As we prepare to reopen campus, there are many factors that will determine what a safe return looks like. The following principles will guide us as we make these decisions.

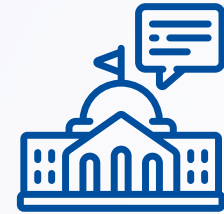
JIS Key Guiding Principles

Reopening Campus

The leadership team at JIS has been meeting on a regular basis to plan for a safe return to campus that allows for flexibility, transparency and prioritizes the health and safety of our community. We are currently preparing our physical campuses so that we have a safe environment for our students to return to. We understand that some families may not be able to be back, due to travel restrictions, and others may not be comfortable with their children returning to campus. In preparation, we have developed two different options for learning next school year.

Following the guidance of leading health professionals and organizations, as well as consulting with other schools in the region, JIS has prepared a safe environment for students to learn at school.

The Indonesian Government has lifted the campus closure mandate.

The Indonesian Government continues campus closure.

Home/Online Learning
Students will resume the year off-campus learning through an enhanced live, synchronous approach that will engage them and prepare them for a smooth transition back to campus.

YES

On Campus Learning
Students will resume the 2020/21 academic school year on campus. Specific health and safety guidelines will be followed.

The Indonesian Government has lifted parts of the campus closure mandate and schools may operate with modified face-to-face programs on campus and/or the Leadership requires the splitting of the student body as a safety imperative.

Blended Learning
Students will be involved in a learning experience, which includes both on-campus and off-campus learning. The campus is open, but the student body is divided into groups of students/grade levels who come on-campus on a reduced modified schedule to learn face-to-face. Students who are not on campus will learn at home through the collaborative home and online learning environment. Leadership or Indonesian government policies may require the splitting of the student body as a safety imperative.

Policies and plans will adapt as government regulations and public health situations change.

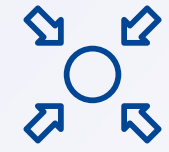
Cleaning



Classrooms are cleaned with SANTIFACT high level disinfectant every day.



All doors, faucets and bathrooms are cleaned throughout the day.



Extra cleaning will be focused on high traffic areas.



Campus will be disinfected with KLENCO, a product that kills viruses and bacteria and is non-toxic and alcohol free, achieving high-level environmental sanitation.

Health & Safety



Wearing masks on campus will be required.



Nurses will be on each campus to monitor, support, and attend to any medical needs, including those associated with COVID-19.



Nurses will wear protective clothing when examining students and these will be changed between visits.



JIS nurses have received special COVID-19 training.



Hand washing will be encouraged throughout the day and extra handwashing stations have been placed at entry points of each campus.



Hand sanitizer is provided at all entry points and in every classroom.



There will be a limited number of visitors allowed on campus and they will require prior registration.

Lunch & Snack Time



All students and staff will wash their hands before and after eating snacks and lunch.



All students will eat lunches in designated spaces throughout the campus or in the classrooms for Elementary School students. Limited number of students are allowed in each place.



Limited food choices will be available on campus. Options will be prepared with the highest of HACCP standards, food will be individually packaged and pre-order is recommended.



Staff will use disinfectant and paper towels to thoroughly clean tables and classrooms.

Social & Emotional Support



Social and Emotional Support is available through our counselors and school psychologist.



Counselors will conduct social and emotional outreach and will be available to support anyone facing feelings of loss, confusion, or stress from the pandemic and isolation.
