation requests

STEP 3: COMPLETE THE TRANSCRIPT REQUEST FORM (BLUE SHEET) AND RETURN TO STUDENT SERVICES/GUIDANCE OFFICE

AFTER ACCEPTANCE

 Share your news with counselors to indicate the decision in Naviance student

Wait for Financial Aid packages

• You have until MAY 1 to make decision and pay your deposit.

 No senioritis....colleges will rescind acceptance offer if your final grades are not sufficient and/or due to irresponsible social media postings on Instagram, Twitter, Facebook, etc...

SENIOR YEAR – TIMELINE SPRING SEMESTER

- 1. Make sure FAFSA is complete
- Respond to offers of admission and financial aid once you've received your financial aid packages
- 3. Continue to apply for scholarships (Naviance)
- 4. Submit deposit, due by May 1st
- 5. In June, request your final CV transcript and CIHS transcripts (from colleges)

SENIOR YEAR - CHECKLIST

12TH GRADE



- COMPLETE COLLEGE APPLICATIONS
- PAY ATTENTION TO APPLICATION DEADLINES
- REGISTER FOR THE SAT OR ACT (IN THE FALL)
- ATTEND COLLEGE ADMISSION COUNSELOR VISITS: SEE NAVIANCE TO REGISTER
- SET UP TOURS AND INTERVIEWS AT SCHOOLS OF INTEREST (MAKE APPOINTMENTS THROUGH ADMISSIONS OFFICE BUT ALSO CONSIDER SCHEDULING WITH FINANCIAL AID OFFICE AND SPECIFIC
 - ACADEMIC DEPARTMENTS AS WELL)
- LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION
 - TALK TO TEACHER/COUNSELOR IN PERSON TO ASK IF THEY WILL WRITE A LETTER
 - COMPLETE TEACHER/COUNSELOR RECOMMENDATION SURVEY IN NAVIANCE ("ABOUT ME").
 - SEND A THANK YOU AFTER COMPLETED



- REGISTER EARLY FOR A PIN TO FILE THE FAFSA ONLINE
- ENCOURAGE PARENTS TO ATTEND FAFSA COMPLETION WORKSHOP

 (FALL)
- COMPLETE THE FAFSA (AFTER OCTOBER 1)
- APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS (POSTED IN NAVIANCE)
- HAVE OFFICIAL SAT/ACT TEST SCORES SENT BY TESTING AGENCY TO COLLEGES ON YOUR LIST
- VISIT COLLEGES YOU'VE BEEN ACCEPTED TO
- EVALUATE OPTIONS AND MAKE A COLLEGE SELECTION
- REGISTER, PREPARE AND TAKE AP EXAMS
- PICK A COLLEGE BY MAY 1ST & SEND IN YOUR NON-REFUNDABLE TUITION DEPOSIT
- INDICATE IN NAVIANCE APPLICATION STATUS FOR ALL SCHOOL APPLIED
- COMPLETE GRADUATION SURVEY
