Becoming something "other"

During the first two years of my superintendency, we developed a new district strategic plan, but we didn't stop there. At individual schools, and even in departments, people then took the time to develop site- and department-specific strategic plans. The collective voices of nearly 1,500 stakeholders had input into what we aspire to be as a school system. It is out of that strategic work that we are now well on our way to becoming the "community at the forefront of educational excellence." Out of that important strategic work, we embarked upon multiple efforts that are transforming White Bear Lake Area Schools.

Last fall, we officially kicked off the bond referendum informational campaign. We stood in front of a packed auditorium of staff members to deliver important information as we started a school year like none other in White Bear's 158 year history, and we followed that presentation with countless others throughout the community during the next couple of months. Election Day arrived, ending with approval from our community for the largest bond referendum in state history. Because of that support, we are now in the midst of transformative construction projects that will address building needs across the district including district-wide additions and renovations, safety and security improvements, deferred maintenance projects, and district-wide classroom and building updates to create flexible learning spaces.

The District will promote behaviors that reduce the spread of infectious diseases by educating our students, faculty and staff about routine, regular handwashing, wearing face coverings, and sanitizing spaces and high touch surface areas.

General Safety Precautions

- Staff will disinfect high touch areas in classrooms, hallways, and restrooms throughout the day.
 Disinfecting wipes and/ or spray disinfectant will be supplied.
- Building ventilation systems will be running at optimum capacity before school occupancy and throughout the day.
- Enhanced disinfecting will take place each evening following MDH guidance.
- Hand sanitizers will be provided in various locations throughout the buildings.
- Classrooms with sinks will be supplied with sufficient inventory of soap and paper towels for handwashing.
- Drinking fountains will be disabled, but the bottle filler function will still work (we added several of these over the summer.)
- Front office and health office desks will be provided a plexiglass barrier.

Social distancing is important to ensure the health and wellness of our students and staff as it will help limit the spread of the virus. Social distancing will need to be practiced in all classes, courses, and spaces.

Fall 2020 Information

White Bear Lake Area Schools has created plans for the start of the school year based on guidance from the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) and the Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC).

The Fall 2020 Plan approved by the School Board is described below:

Hybrid Learning Model for Grades K-12+

A Hybrid Learning Model combines distance learning and in-person school with social distancing practices.

Students will attend school in-person and be at home learning on an A/B day rotation by alphabet on Monday-Thursday. All students will be at home learning on Fridays.



Distance Learning Model Option

Available for all families who wish to choose distance learning as an option.

A Distance Learning Model includes asynchronous and synchronous learning delivered online.

Glossary of Terms

- Asynchronous Learning students complete their work on their own time within a given time frame.
- Synchronous Learning classes occur on set schedules and time frames. Students and educators are online at the same time, interacting at different places but during the same time.

As public health guidelines change, the District will adjust plans accordingly.

Regardless of which Learning Model a family chooses for its student(s), we are committed to providing an engaging, equitable and quality learning experience for each student.

The work we have done in the last three years has positioned us well as a community of education and excellence. Our strategic plan drives our work, even in the midst of a global pandemic. As we consider the last few months, I want to turn to Dr. William Cook, who facilitated the development of our strategic plan, for additional context. He stated:

"School districts will emerge from this crisis worse or better, or, if strategic, something "other." It depends on what they do now. Those that have an authentic strategic plan, developed by a strategic process, must infuse it with a new creative energy to discover and seize upon the possibilities found only in crisis."

While he was referring to the COVID-19 pandemic when he wrote this back in April, his words have added meaning as we consider the unrest that followed the killing of George Floyd at the end of May.

Over a year ago, we developed an equity commitment statement and adopted a four-way equity decision making protocol that has helped to guide our work. "To nurture the whole student, we disrupt systemic inequities by recognizing, honoring, and embracing all cultures with humility and respect" stands out as a key achievement in the last three years. The equity audit that we conducted this past school year was also borne out of our strategic work, and given how conversations in our nation have evolved in the last few months, the timing of our receiving the results has positioned us well to develop actionable strategies for the coming year and years to come. We clearly have work to do. The data are disturbing, and yet they also provide hope that we can get this right because the adults in our system know that we can do better and we want to do better.

None of us have been immune to the past six months of uncertainty and unprecedented times, including the school district, but we will come together to make the 2020-2021 school year the best year we can. We will refuse to be defined by a pandemic of COVID-19 or systemic racism. Our students need us. They need to connect with their peers, and they need to connect with caring adults. They need their elders to serve as role models and deliverers of hope now more than ever.

Safety for staff and students will need to be at the forefront, and we will work together in new ways to ensure that we accomplish this. Finding ways to engage with students academically, providing all learners with access to quality instruction and a renewed focus on social-emotional learning, is also at the forefront.

I am confident that together we will deliver all this and more. I fully believe we will emerge both better and "other."

District-wide Hires

Director of Equity and Engagement

Dr. Marcellus Davis has been chosen to serve as the district's Director of Equity and Engagement. Davis has served in numerous racial educational equity roles in both K-12 education and higher education, including roles of urban education professor, cultural liaison, diversity and multiculturalism director, director of achievement and integration and American Indian Education, and interim director of a charter elementary school. He has served in leadership roles with Minnesota National Association of Multicultural Education (MN-NAME) and has taught in the Human Relations Department at St. Cloud State University.

Early Childhood Coordinator

Darcy Rodriguez is the district's new Early Childhood Coordinator, a position that was vacated when Kate Andersen left the position to serve as a Director of Community Education in another school district. Rodriguez has worked in the Stillwater Public School district since 2009, serving in the roles of assistant teacher, parent educator, family engagement coordinator, and most recently as early childhood coordinator. She also has six years of experience as an internal coach with the Minnesota Reading Corps and has been a Minnesota Association for Family and Early Education (MNAFEE) Board member since 2016.

Hugo Elementary Principal

Brian Morris has been named the permanent Hugo Elementary Principal, a role he stepped into as an interim appointment during the 2019-20 school year. Morris has worked in the district for many years. He began serving as the district's assessment coordinator in 2014 before stepping into an interim principal role. Prior to his time in district and school administration, he worked for 17 years as a mathematics teacher, teacher leader and curriculum leader at White Bear Lake Area High School - South Campus.

White Bear Lake Area High School - North Campus

The WBLAHS - North Campus interim principal role served by Ang Nelson during the 2019-20 school year will be extended through the 2020-21 academic year. Given the uncertainty surrounding the upcoming school year, it will be important that Ms. Nelson remain in this role to provide a sense of stability for families, students, and staff.
