Required Forms

Parents will fill out required school forms and verify demographic information online. An email will be sent to parents with a link to the online forms. Please have these forms completed by September 15th. The School Handbooks are in the process of being updated and will be available on our website by September 8th. The online form includes an electronic signature sign-off that will attest to the acceptance of those policies as well as the Electronic Devices Policy and Computer and Internet Acceptable Use Agreement and Policy. Please read the Handbook(s) on or after September 8th thoroughly before signing.

Nurses' Notes

To ensure each child's safety, students will not be allowed to attend school until all required health forms are received by the Nurse. Any students without proper documentation of immunizations will not be admitted on the first day of school. I am attaching the medication release form to be returned by Tuesday, September 8th. Students with allergy concerns must submit a Student Allergy Action Plan, signed by a physician.

Screenings for vision, dental, hearing, and scoliosis might be held throughout the school year as required by the RI Department of Health. Parents will be notified prior to the scheduled dates. Please refer to the School Handbook or the web site for complete health information, including immunization requirements, guidelines regarding sick students and requirements for medication.

Busing

Beginning on Monday, September 14th, school buses will pick up Cumberland students as listed in the local newspapers. Attached you will find "Bus Tickets". Students will need to present one to the bus driver every day. If there are any questions or issues regarding busing, please call the company directly:

School Schedule

School hours are 8:35 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Please consult the **September calendar** for the opening schedule. Children should arrive every day by 8:35 a.m., in order to begin each day morning prayer. Students in Grades 2 – 8 will receive classroom assignments on their first day of school.

PreK and Kindergarten students will report directly to their classrooms upon arrival in the morning (prior to 8:35). This gives students the opportunity to be welcomed by their teachers and to connect with their peers within the comfort and security of the classroom. PreK and Kindergarten students will continue to be dismissed at the outside classroom door (via sidewalk) at 2:55 p.m.

Early Bird Pick Up

We have extended early bird pick up to include students in grades 4 and 5. Students in Gr. 4 – 8 who do not ride the bus and have no siblings in the lower grades may be picked up in the front of the school at 2:50p.m.

Before/After Care

Grades K-8

On Wednesday, September 2nd and Thursday September 3rd, there will be no BeforeCare. There will be AfterCare on both days until 6:00 p.m. AfterCare on those two days will be provided by Mercymount faculty in staff. The cost is \$4 per half hour and to be paid daily by either cash or check. Starting Tuesday, September 8th, Mercymount will be partnering with AlphaBest https://www.alphabest.org/ for our BeforeCare and AfterCare programs. AlphaBest is a company that provides before and after care services to many schools in the state, including the Cumberland Public Schools. All of the details regarding this program and the pricing will be sent out within the next couple of days. It is important to note that Before and AfterCare will still be on the premises and the times will remain the same. Drop off will be as early as 7:00a.m. and children can be picked up as late as 6:00p.m.

Pre-K

Ms. Gallagher and Miss Carito will be running the Before and AfterCare program for children in Pre-K. There will be no BeforeCare Thursday, September 3rd. There will be AfterCare until 6:00p.m. Starting Tuesday September 8th, BeforeCare will start at 7:45a.m. and AfterCare will go until 6:00pm at the cost of \$4 per half hour. Please pick your child up promptly at 6:00. Parents must inform teachers with a note or a message to the office if their child will be staying for AfterCare. Whomever is picking up your child must be listed on your child's release form. An picture I.D. must be shown at the door before your child is released. Please provide a healthy nut free snack and a drink for your child. If your know that your child will be in AfterCare until 6:00, please pack an additional snack.

Parking Lot

For safety reasons, all drivers should BACK into parking spaces for dismissal. Also, small children in tow are not allowed on the playground at dismissal time nor on the grass near the Kindergarten windows. Please respect all assigned "Reserved" spaces for faculty, Handicapped and Auction. Drive SLOWLY at all times and be aware of children while entering and exiting parking lot and school property. Remember that Roald Dahl Road is a one-way drive; you must enter from Fisher Road and exit past the school. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD YOU EXIT ONTO FISHER ROAD! Anyone found exiting onto Fisher Road will be reported to the Cumberland Police Department. When exiting the building, please use the designated crosswalks. Also, we are working on a few different solutions to increase parking lot safety. Thank you for your cooperation.

Uniforms

Please refer to the School Handbook and/or school web site for uniform requirements. There are some new and "gently used" uniforms for the taking. Blouses, pants, skirts, jumpers, sweatshirts, etc.all free! They are kept in the Copy Room off the Cafeteria.

Lunch Program

Mercymount provides a nutritional lunch for the children every day as well as providing a la carte beverages and snacks. Prices will range from \$1.00 snacks to \$5.00 for the main meal. The attached lunch menu lists what is offered each day. Each meal includes either a milk or orange juice. Other drinks are available for purchase. The kitchen staff will be delivering lunches directly to the classrooms. It is VERY important that if your child is purchasing lunch that they let their teacher know at the start of the day. Hot lunch will not be served September 2nd and 3rd. Children will need to bring a lunch on those days. Please do not send your child in with "fast food" lunches. Hot lunch will be served beginning September 8th.

