NOTICE TO ALL PARENTS, FACULTY, AND STAFF

THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY REGULATIONS REQUIRE ALL PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS TO INSPECT SCHOOL BUILDINGS FOR ASBESTOS-CONTAINING MATERIALS AND TO DEVELOP AN ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN. A COPY OF THE PLAN DEVELOPED FOR AVON OLD FARMS SCHOOL IS MAINTAINED IN THE PHYSICAL PLANT OFFICE AND IS AVAILABLE FOR REVIEW DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS.

ASBESTOS NOTICE TO PARENTS, FACULTY AND STAFF

A formal asbestos management program has been in place at Avon Old Farms School since 1987. The purpose of this program is to identify any Asbestos-Containing Building Material (ACBM) that may be in our buildings and to take steps to make sure this material does not present an exposure hazard to the students, faculty, or staff.

Under our asbestos management program, the ACBM at Avon Old Farms School is inspected every six months to assure early detection of problem areas. Furthermore, each building is completely re-inspected once every three years by a Connecticut-licensed asbestos inspector to make sure that all ACBM is properly identified and that our asbestos management program is up to date.

The asbestos management program is implemented through our Asbestos Management Plan. This plan identifies the locations of the ACBM in our buildings and details our ongoing management program. The plan also includes the results of our periodic asbestos inspections and our plans for dealing with the ACBM that remains in our buildings.

The Asbestos Management Plan maintained in the office of the Avon Old Farms School Facilities Manager. This plan is available for review during normal business hours.
