



VIRTUAL CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES K-12

2020-2021

When participating in virtual learning, all aspects of our TSD Student Rights and Responsibilities Code of Conduct and the TSD Technology User Agreement apply as if you were in a classroom.

Specific Expectations and Reminders Regarding Virtual Learning Include: **DO...**

- a. Use district provided iPad or a computer. Using a cell phone is not appropriate.
- b. Ensure that you are connected to WiFi.
- c. Use your Schoology calendar to access Zoom.
- d. Find a quiet location from which to join your session.
- a. Avoid sitting in front of windows as the day and sunlight can impact your cameras ability to capture your face clearly.
- b. Make sure that your surrounding environment (e.g. posters on wall) and background are school appropriate.
- e. Arrive to your virtual classes on time and remain online until the class is over. Attendance will be taken daily in every class.
- f. Log on using your full name.
- g. Have your camera on unless otherwise instructed or approved.
- h. Mute your audio unless you are speaking (or in line to speak) to prevent unintentional background noise from disrupting the conversation.
- i. Participate fully in virtual classes and meet classroom/teacher expectations.
- j. Let your teacher know if you need help or are having an issue. Counselors, tech support, and administrators are also available to assist.

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Specific Expectations and Reminders Regarding Virtual Learning Include: **DO NOT...**

- a. Do not pretend to be another person.
- b. Do not post anything that is fake or misleading.
- c. Do not share, post, or distribute Zoom links.
- d. Do not share, post, or distribute images or videos of the zoom lessons and class experiences.
- e. Do not attend a virtual class for which you are not scheduled.
- f. Do not "bring with you" anyone to the virtual class meeting unless asked to do so by the teacher.
