2020-2021 SCHOOL DRESS CODE

1st/5th period teachers will monitor dress and grooming, but a student may be referred to the office at any time during the school day to correct the issue.

The following slides will be a guide in determining appropriate/inappropriate student dress code on campus, before, during, and after school.

Rule of thumb: if you question the way you look in any way, do not wear it!

Sachse's Dress Code Policy

☆ 1. Student ID and mask must be worn at all times.

2. Shoes must be worn.

3. Skirts will be of modest length and fit. Final decision will be made by SHS Administration.

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- ☆ 4. Leggings are allowed only if the shirt covers the buttocks. Leggings cannot be sheer and no cut-outs above the knee.
- ☆ 5. Tops may not be low cut and no cleavage can be displayed. Tops must be long enough to cover midriff at all times. ☆
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- ☆ 6. No spaghetti strap tank tops.
7. Shorts of modest length, loose-fitting, and hemmed may be worn by students.
8. No sagging of pants. No underwear/shorts should be visible.



☆ 9. Students may not wear house shoes, pajama tops or bottoms, boxers, or other sleepwear as outerwear. No see-through or lingerie tops/outfits.

☆ 10. No holes/ripped clothing (even with fabric underneath)-this includes jeans!



Skirt must be of modest length and fit. This meets dress code.

Does not meet dress code: no low-cut tops.



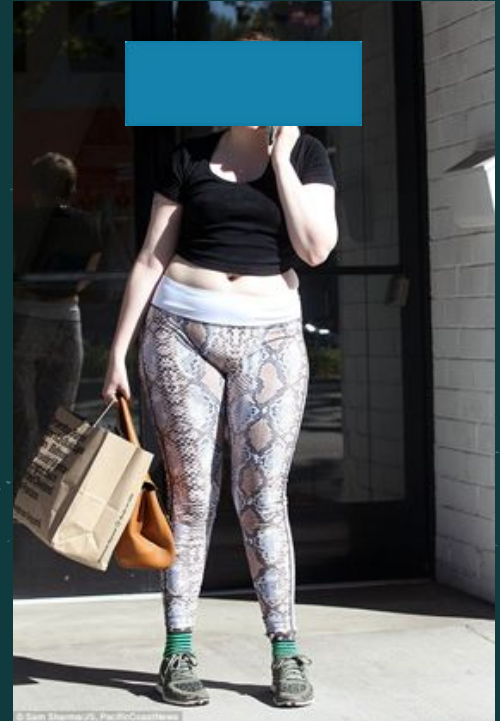
Meets dress code!

2. Death
3. Nudity
4. Sex
5. Drugs
6. Obscene language/graphics
7. Sexual innuendos



8. Inappropriate slogans
9. Satanic themes
10. Tobacco products
11. Gang membership
12. Racism
13. Violence
14. Blood/gore/skulls



Grooming Code

Please Note: Refer to the Trust Card one-pager for extra privileges!

1. Hair, including facial hair should be kept clean, well groomed, and non-distracting.
2. No nose rings, eyebrow or other face piercings.
3. Tattoos that are inappropriate or distracting must be covered during school, school activities, and school-sponsored events.
4. Students will not be allowed to class wearing a hairstyle that is distracting to the learning environment such as:
 - a) Designs shaved into the hairstyle (insignias, initials, circles, lines, numbers)
 - b) Hair rollers/curlers, plastic hair bags, and similar grooming items (including picks) shall not be worn.
 - c) Distracting hair colors; must be natural or natural tones--blended and balanced throughout.
