Overview:

- The Next Steps program is designed to meet the needs of a range of students from ages 18 to 21
- Students can attend for one, two, or three years
- Promotes independence by engaging in community activities
- Individualized to the participants in the program
 - \circ ~ We work with students and families to create goals
 - \circ ~ We meet the range of all students in a cademic classes and internships
 - Our program is student-interest driven
- We work with students to increase academic, social, and vocational readiness



Student-run business:

- Students run a school store where they:
 - Plan, purchase, and price items to sell
 - Use arts periods to design flyers and advertisements to attract customers
 - Advertise, practice and apply graphic design skills
 - Manage inventory, build customer service skills, and operate a cash register
 - Review the store budget and monitor profits
 - Cultivate regular and meaningful customer relationships



Internships:

- Students complete a career interest assessment
- Students participate in internships based on their interests
- Students explore a variety of skills and fields
- Students work with a job coach to increase independence
- Internships are individualized to meet the range and needs of all students
- Students practice work-related social skills
- Students receive support in writing resumes and cover letters as appropriate



We offer a range of classes throughout each week, including:

- Personal Finance
- Literacy and Communication
- Daily Living Skills
- Fitness
- Nutrition and Health
- Travel Skills
- Community Time
- Technology and Coding
- Self-advocacy
- Arts



Arts

- Students participate in daily arts
 - Visual art in addition to performing arts (drama and music)

STEPS

- Builds creativity and confidence
- Allows for multiple means of student expression
- Incorporates community engagement
- Students participate in ArtBeat, an annual showcase where students show their work to a larger audience
- Opportunities to be part of extracurricular drama program

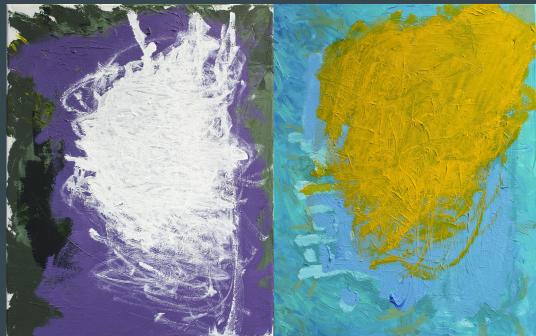