Payments for lunch are made using a *cashless* lunch payment program through PaySchoolsCentral.com. All students are automatically enrolled in the system and charges will begin on the first day of school. Parents are required to go online and fund your child's account prior to the start of school. Any family not previously enrolled will receive an email by the end of the week with directions to enable your account and enter payment information. Peanut/Tree Nut Allergy

Since one or more individuals in the school have an allergy to peanuts/tree nuts, the sale of peanuts/tree nuts, peanut butter and other nut-based products is prohibited by the cafeteria. All lunches and snacks should be nut-free for all students, as all classrooms are designated as "allergy-free".

Northern Rhode Island Food Pantry

Mercymount will once again team up with the Northern Rhode Island Food Pantry to help feed the hungry. Under the direction of Mrs. Lisa Paré, flyers will be sent out weekly per grade asking for your help to fill the containers. Collections will begin with our faculty and staff and then move to Grade 8 in the beginning of September. Be on the lookout for those flyers and emails! Volunteers

Volunteer Opportunities for 2020-2021

Here are three different ways you can volunteer when school is in session. You can volunteer for 1 shift a week, 1 shift every two weeks or 1 shift every month! There are shifts as short as 20 minutes.

Morning Shift 8:15am-8:35am (20 minutes)

Volunteers will go in through the main entrance (mask required), sign in and wait in the foyer. There will be a school employee directing you to a spot or classroom. A parent volunteer will be needed to assist with morning drop off in the front circle and a parent volunteer will be needed for the parking lot. Also, volunteers will be needed to make copies or cover classrooms if teachers need to complete tasks. You will not have to sign up for the morning shift. If you can assist in the morning, then report to the foyer and you will be given an assignment.

Recess Shift 11:25am-12:50pm (1 hr 25 minutes)

Three volunteers will be needed each day for a recess shift. Volunteers will be assigned to one area of an outside space with 1 classroom pod. Volunteers would stay in the designated spot until the recess shifts were complete. These shifts are essential. Without coverage for these recess shifts, teachers will not have any breaks during the day!

Afternoon Shift 2:40-3:02 (22 minutes)

Two volunteers needed. Volunteers will go in through the main entrance (mask required) and sign in. One volunteer will assist dismissal procedures in the front circle starting with early bird dismissal at 2:45. The other volunteer will assist with dismissal procedures in the parking lot.

***All parents, grandparents or caregivers must go through Safe Schools in order to volunteer. With Safe Schools training being virtual, it is now easier than ever to get it done.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW FOR DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP

There will be someone at each entrance to take each child's temperature. If your child has a temperature of 100 or higher, you will be immediately contacted. There will also be volunteers outside to help direct parents and children to the correct entrance. PLEASE avoid crowding.

Morning

7:00 - 8:15

Before-Care children must wait in cars until the cafeteria sidewalk door opens at 7:00. If a student is being escorted to the door by a parent, the car must be parked in the parking lot in a parking space. All Before Care students go to cafeteria for supervision (or to teachers for pre-arranged help, meetings, etc.)

7:45 – 8:35 PreK students go directly to their classroom's door (via sidewalk). Anyone dropped off before 8:15 will pay the before care fees.

Note: Any student arriving after the 8:35 bell will have to enter the building at the front door and be checked in by the Office.

8:15 - 8:35 DROP AND GO

• Gr. 1 – 8 students entering with <u>no help needed</u>, may enter through the front door (pull into semi-circle). There is <u>NO PARKING</u> in front of the school at this time. If your child has a temperature of 100 or higher, you will be immediately contacted.

PARK AND DROP

- Parents are to park in lot in a parking space to unload and to walk younger students to their assigned door. Kindergarten students will go directly to their classroom door.
 - Grades 1-3 will enter through the side door. (Door between the Cafeteria and the PK/K wing)
 - Grades 4-5 will enter through the Cafeteria door. (Same way that they would enter last year/Before care entrance)
 - Grades 6-8 will enter the through the cafeteria door closest to the playground. (After care door)
- Once in the building, students will go directly to their classrooms.
- Students arriving by car must be in the building by 8:35 a.m.

8:15-8:35 Bus students enter through the front door. Students go directly to their classrooms.

8:35 All doors are locked. All late students enter the FRONT door and will be marked Tardy.

Afternoon Please Note: There will be NO PARKING along the front of the school after 2:00 p.m.

Only students in Gr. 4-8 can be picked up by car at the front door. Drivers for "Early Bird" dismissal park on RIGHT side (sidewalk side) of Roald Dahl Road; the line begins near the north door behind teacher cars. Avoid blocking the semi-circle and bus driveways.

Students in PK and Kindergarten will be picked up at their classroom door.

2:55 Bus students will be dismissed out the front door. Grades 1-3 will be dismissed from the same door that they enter through in the morning. (Between the cafeteria and PK/wing)

- 1. DRIVERS: PLEASE BACK INTO PARKING SPACES FOR SAFETY REASONS.
- 2. PLEASE DO NOT USE HANDICAP SPACE UNLESS REQUIRED.
- 3. RESERVED PARKING SPACES ARE ALSO NOT AVAILABLE FOR GENERAL USE.
- 4. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD YOU EXIT ONTO FISHER RD! ANYONE FOUND EXITING ONTO FISHER ROAD WILL BE REPORTED TO CUMBERLAND POLICE.
