9.5 Prohibited Conduct

Student athletes and extracurricular club members shall be informed of prohibited activities (as outlined in section 10) and notified of potential consequences for violation of law or District Policy.

9. PROHIBITED CONDUCT

- 9.1. Students who participate in student government and extracurricular activities, particularly competitive athletics, and the adult coaches, advisors, and assistants who direct those activities, become role models for others in the school and community and often play major roles in establishing standards of acceptable behavior in the school and community.
- 9.2. It is of the utmost importance that those involved in extracurricular activities, whether as students or staff, comply with all applicable laws and rules of behavior and conduct themselves at all times in a manner befitting their positions and responsibilities.
- 9.3. The following types of conduct are prohibited, while in the classroom, on school property, during school sponsored activities, or regardless of the location or circumstance, affecting a person or property described in UCA §53G-8-203 (1)(e)(i) through (iv):
- 9.3.1. ~~the~~ use of foul, abusive, or profane language while engaged in school related activities;
 - 9.3.2. ~~the~~ illicit use, possession, or distribution of controlled substances or drug paraphernalia; ~~and the use, possession, or distribution of an electronic cigarette, tobacco or alcoholic beverages contrary to law; and~~
 - ~~9.3.2-9.3.3.~~ the use, possession, or distribution of a tobacco product, an electronic cigarette product, or a nicotine product as those terms are defined in UCA §76-10-101; or an alcoholic beverage; and
 - ~~9.3.3-9.3.4.~~ hazing, demeaning, or assaultive behavior, whether consensual or not, including behavior involving physical violence, restraint, improper touching, or inappropriate exposure of body parts not normally exposed in public settings, forced ingestion of any substance, or any act which would constitute a crime against a person or public order under Utah law.
- 9.4. A student who participates in gang activities, regardless of the location, may be excluded from participation.
- 9.5. School personnel who reasonably believe that a violation of this section may have occurred shall report such incident immediately to school administrators so that prompt and appropriate action can be taken. School personnel who fail to report a violation may face disciplinary action.
- 9.6. Students who observe hazing activities and fail to intervene or report the hazing to school officials may face disciplinary action for conspiring to engage in hazing.
- 9.7. Prior to any student or employee or volunteer coach participating in a District/school sponsored athletic program, both curricular and extracurricular, or extracurricular club or activity, a student or coach shall annually participate in bullying and hazing prevention training.
