CROSS COUNTRY HEADS TO MICHIGAN CATHOLIC MEET: GIRLS GOLF STARTS YEAR AT HIGHEST HONORS INVITE

CROSS COUNTRY STARTS YEAR AT MI CATHOLIC

The Notre Dame Boys and Girls Cross Country teams competed for the first time this year at the Michigan Catholic Invitational at the St. Francis Retreat Center in one of the first competitions for any sport in the new COVID-19 era. The event, which consisted of 18 Catholic schools throughout the state, had to incorporate several new protocols to comply with local, state, and MHSAA standards for high school athletic events. Cross Country is considered a "low risk" sport by the MHSAA as it can be done outdoors, athletes can be placed in cohorts and staggered to promote social distancing, and there is no equipment sharing. Modifications took place including placing teams into defined camp areas, designating a special area for warm-ups (which were conducted in a clockwise rotation), eliminating spectators on the course and utilizing a staggered start system to social distance at the starting line. Parents could view the race from the safety of their cars in the parking lot where athletes passed multiple times and, of course, all coaches, athletes, officials, and spectators wore masks during the event. The boys finished in fourth place overall and the girls finished in second place, earning a runner-up trophy in the first ever St. Sebastian race, named in honor of St. Sebastian, the patron saint of athletes. In the boys race, newcomer Wade Robinson

overall with a time of 17:21, which is the fourth fastest time for a Freshman boy in school history. Seniors Eli Seitzinger, Nate Vogel, Adam Martin and James Chabot rounded out the Varsity scoring for the Irish. Freshman Nolan Tompkins earned a medal, finishing ninth in the two-mile race for new runners. The girls Varsity race was led by Seniors Lexi Fraser and Maddie Monaghan, who finished third and sixth respectively for Notre Dame, and Freshman Mariana Ricci, who finished fifth in her first high school race. All three runners earned medals in the process. Alli Dawiedczyk and Kate Stacey rounded out the scoring for the Irish. Junior Nicole 215-174 strokes. Top performances Carson, Junior Lauren St. Andre, and Freshman Morgan Bisset all medaled by finishing in the top ten in the two-mile race.


IRISH DROP MATCH TO ST. CATHERINE

CROSS COUNTRY HOSTS FIRST MEETS

The Notre Dame Boys and Girls Cross Country teams hosted their first home meets in over a decade as the Irish took on Stoney Creek in a dual meet held at Riverbends Park in Shelby Township. Dual meets are being encouraged this year by the MHSAA to allow for better social distancing and control in comparison to large invitationals. The boys team fell to Stoney Creek 48-18. Freshman Wade Robinson placed third with time of 16:50 while Seniors Eli Seitzinger and Adam Martin also finished in top 10. The girls dropped a close match to the Cougars 29-26. Senior Lexi Fraser won the race individually and tied a career-best with time of 20:11. Freshman Mariana Ricci and Senior Maddie Monaghan placed fourth and fifth respectively in the narrow defeat.
