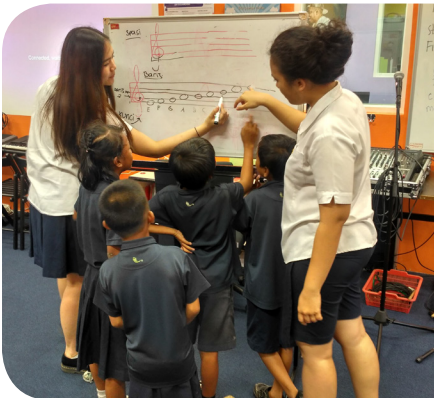


CREATING AN AUTHENTIC SERVICE LEARNING CULTURE

This JAWS is open to anyone interested in establishing an authentic culture of service learning in their school. There will be ample opportunity for participants to collaborate and share during the JAWS. Workshops will depend on what is being offered by attendees but there will also be a 'show and tell' session where all participating schools will be able to showcase their work. In addition, we plan to include a visit to Sekolah Bisal; a life-enhancing, micro-school conceived and managed by IB CAS students from BSJ.



Potential topics for workshops are:

- Embedding service learning in the MYP Curriculum.
- A vertical articulation of service learning.
- Introducing service learning in the primary school.
- Managing the balance - local needs and global priorities.
- Driving service learning through the House System.
- Embedding student led action research into service learning.

- Empowering students to initiate service learning in school.
- 'Champions for Change' - embedding service learning in the Primary School.
- Cultivating sustainable service learning relationships in IB.
- Using a character based framework to drive service learning.
- Developing a strategic vision for service learning .
- Facilitating meaningful student reflection to shape a service mindset.
