



Dear Town School Parents and Guardians,

This letter is dedicated to sharing information with you about our wonderful new hires for next year. We were fortunate to have most of our hiring completed before shifting into Online Town and now we are imagining all the new ways we will support their transition to our community. Employee attrition is fundamental to the year-to-year rhythm in all good schools, as members of our community move on for new opportunities or to new destinations. While goodbyes are always bittersweet, we are fortunate that these transitions provide an opportunity to add new community members who contribute fresh perspectives and new strengths to our vibrant faculty.

An outstanding team of educators is the heart and soul of a school. Every hiring decision is an opportunity to further the mission of the school, to extend our capacity to meet the needs of our students, and to deliver an outstanding program. Our hiring process is very inclusive, with specific hiring committees for each role and with every candidate available for employees to meet at lunch during the interview visit. We hope the process helps us identify strong and collaborative educators committed to growth as professionals and individuals. We publicize the openings on national and regional websites, on our LinkedIn, on the Town website, and any relevant listservs or educational/professional groups. We ask our current faculty to post the openings on their personal networks as well so we have our best promoters reaching out.

Generally, new teachers don't begin their work until late summer, but under these current circumstances we have instituted earlier transitions so we have plenty of time for strong curriculum design. New Lower School Head Peggy Laurent will join us this summer and will have significant planning time with the administrative team and teachers before school opens. Our decision to pilot a new co-teacher program for next year preceded Covid-19, and it is a tremendous asset to have these educators who are familiar with our boys and our teaching continue with us next fall. The co-teacher program affords New Teacher Institute graduates the opportunity to refine their teaching practice, partner in a classroom with an experienced teacher, and pursue an Action Research Project or Independent Project. I am delighted that three of our current second year Resident Teachers have been accepted into the program and will return to Town next year.

In addition to our new hires, we are excited to be welcoming several very young new members to our community - Town babies! EJ Wagner will be on family leave for the fall term, as will Kelley Masters. And, just recently we learned the exciting news that Claire Koshland will be out for leave beginning in October. As is normal in these circumstances, some family leave positions are still in the hiring process and we plan to complete those in the next few weeks. I will update you on those hires and any other changes this summer. Please reach out with any questions or concerns.

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
CHANGING ROLES, NEW RESIDENT TEACHERS AND NEW FACULTY AND STAFF



Kate Callan joins Town as a Third Grade Head Teacher.
