

HOW TO APPLY TO COLLEGE, **MEET EVERY** DEADLINE, AND ENJOY SENIOR YEAR





- ► Have a non-SHS email account (appropriate).
- Finalize the list of colleges to which they are applying.
- Diversify the list, and have a "reasonable" number.
- Find an organizational system.
- Continue to visit/learn about colleges (virtually for now).
  - Sign up for their mailing list.
- Enjoy their senior year!





# MAJOR DEADLINE #1:

- All public university apps should be filed by <u>Thursday</u>, <u>October 15th</u>.
- Best consideration for admission and scholarship money.
- ► All *your* parts should be submitted at this point (essay, transcripts, test scores, etc.).
  - Letters can be submitted later.
- ► Extremely crucial at U of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, Indiana U, Purdue U, and U of Michigan.

# MAJOR DEADLINE #2:

- ► Early Decision, Restrictive Early Action (or Single Choice), and Early Action.
- Complete the application by Thursday, <u>October 15th</u>.
- ► Remember that many of ED/REA/EA applications often require teacher/counselor letters of recommendation.

Students should be sure to ask teacher(s)/counselor by mid-September.


# MAJOR DEADLINE #3:

ALL four-year university applications should be filed by Monday, Nov. 30th (directly after Thanksgiving Weekend).

► Aim to finish entire college application process.

If applying to a 2 year college (i.e. College of Lake County), students should file by March 1st.






SENDING TEST SCORES "OFFICIALLY"

Many schools are now allowing self-reported

Log into the account (ACT or College Board)

 Select the test date(s) you are sending and to which schools you are sending

- Have a credit card available
- ▶ Allow, at least, 3 weeks to process
- Test scores are not on your transcript
- Upcoming Test Dates
  - Go to College Board and ACT for more information for a Saturday administration
  - SHS is providing a free ACT and SAT to all senion
     (communication was sent out via email on August 13th)



# Test Optional?

- Can the student take one?
- Does the college allow it?
  - ► Check into specific majors (nursing or engineering in particular).
  - Consider potential scholarship opportunities.
- Does the score fall close to the mid-50% (freshman admission profile) published by the college?
  - Use Naviance Scattergrams/Counselor Notes for guidance.
- Test Optional Schools/Resources on admission: https://fairtest.org/
- Difference between Test Blind / Test Optional
  - NIU is Test Blind (will not consider a test score).



# TO WAIVE OR NOT TO WAIVE... THAT IS THE QUESTION.

- The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a Federal law to protect the privacy of students.
- Students are given an option to waive their right to access their recommendations (asked in Common App, Parchment, and other applications).
- We highly suggest to waive your rights:
  - Shows colleges student is not "afraid" of what is written.
  - Some colleges may disregard letters if not waived.



# **COMMON APPLICATION -**

#### **WWW.COMMONAPP.ORG**

- Almost 900 schools across the world accept Common App.
- ➤ Students should add schools, select the deadlines, and talk to recommenders (teacher(s)/counselor) soon.
- ▶ We are on a 4.0 weighted scale (not 5.0).
- Students can attend a workshop on Common App (via Zoom):
  - ► Friday, Aug. 28<sup>th</sup>, 8th period repeated on
  - ► Thursday, Sept. 3<sup>rd</sup>, 7:45am





## **COMMON APP SCHOOL FORMS #1**

- ▶ Students will "invite" their counselor to be a recommender.
  - ▶ Prior to "inviting" make an appt. with their counselor.
  - ▶ The counselor receives an email to submit forms.
- ➤ Counselors will upload official transcript, school profile, and letter of recommendation (if needed). Students should make an appt. with their counselor to talk about their letter.
- ► No separate transcript request needed (no need for Parchment).


Tip: Student should follow up after any electronic invite to ensure it was received. If you need a letter, fill out a "brag sheet" prior to your appt.

## **COMMON APP SCHOOL FORMS #2**

- ➤ After checking into the school's requirements for letters of recommendations, students should ask teacher(s) directly, prior to "inviting" and "assigning" them to write on their behalf.
- ► Students will "Invite" and then "Assign" teacher(s) as a recommender to particular colleges.
  - ► The teacher receives an email from Common App to submit the letter once you **assign** them.

Tip: Students should complete a "Reflection" Sheet for each teacher they are asking. A discussion should happen prior to sending any electronic invite.

Please do not "over ask" teachers.



## U OF ILLINOIS AT URBANA-CHAMPAIGN

- Allows for self-reported test scores
- ► Early Action: apply by October 15th (SHS internal)
  - Notification date: Mid-February
- Self-report transcript (SHS Transcript in IC)
  - Might take 30-45 minutes, attention to detail very important
- Essay topic(s):
  - "Explain your interest in the major you selected and describe how you have recently explored or developed this interest inside and/or outside the classroom. You may also explain how this major relates to your future career goals." (limit of 300 to 400 words)

#### Tip:

Choose 2 majors on application (required to write 2 interest essays)



## ESSAY / PERSONAL STATEMENTS

#### Top 6 tips:

- Optional isn't really optional...(with a few exceptions).
- Answer the prompt.
- ► Have someone proofread.
- Should be the "student's voice" shining through.
- For length, quality is better than quantity.
- Give time for the process.

# TYPES OF ESSAYS/PERSONAL STATEMENTS


- "Why Us" shows genuine interest in a school, needs to be *very* specific
- "Why this major" be clear on how you have explored it, and reasons for studying
- "Additional information" to share academic journey, personal circumstances (e.g. significant hiccup on transcript, IEP or 504, illness that impacted you academically)
- Analytical questions No right or wrong answer, want to learn more about you.
  - What can actually be divided by zero?
  - ▶ "Do you feel lucky? Well, do ya, punk?" Eleanor Roosevelt. Misattribute a famous quote and explore the implications of doing so.
  - Who is a significant person in your life?
  - "Which Ben & Jerry's ice cream flavor (real or imagined!) best describes you?"

## **Optional COVID Essay**

- Truly Optional.
- Consider keeping any COVID related essay in this section. Show more sides of "student" in the other essays.
- Keep big picture in mind, if nothing really to say, no need to write in this section.
  - Illness or loss within your family or support network
  - Employment or housing disruptions
  - Food insecurity
  - Toll on mental and emotional health
  - New obligations such as part-time work or care for siblings or family members
  - Availability of computer or internet access required to continue your studies
  - Access to a safe and quiet study space


# TRANSCRIPT OPTIONS

- Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR)
- Parchment (www.parchment.com)


\*\*\*MIT and Georgetown talk directly to your counselors.













# **SCHOLARSHIPS**

- Students register with a free database (fastweb.com)
- Check Naviance weekly
- Subscribe to the Daily Digest
- Check into <u>your</u> community (e.g. employers, credit unions, religious organizations, etc.)
- Apply for Stevenson Foundation Scholarships (in January)
- Research your schools to which you are applying
- School-specific scholarships available to SHS applicants:
  - Wells (Indiana U) Jefferson (U of Virginia)

Essay Reads: 15-20 min individual meetings to read 1-2 essays (student only) - Calendly.




### Post Secondary SCoPE

Meetings: For <u>families</u> that didn't complete this meeting in the spring and would like a list of colleges to consider. Parent/Guardian must be in attendance (virtually).


<u>Worksheet</u> must be completed, and sent to <u>mdoczi@d125.org</u>, who will confirm and schedule a meeting with all parties.
