- Check each individual college's website!
 - Each school has a Admissions Requirement Checklist (i.e. letters of recommendation vary based on school)
- The SAME for all seniors
- Except support programs w/fee
- Personal Statement
 - Easy way to disclose disability!

College - Levels of Service



• Program - Maximum Support

- Fee for services, separate application, degree seeking, documentation required, trained staff
 - Southern Illinois University (ACHIEVE)
 - University of Arizona (SALT)
 - University of Denver (LEP)
 - University of Wisconsin-Whitewater (Project Assist)
 - University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh (Project Success) non-fee
 - Muskingum College (PLUS)
 - Edgewood College (Cutting Edge) -degree & non-degree option

College - Levels of Service



• Comprehensive Support Services - Medium Support

- May require additional fees, no separate application, student responsible for arranging accommodations
 - Arizona State University
 - Illinois State University
 - Loyola University Chicago
 - Michigan State University
 - University of Missouri

- Carthage College
- Colgate University
- Davidson College
- Emerson College
- Oberlin College

College - Levels of Service



• Student Services/Accommodation - Mandated Support

- Most require no fee, documentation still required, student must self-advocate to access support and accommodations
 - Iowa State University
 - Indiana University
 - University of Illinois
 - University of Kansas
 - University of Kentucky
 - Beloit College
 - Champlain College

- Cornell University
- Drake University
- Lake Forest College

Requesting Accommodations



- Once accepted, student must contact Office of Disability Services
- Explain your request for accommodations.
- Set-up intake interview (virtually or phone)
- . Do they want your paperwork prior to meeting?
- . Usually request most recent evaluation and IEP/504
- Reasonable Accommodations
- . College accommodations may be different from high school. (reasonable not individualized)

Requesting Accommodations



- Who is responsible for identifying and documenting the need?
- STUDENTS are responsible for self-identification

- Who is responsible for initiating service delivery?
- STUDENTS are responsible for notifying the Disability Support Services staff of their disability and of their need for accommodations.

Disclosing Disability



Personal Statement or Essay

 Best way to receive information about services/accommodations

Schools cannot discriminate

Remember:



- No matter what register with disability office!
 - Even if you think you won't need accommodations
 - Better safe than sorry
 - Will provide referrals upon request (tutor, organization)
