> Associate Superintendent of Business Services, Dr. Rob Pecot. reviewed a power point which explained that this is a 45-day budget update. He explained that money received from CARES Act is what is being used to increase technology for students and PPE for staff and students. We will also be giving back the MAA carryover to school sites. We usually keep one month's salary in Fund 17 and there currently is not enough in that account to cover that. We need to consider that we will have 5 months of cash deferrals that will cost us \$33 million dollars. The only reason we do not need loan like other districts, is because of the strong fiscal decisions we have made in the past. The state economy has declining tax revenue and we do not know

how the upcoming election will affect us. The county projections for the 2021-2022 school year is a 14% projected budget reduction. We have hired independent study teachers and we are not filling 3 assistant principal positions that have become open this year. We have consistently reduced admin over the last few years. We are in a better position that most districts because we have been fiscally responsible and conserved. We need to continue to do so and he will continue to keep the board updated.

**Board Reports:** Trustee Silcox has four children in TUSD and one that is home schooled. Today was a successful day and he wants to recognize all who put so much work into this year. Trustee Abercrombie commented that at the last meeting a statement was

made that some were laid off due to COVID and that was not true. We need to make sure that comments made are correct. Trustee Souza received a lot of the same calls about people being worried about their jobs. People heard that some were losing jobs. Before comments are made, we need to talk to each to make sure the correct information is reported. We want to continue to move forward and get through distance learning. Administration has worked very hard and she appreciates everyone at the district working together. Teachers have done amazing things. Trustee Kaur had no comment. Trustee Alexander commented that he did not make that statement and that he was misunderstood and that he hoped that that did not happen. Trustee Costa commented that she saw quite a few positive comments for teachers, administrators and ISET about getting everything to work. She thanked everyone for their efforts and for the positive comments. Trustee Pekari thanked everyone for this huge endeavor. Everyone is working together to make this work.

### **Superintendent Report:** Dr. Stephens commented that this is his 37<sup>th</sup> first day of school and it has never been under the circumstances that we have now. This is completely new to all of us. He feels that our teachers, classified and administration have done a great job getting ready for the school year. A month ago, we were thinking that we would be in the hybrid model or 100% back in the classroom. We have gone a complete 180 and it took extraordinary efforts by all involved. Today was a solid day. Once we get all of our devices out to students it will be great. Our first day went

well and he is excited to see what tomorrow brings.
