Behavioral health services include:


- Evaluation and management of mental health disorders

Watch for symptoms

People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear **2-14 days after exposure to the virus.** People with these symptoms may have COVID-19:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

Graduation Requirements

HPS Board Policy indicates:

1 credit of Health

- 4 credits of English (1 credit of American Literature)
- 3 credits of Math (Business Math or Accounting counts towards this requirement)
- 3 credits of Science (1 credit in Biology)
- 3 credits of Social Studies (1 credit United States History, 0.5 credit Civics)
- 1.5 credits of Physical Education
- 1 credit of Fine Arts (Art, Music, & Theater)
- 0.5 credit of Career Technology Education (Business, Career Education, Technology, & Family and Consumer Science)

are required.

Freshman Requirements

- 4 Core subjects (English, Math, Science, Social Studies)
- Physical Education ½ year
- World Language



- ❖ Most students are enrolled in 6.0 7.0 credits on a eight period day schedule.
- Credit is earned by passing classes with a 60% or higher and attending regularly.
- Loss of Credit occurs after 10 absences in a Semester Course and after 20 absences in a Full-year Course.
 - > Two class cuts will result in a loss of credit.
- ♦ Must earn 5.5 credits to be promoted to the 10th grade.

Class of 2024 students need to be enrolled in 6.5 credits to graduate on schedule.

Course Leveling

- Most courses are leveled:
 - > 5 On Grade Level
 - > 7 Above Grade Level
 - > 9 Honors
 - Modern World History and Year 1 World Language courses are un-leveled
- Students are placed based on teacher recommendation and student performance.
- Level changes can be made when appropriate and occur after consultation with the teacher and parents.



- For the NCAA Division I and II 16 core courses will be required. This rule applies to any student first entering any Division I or 2 college or university.
- Be sure to look at your high school's list of NCAA courses on the NCAA Eligibility Center's website and in Hamden High School Course catalog. Only courses that appear on your school's List of NCAA Courses will be used in the calculation of the core GPA.
- There are many opportunities available for student athletes who sequentially plan their participation in both athletics and academics.
- Be sure to plan your coursework accordingly for all four years, and strive to succeed both academically and athletically.
- All courses approved by the NCAA can be found in the Hamden High School course catalog.

Team Process


- Each student will be on a Freshmen team.
- There are six teams designated by letters A through F.
- Each team consists of a Math, English, Biology, and Social Studies teacher. The freshmen administrator, guidance counselors and social workers are also a part of that team.
- Team teachers have common planning times to discuss potential issues that arise with students on their team.

<u>Purpose of the Team</u>

- To discuss concerns and the progress of each student this ensures no time is wasted in getting a student the help he or she needs.
- To discuss strategies to use in the classroom to help engage, motivate and challenge each student.
- To meet with parents and/or guardians and students if there is an issue of concern in the classroom.
- To give positive feedback to parents through emails and phone calls about what is happening in the classroom.
- ❖ To adjust academic levels when necessary.

HHS School Structure

Students in grades 7-12 will attend school for 5.5 hours per day for five days per week, operating on AA BB days. Specifically, half of the students will come to school the same two days every week, and the other half will come to school the other two days every week. On the fifth day, Group A and B students will alternate between in-person learning and at-home distance learning every other week. The diagram on the following page outlines the rotation for our secondary students.
