

# Unionville-Chadds Ford School District School Reopening Health and Safety Plan 2020-2021 School Year

The Unionville-Chadds Ford School District has developed the following Health and Safety plan for the reopening of our schools in the 2020-2021 school year. This plan was developed by our administrative team with support and guidance from our school nurses, school physician, members of our teaching staff, other support staff and community members. This includes a task force composed of medical professionals, teachers, students and administrators.

The plan follows the guidelines established by the Chester County Health Department, The Pennsylvania Health Department, the CDC, Pennsylvania Department of Education, and the office of the Governor of the State of Pennsylvania.

Our team began working on this plan in April 2020. At that early date, we realized that planning for the next school year must be a priority. To that end we did several things to help formulate a plan that balances the need for student and staff safety with the need for having our students back in school. We scheduled several meetings with other districts to make sure we had all the information possible before finalizing the plan. We also attended a variety of training and seminars related to opening schools during this

pandemic. We solicited feedback from our medical staff, and we reviewed literature from other countries and states learning about their experiences and guidance from our medical community at large.

The plan outlines the many mitigation measures we will take to allow school in person instruction to occur in our buildings after October 12, while balancing the health and safety needs of our students and staff. No set of mitigation protocols will totally eliminate the risks of infection with COVID-19. Administration is dedicated to continue to monitor and adjust our plan based on new information and changing dynamics.

The Health and Safety Plan will be posted on our district website. Updates and changing guidelines will be noted and communicated through all of the District's communication channels. A school closing due to COVID-19 will only be implemented with close collaboration with the Chester County Health Department.

UCFSD Administration wants to thank our parents, teachers, students and School Board for their partnership and support as we move forward to navigate the changing waters of the 2020-2021 school year. Working together we will make this a successful and productive year for our students helping them move forward to reach their goals and to succeed in life and contribute to society.

### 1. Cleaning, Sanitizing, Disinfecting, and Ventilation

#### Summary

The CDC indicates that cleaning, sanitizing, and disinfecting of high-touch areas might help reduce transmission of COVID19, but recent evidence also suggests that transmission through surfaces is less of a threat, as the virus is spread predominantly from person to person through respiratory droplets. However, that doesn't mean that surface-to-person spread is impossible. Therefore, the Custodial Department in each building will be increasing the daily cleaning with frequent disinfection of high-touch areas per CDC guidelines. Our bus drivers will perform additional cleaning and disinfection of buses during runs and shifts. One of our biggest challenges will be the ability to procure adequate PPE, hand sanitizer, and disinfection supplies. By starting this procurement process now, continuing through the months leading up to the start of school, and with the help of safety and security grant funds, we anticipate being able to meet this need. The month before school resumes all custodial staff and bus drivers will be re-trained in the proper cleaning and disinfecting protocols in preparation for the challenges ahead. Details of the cleaning, sanitizing and disinfecting protocols for the Unionville-Chadds Ford School District are outlined below.

### 2. Social Distancing and Other Safety Protocols

#### Summary

Social distancing and safety protocols will be evident throughout the schools as outlined by the Chester County Health Department. In classrooms, there will be a minimum of six feet of space between students with desks and tables oriented in the same direction, and the removal of unnecessary furnishings to maximize separation in the classroom. Procedures will be enacted to maintain separation in common areas including cafeterias and buses while increasing the use of outdoor spaces and the frequency of hygiene routines such as hand washing and hand sanitizing. In order to limit contact during the school day, visitors will not be allowed or restricted, meetings will be held virtually, and sharing of student materials will be limited. Staff members and students will be required to wear masks at all times except under certain circumstances and activities, e.g. eating. Training will be provided for students and staff to ensure all safety measures will be met with fidelity. Details of the social distancing and safety protocols for the Unionville-Chadds Ford School District are outlined in the table below.

### 4. Other Considerations for Students and Staff

#### Summary

UCFSD procedures for the wearing of masks for staff and students will follow the guidelines outlined by Chester County Health Department. These include requiring all staff to wear masks. We also will require all students to wear masks with some exceptions. All students will be required to wear masks on the bus. Students and staff at higher risk for severe illness will be closely monitored by our school nurses. Parents may choose to have their child participate in the Unionville-Chadds Ford Virtual Academy if they have health concerns regarding their child being back in a brick and mortar program. UCFSD is planning on increasing our district substitutes in case we have substitute shortages this coming year. Our behavioral health team will be partnering with classroom teachers to ensure students social-emotional needs are identified and students are provided the support necessary. Specific details about our plan are noted in the table below.

### Health and Safety Plan Metrics for Determining the Appropriate Instructional Model

The table below outlines clear guidelines for the different instructional models to be used depending on key metrics based on recommendations from the Pennsylvania Department of health and Chester County Health Department <u>Chester County Health</u> <u>Department Coronavirus COVID-19</u>. Our district will monitor the data on a weekly basis using the <u>COVID-19 Early Warning</u> <u>Monitoring System Dashboard</u>. We also will be able to monitor specific township data from Delaware County to determine the level of community transmission and the PCR Percent Positivity for Chadds Ford Township. We will consult with medical experts on this changing data to ensure that we are responding appropriately as the data changes. The following guidance from the PA Department of Health provides information regarding transitioning between instructional models..

Consideration for transitioning between instructional models will be based upon the below thresholds as follows.

- Transitioning to a more in-person instructional model can be considered when thresholds for incidence rates are met for three (3) consecutive weeks, and evidence of a decrease in positivity at the County level. Consideration should be given to incidence rates of neighboring jurisdictions.
- Transitioning to a more virtual instructional model can be considered when thresholds for incidence rates are met for two (2) consecutive weeks. Consideration should be given to incidence rates of neighboring jurisdictions.

It is recommended that schools monitor data and review thresholds at regular intervals to minimize frequent transitions between instructional models. If thresholds are being met at the extreme upper/lower edges of the range, schools are cautioned to consider an additional week of monitoring prior to transition.

When transitioning to a more in-person based instructional model, it is recommended that the transition be a phased transition beginning with younger grades with an assessment of progress throughout the phasing.

Other factors that influence transitioning between instructional models may be considered such as widespread or significant outbreaks either within a school or the community, staffing levels, etc. The Health Department will communicate with schools in situations involving outbreaks.

We will collaborate with the Health Department and medical experts before recommending a change based on changes in the data.

Therefore, the Custodial Department in each building will be increasing the daily cleaning with frequent disinfection of high-touch areas per CDC guidelines. Our bus drivers will perform additional cleaning and disinfection of buses during runs and shifts. One of our biggest challenges will be the ability to procure adequate PPE, hand sanitizer, and disinfection supplies. By starting this procurement process now, continuing through the months leading up to the start of school, and with the help of safety and security grant funds, we anticipate being able to meet this need. The month before school resumes all custodial staff and bus drivers will be re-trained in the proper cleaning and disinfecting protocols in preparation for the challenges ahead.
